

Compulsory Testing of Backflow Devices

Southern Regional Council reminding property owners with backflow prevention devices to ensure their devices are registered and tested annually by a

licensed plumber to maintain the safety and quality of the region's reticulated drinking water supply.

Wednesday, 22nd January 2025

Under the Plumbing and property water outlets near prevention Penalties apply for unregistered or untested devices

Council's Acting Director Planning and Environmental Services Nicole Collett said backflow prevention devices play a vital role in preventing potentially harmful polluted water from entering the drinking water supply if systems fail.

"Council with property owners to reduce contamination risks, ensuring backflow prevention devices are properly maintained," Ms Collett said.

"To ensure your backflow prevention device operates correctly, it is important to have it



maintained and tested annually by a licensed plumber with backflow prevention accreditation, required by the Plumbing and Drainage Regulation 2019.

"Regular testing prevent potential issues such as backflow incidents, water leakage and pressure reduction on your property which may pose public health risks.

"Owners who are unsure about whether a device can be replaced or removed should consult a licensed backflow prevention plumber.

Licensed plumbers must submit a Queensland Government Form 9 to Council within 10 business days of completing work on a backflow prevention device. This ensures Council can accurately maintain the Backflow Register and send annual reminders to property owners.
