The company which had been looking into the possible creation of a wind farm in the Goomburra district. east of Allora. has abandoned further action on the matter.

Wind Prospect Pty Ltd's Development Regional Manager, Michael Sale, told The Clifton Courier this week of the decision.

"We're not going to investigate it any further," he said.

Mr Sale said the decision was a direct result of the strong community reaction at a well attended public meeting in Allora last month.

He said the company did not have any plans for a wind farm development in the vicinity of Allora.

Mr Sale said Wind Prospect had conducted preliminary enquiries with landowners in the Allora area as part of a scoping



phase. The public meeting at the Allora Sports Club on the

14th of March had attracted close to 300 people and the issue was later raised in

State Parliament by Member for Southern Downs James Lister.

Council responds to Allora Pool concerns



Southern Downs Council Regional is to address recent concerns raised by the Allora community regarding the 2024-25 management arrangements for the Allora Pool, following a decision of the Ordinary Council meeting on 13 December 2023.

Southern Downs Mavor Melissa Hamilton said the Allora Pool is considered an important recreational hub for the community and Council will work through the process to balance the mechanics of operating the facility with the community in mind.

"The Allora Pool is an important resource residents and its for management plays а crucial role in maintaining its accessibility and quality,' Mayor Hamilton said.

"Current operator Andrew Fidge is very well respected in the local community and many people in Allora have contacted Council with their concerns about the

arrangements for the 2024-2025 season at the Allora Pool.

"We as Councillors are listening to the community and we have asked Council staff to fully brief us on the proposal as it stands.

"As the briefing paper is being prepared, I hope that it will provide valuable insights to ensure the continued operation and success of this community facility.

"Council wishes to advise the Allora community that Andrew Fidge remains the pool operator up to the winter recess. The new season commences in September 2024, and this gives the new Council ample time to consider whether we should review the decision of the previous Council.

"We will keep the community updated on this matter and will endeavour to ensure that any review is completed in May so as to give certainty to both Andrew Fidge and the Allora community"

Delays To Allora Community Hall Re-Opening

A previous report from Southern Downs Regional Council (SDRC) about Allora's Hall identified how the current wastewater is treated and disposed. The wastewater from the hall is disposed of to a septic tank located in the footpath, with an absorption trench in the road reserve. This is neither legal nor ideal from an ongoing maintenance perspective.

Since that update, Council has worked closely with the contractor and Council's Plumbing section to investigate possible solutions.

While looking to resolve this issue for the hall, further issues have also been identified.

The first issue relates to the Community Hall's occupation limits. When looking at the auditorium's floor area, it has been identified that the existing internal toilets don't meet the needs of the National Construction Code ("NCC") when it comes to the ratio of toilets required to maximise the building's occupation. This leaves Council with one of two (2) options either reduce the building's

capacity or find a solution to increase the toilet numbers to ensure they meet the needs of the building when at capacity.

The second issue that has been identified is the current state of the external toilets on Muir Street. The external toilets on Muir Street that are often used as overflow for the hall currently sit within the road reserve (including the holding tank). This is not ideal. In addition, the current holding tank servicing the Muir Street toilets is too small, meaning the system is being pumped out more regularly, which creates both an inconvenience to users and an increased maintenance cost to Council

As a result, Council is currently investigating a solution to address both issues, with the intent to allow the hall to be used at capacity, whilst ensuring the community is provided with external public toilets that meet our community needs. The solution would also ensure that the septic system installed is designed to cater for these maximum population limits, reducing the number of times it would

need to be pumped out.

The solution currently being investigated is to remove the old Muir Street toilets and relocate them (a new set of modern, compliant toilets) onto the land adjoining the Community Hall (placing them behind the hall). The proposal would allow a system to be installed that is modern, compliant, and accessible, ensuring it meets the community needs and the legislation that currently exists.

The other issue this helps to resolve is the Community Hall's capacity, ensuring that sufficient facilities exist to cater for the needs of our community

when this community hall is reopened and used at capacity.

While the Council appreciates this may mean a delay in the community re-opening, the hall's solution being investigated will ensure that the hall being delivered back to the community can be maximised, whilst also providing the best possible outcome for our community.

The SDRC apologises for this continued inconvenience of the hall and external toilets being closed, however, it's the Councils desire to ensure that this is done once and provides the best possible outcome.

Anzac Day Allora - The Story

The first Anzac Dav services were conducted at Allora in the year 1916 to honour the men who never came home from the First World War. Two services were conducted - one in the morning and another at night. Wreaths were laid at the Allora Cemetery by the Salvation Army.

At that time the inaugural chair of the Anzac Day Committee was W.J.T. Neale.

It was initially thought that 47 men from the Allora district were killed in the First World War however members of the Allora Historical Society discovered that 69 men never came home.

1919 - a parade became part of the Anzac Day service.

1928 - saw the Salvation Army conduct their first service at the Unnamed Monument, Allora Cemetery.

1941 -The Queensland Police Service and the QCWA first laid wreaths and have continued the tradition to this day.

1960 - the first Dawn Service was held and created a moving experience.

This year Veteran Des Donovan will be seen riding in a vintage car near the front of the parade.

Members of the public are welcome to attend Anzac Day Services at Allora on Thursday 25 April.

5.30am for the Dawn Service. 7.00am Gun Fire Breakfast 9.30am the Memorial Service at the Allora Cemetery





Norco resumes international **exports**

Australian dairy products from Southern Queensland and northern New South Wales are on their way to Japan, marking the first international shipment from Norco's Lismore dairy operations since before the Northern Rivers floods in 2022.

Australian authorities approved the shipment of around 20,000 tonnes of dairy products, including tubs of ice-cream, which left Brisbane on March 10

Agricultural Minister Murray Watt said it was a sweet treat for Norco and its farmers after working hard to restore the factory and make it more resilient for future weather events.

"International markets love Australian dairy, and a lot of livelihoods around the Northern Rivers and South East Queensland rely on Norco, so this first shipment after two years is an exciting step forward," Mr Watt said. "Norco have been export-registered with the Aariculture Department since 1983, and DAFF have been working closely with the management team at Norco to get the co-






