May Slams 84 to Steer Allora to Initial Season Success

The Allora "Foodworks" cricket team struck a purple patch of form on Sunday when they handed "headspace" Warwick Cricket Association competition leaders Inglewood a 175 run defeat at the McIntryre Sports Complex. Hard hitting alrounder Adam May cracked ten boundaries and six sixes in a personal total of 84 to steer Allora to a commanding 306 total after Inglewood won the toss and sent the "Foodworks" Eleven in to bat. May has been in shining touch with the willow of late, hitting an even 100 in his last start against competition frontrunners "Diggers" at Allora.

Talented batsman John Byrne was also in the runs scoring a season best 63, an aggressive innings that started with four consecutive boundaries as Byrne asserted his authority. Allora's openers, Cameron Masters and Brady Glass piled on 33 runs before losing Skipper Masters for 25, but Glass, in his first match of the season, went on to hit a cracking half century 58. Jason Nightingale also appeared in his first game of the season, belting a six as his first scoring shot before going on to score 20, while Travis McMicking (18) and Sean Coker (16) were also among the runs.

There is no doubting the ability within the Allora line up, but until Sunday's performance the team's form had been very patchy with losses in their opening three fixture matches against Maryvale/Condamine, Wheatvale and Diggers, their only competition points coming from a second round forfeit by Colts.

Team Captain Cameron Masters is excited that his charges hit the straps on Sunday, with an all important clash with Maryvale/Condamine looming at Allora this weekend.

While their run total was possibly the club's best since the Allora Cricket Club reformed to commence the 2006/07 season, the bowling figures on Sunday were also very encouraging, dismissing Inglewood for 131, with Adam May again leading the way with 4 for 54 off ten overs. Brady Glass (8 -3-2-24), ever dependable Ross Hentschel (3-0-2-29) & Travis McMicking (2.1-0-2-18) all chipped in with two wickets apiece in what was an outstanding effort by the Allora side.

The Allora "Foodworks" side take on Maryvale/ Condamine this Sunday on home turf at the Allora Cricket Oval, with play commencing at 9.30 am.



Only 101 of the 10,000 Ergon Energy customers whose supply was interrupted by storms, high winds and equipment damage on the Darling Downs and South Burnett Tuesday evening (17/11/09) remained without supply at 10pm.

Three of those customers are in Doy Street in Warwick, where 3900 customers originally had their supply interrupted as the network protection system operated as high winds clashed lines together.

The customers remaining without supply have blown fuses on their services.

Looking Back...

Allora's Past 75 years ago November 1934 **Stray Dogs and Cats**

Reference to the stray dog and cat nuisance provided the only humorous interlude of the day at the regular meeting of the Allora Council this week. The ranger (Mr. Dick Wright) gravely accounted for the large number of useless dogs in town as being the result of owners bringing them in from the country and letting them fend for themselves. He also mentioned that stray cats were on the increase, as only recently he saw a man who had half a dozen in a bag and was taking them to dump somewhere in the main street. No finality was reached by the Council over the matter, and the meeting guickly passed to more important business.

Allora's Past 100 years ago November 1909 **Closed Season for Emus**

The Allora Guardian has received from the Department of Agriculture and Stock, a copy of a proclamation limiting the protection to emus in the district of Darling Downs under the Native Birds Protection Act, to a closed season from the 1st to the 7th July in each year. The protection formerly extended to emus in the Darling Downs district was from the 1st July to the 30th September each year.

The Department concludes with the hope that we will kindly draw attention to the alteration in our columns. As we always endeavour to assist the various Government departments in every way possible, we express the hope that our readers will cease slaughtering the emus which abound in this district, during the period mentioned.

The Dalrymple Hotel

The Dalrymple Hotel was Allora's first licensed hotel. The licence was issued to Donald Clark in November 1860. The Moreton Bay Courier reported that the hotel was situated at Allora, better known as Dalrymple Creek, and was the only house of accommodation between Drayton and Warwick. Donald Clark landed in Melbourne from Scotland in 1854. In June 1860 he selected four blocks of ground to the north of the newly surveyed town, totalling 124 acres. He had a two roomed cottage built on the land, this cottage probably being the first sawn timber dwelling in the district. Clark's house was situated where Norco Bowdler's shed stand today and was later lived in by Charles Burge and family. Allora's first land sale took place on the 5th March 1860 and the 1 acre allotment on the corner of Drayton and Raff Streets was the first sold. The buyer was Warwick storekeeper Simon Meyer. In the Moreton Bay Courier of 3rd November 1860, Donald Clark advertised for sale or let, the Dalrymple Hotel, a building with 3 large rooms with bar and landlord's apartments, 6 bedrooms, and detached kitchen and stables, situated on the Drayton and Raff Street's corner.

John Holmes took up the licence of the Dalrymple Hotel in July 1862, transferring it to Martin Roggenkamp in February 1864. Roggenkamp was declared insolvent in December 1868. No further licence was issued for the hotel.

In 1879 the former hotel building was occupied by the Australian Joint Stock Bank until their new premises was completed in Herbert Street in 1880. J. H. C. Meyer operated his Bee Hive store and bakery on the Drayton and Raff Street's corner until August 1881. The building then fell into disuse and was later demolished. The late Mr. Jack Kerr could remember the floor of the building still in place during his school days in the early 1900's.

Killarney pool drained again due to water supply chemical overdose

The Southern Downs Regional Council has announced that due to a chemical overdose in the Killarney water treatment process, the Killarney swimming pool is again being drained. The move comes just days after the swimming pool was drained due to vandalism.

Manager Water and Sewerage Gary Palmer said that while Council is acting cautiously, he does not expect any problems as a result of the overdose of Alchlor, which is an aluminiumbased coagulant solution that is used for the clarification of both potable water and waste water.

"The chemical Alchlor does not affect health as it is a food grade additive that helps with the removal of silts in the water treatment process," Mr Palmer said.

"We are suggesting however that parents of the children from Killarney School, who did use the swimming pool today, keep an eye on their children just in case they experience any skin or eve irritation as a result of using the pool.

Council staff have been forced to remove all chemicals from the pool water prior to releasing it into the river.

As the first swimming pool refill took 450,000 litres of the overdosed treated water, Mr Palmer said that very little would have been used for domestic purposes. Mr Palmer acknowledged that it was disappointing that so much treated water would again be used, but said that the community's wellbeing was paramount to Council.

Memorial Plaque -

A plaque recording that Queensland's first V.C. winner Pte J. Leak was a soldier settler on Portions 179, 182, and 184 'The Commonage" Berat, via Allora was unveiled at the Cenotaph

Allora on Remembrance Day by Mr. Eric Taylor President Allora Sub- Branch R.S.L. Pte Leak, who won the V.C. at Pozieres France on 23rd July 1916 farmed and worked in the district 1919-1920. The citation referring to his V.C. records that Pte Leak's party captured an enemy strong point; Private Leak ran forward under heavy fire threw bombs into the post and then jumped into the post and killed three of the bombers. Later, when the enemy in overwhelming numbers was driving his group back, Pte Leak was the last to withdraw at each stage and kept on throwing bombs. He had previously served at Gallipolli. He was wounded three times and gassed twice.

He arrived back in Australia on 'The Ascamus" in Melbourne on 26/3/1919 on his way to Brisbane where was discharged on31/5/1919. The first mention that he was in the Allora district was an advertisement in the 'Allora Guardian" on 24/5/1919 which stated that McNaughton, Ford and Leak were authorized to sell firewood from

the commonage and that supplies were available. The ads continued on a regular basis but the names varied with sometimes two of the three appearing and next week a different combination of the three. There is some overlap of dates re Pte Leak's discharge and appearing as a 'Woodman" but maybe the bookwork took time to catch up. There is no record as to the reason he came to Allora, given he had enlisted at Rockhampton from Clermont so it is reasonable to presume he had become mates with some residents during the war. In due course he became the owner of three leases following their surrender by other lesees. The country is not regarded as farming country and in later years a Land's Department official described it as fit only for "Burr, stones and Kangaroos". His residence in the area has been forgotten and he is not remembered which is not surprising this was 90 years ago. The plague which results through the concern and generosity of The Western District Council R.S.L. and the Allora Sub Branch recognizes his presence and is a direct result of a casual remark made by Mr. Ron Siebenhauesn who owned portion of the property many years later enquiring from the Hon.Tom McVeigh if he knew about Pte Leak farming in the area as he had a faint memory of his father in law Mr. Ernie Balderson who was also a soldier settler in the area that a paddock was known as "Leak's" who was a V.C. winner. Much research was undertaken by both at the War Memorial and War Graves Commission in Canberra; Mitchell Library in Sydney; State Archives and John Oxley Library in Brisbane and personal discussions with Mrs. Thelma Daw a 94 year old veteran from Esperance who remembers delivering a telegram to him whilst he lived in Esperance with his wife. He married for the second time in Kalgoorlie in 1927 and he and his wife had three children living there and records reveal that they had



four more children. Mr. Andre head of the Esperance Museum advised that when the Leak family left Esperance Pte Leak left some photos and letters with his father but they appear to have been lost. Mrs. Daw said he was a very guiet man, did not mix much, and certainly did not take part in R.S.L. activities. Nothwithstanding many enquiries neither Ron nor Tom have been able to contact relatives or details of who has upkeep and possession of the V.C. They are continuing their efforts and when their enquiries are completed they intend to write a booklet about him with particular emphasis on his residence in the Allora District. They with the assistance of well known District Resident Harry Gwynne are of the opinion they know where the sawmill was situated and intend in the near future to inspect the area where the maps show the house was situated and ascertain if there are any remnants or landmarks which would indicate the exact position. They have been assisted by Mr. Cecil Hoey who spent a significant period of his life nearby and has indicated the position where it was. It appears, from the records .to have been removed in the 1930's possibly to the nearby "Aloes" the owners of which became the owners of portion 182 in the mid twenties.

Pte Leak if he were alive today would be described as a real character and certainly would have been a more than interesting person to have a chat with. He died in 1972 and he and his wife are buried at Stirling in South Australia and his name is installed in the Wall of Remembrance in Adelaide. It is to be regretted that it has taken 90 years to have his name as Queensland's First V.C. winner publicly acknowledged at the Allora Cenotaph and this would not have happened without the leadership of the members of the Allora Branch R.S.L. who have given so much guidance and support in this significant piece of History.




