# Rate And Water Notices To Be Combined



Southern Downs

Southern Downs
Regional Council is taking
practical steps to simplify
how rate and water
consumption notices are
issued by consolidating
the two notices into one
comprehensive notice,
effective from the 2024/25
financial year.

Council has historically issued the first half year rate notices in late July and water consumption notices separately in September.

The first of these new, combined notices is scheduled to be issued in mid-September 2024, covering the period from 1 July 2024 to 31 December 2024. In addition, Council is encouraging ratepayers

to consider going paperless by opting to receive their notices via email, which is a safer, more secure and an environmentally friendly option.

Mayor Melissa Hamilton said that Council offered a number of different payment methods to accommodate different financial positions.

"Paying your rates by advance instalments can be a convenient way to manage your finances and ensure that you stay on top of all your obligations," Mayor Hamilton said.

"Ratepayers can pay a set amount at regular intervals, such as monthly or quarterly, rather than paying the full amount in one lump sum, and by doing so, spread the cost over the year, making it easier to budget.

"For those who might be struggling to meet your rate payments, please contact Council to negotiate a confidential payment plan."

# Operation Blot: Fraud Offences. Warwick

A 26-year-old Warwick man has been charged with numerous fraud offences after police shut down what they allege is a "cash for demerit points" scheme involving hundreds of falsely nominated tickets.

Wednesday, 21st August 2024

Police will allege the man advertised on social media that he would take fines and demerit points for people in exchange for money.

Once contacted by a "customer", it is alleged the man would nominate himself as being the driver for the offence and after receiving the ticket, he would then allegedly sign the ticket over to an unsuspecting third party who was the victim of identity theft.

He has been charged with one count of carrying on the business of fraud, attempting to pervert the course of justice, and three counts of obtaining identification information.

The man was arrested in Warwick on August 8 has been granted bail to reappear in Warwick Magistrates Court on October 23.

Acting Chief Superintendent Janelle Andrews of the Road Policing Group said the operation, code named Blot, had been run jointly by officers from Road Policing Investigations Unit and detectives from the Cybercrime Unit.

"Inquiries were commenced after one of the alleged victims of crime contacted police regarding \$20,000 worth of fines he had received," Acting Chief Superintendent Andrews said.

"The subsequent investigation uncovered what is alleged to be an illegal business enterprise, operating for at least three years, involving more than 200 camera-detected offence notices worth approximately \$141,000 in fines and 695 demerit points."

Detective Superintendent Craig McGrath, Commander of the Financial and Cyber Crime Group emphasised police take this offending very seriously and advised any person conducting or participating in these schemes will be detected and prosecuted.

"This individual is alleged to have financially profited from an online criminal enterprise unlawfully assisting drivers to circumvent the licence demerit point process. The fact that attempts to cheat the system utilised online platforms does not mean anyone involved will escape identification or punishment." said Detective Superintendent McGrath.

# If It's Flooded - Forget It!



Drivers are reminded of this message and to be aware of upcoming seasonal dangers. Here is evidence of what can occur in flooded creeks.

Shortly after 9pm on Wednesday night 14th August, Police and QFES from both Allora and Warwick Stations were called to attend a potential crash occurring on Kirklands Road, Deuchar.

Upon arrival, it was very quickly determined that a vehicle had indeed driven into the fast-flowing waters of Glengallan Creek that had crossed the floodway; the driver of the small sedan not realising the water was there and across the road until they drove into it.

The vehicle was very quickly

washed off the roadway and ended up against some small trees about 60m further downstream.

Thankfully, the 2 young adults from Dalby were able to extricate themselves from the vehicle prior to Emergency Services arrival, and while taken to Warwick Hospital for examination, were found not to have been injured otherwise.

The vehicle is a write-off and at this stage remains in the creek. It was not insured.

Police and Emergency Service Officers once again ask people to take care and drive to the specific conditions – in this case, a small dirt country road after dark, that was not known to the driver.

Both major telcos have announced that they were postponing the shutdown of their 3G networks to October 28 this year.

The announcement marks the second time the shutdown date has been delayed after originally being set down for June 30 and then the end of August.





# **Rampant Warriors Rack Up 17 Touchdowns**

Elusive centre Christensen spent plenty of time behind the tryline at Platz Oval on Sunday running in an amazing five touchdowns in the 'Stillwater Pastoral Company' Wattles Warriors 96 - 12 victory over a short staffed Goondiwindi Boars outfit.

Second top try scorer in the Toowoomba Rugby League A Grade premiership with 22 four pointers. Christensen wasn't alone in gathering touchdowns as Wattles ran in seventeen tries to the Boars two in the dramatically one-sided result.

Sundays A Grade match was preceded by memorial tributes and a minute silence for former club stalwarts and respected community members Dave Achilles. Noel May and Don Brown

While the near full-strength Warriors started favourites, it was a must win game coming in to the finals, the unexpected overwhelming 'for and against' boost certainly appreciated.

Wattles were without star three-guarter Andv Richardson against the Boars after his call up to the Ipswich Jets Hostplus Cup State League side that defeated the Burleigh Bears 32 - 20 on Saturday

Coach Travis Burns was pleased with his side's attacking game, "we were good across the park".

"It's great to have secured a home semi-final, and exceptional that our club has all three grades contesting in the finals series." Along with Christensen,

hooker Tom Hatch and winger Joe Willett were among many to shine in the dominant result.

Wattles played a split program for the final fixture Round of 2024. their Under 19 side tumbling to the Southern Suburbs Tigers at Toowoomba's Gold Park on Friday evening, before their Reserve & A Grade teams completed Round 18 victories at Platz Oval on Sunday.

If was fleet of feet finisher Joe Willett who rolled the Wattles juggernaut into action against Goondiwindi in the top-grade clash, outmanoeuvring defenders in the corner to score in the eighth

It was the first of a try hat trick for Willett, with similar achievements shared with team mate's Tom Hatch and secondrower Tyson Stevens.

When five-eight Braydon Paix touched down after following a Willet angled kick to the uprights on the half time hooter, Wattles had nine tries to their credit cruising in at the break with a 50 0 advantage.

The Boars made their presence felt just four minutes after the restart when fullback Kyle Hazard nailed his side's first points of the game, but Christensen reignited the Wattles onslaught scoring minutes later for the scoreboard to read 56 - 6 to the home side

It was the first of an eight try second half gallop by Wattles Goondiwindi centre Samukie Gaidan secured a touchdown five minutes from full

Much credit must go to the Goondiwindi club who answered Wattles two match challenge with a bare eighteen players, never at any stage tossing in the towel.

All three Wattles sides are heading to the TRL finals series that commences this coming Saturday on green & gold home turf at Clifton

# **Cunninghams Gap Reconstruction Project**



Work is continuing on the Cunninghams Gap Reconstruction Project to restore the bushfire-damaged section of the Cunningham Highway at Cunninghams Gap.

The crest of the range has been a hive of activity and works are continuing to reduce the steep grade of the road at Cunninghams Gap. This includes reconstructing the central section of pavement at the crest which requires excavation to lower the pavement by 1.5 metres. When completed, heavy vehicles travelling up the range are expected to experience an easier ascent at the final bend of the highway at Cunninghams Gap.

From 6pm on Friday 6 September 2024 until 5am on Tuesday 10 September 2024, all traffic will be under a single lane through Cunninghams Gap on the Cunningham Highway. A reduced speed limit of 40km/hr will be in place for the safety of road users and work crews. Road users are advised to expect delays and plan ahead with updates to the QLDTraffic website or app.

Oversize-vehicle access will be temporarily closed for construction to occur within the narrow road widths at this section of the Cunningham Highway. Oversize vehicles must check the Conditions of Operations Database and seek an alternative route during this time.

Information will continue to be provided to the community in advance via email, SMS and electronic roadside signage. Priority access through the work zone will be given to emergency vehicles, where possible.
