- · Council's Office: Cash, cheque, money order or credit card at any Council office (Allora office does not accept over-thecounter cash payments above \$150, but will happily accept cheque or card payments in the office for amounts in excess of \$150).
- · Warwick Credit Union: Take your rate notice intact to any WCU branch for payment.
- Australia Post: In person at any post office (incl. Dalveen and Leyburn), phone 13 18 16 or go to www.postbillpay.com.
- Bpay: Contact your participating financial institution to make payment from your Cheque, Savings or Credit Card Account. Please use the Bpay Biller Code and Reference number shown on the notice.
- Internet: Visit www.southerndowns.qld.gov.au and follow the links. Please quote the Billing number found on the front of your rate notice. Minimum payment \$20.00.
- Mail: Tear of the deposit slip and mail with payment to Southern Downs Regional Council, PO Box 26, Warwick Q 4370.
- Credit Card: Detach the bottom portion of rates notice, complete details and forward with your payment, or phone any Council office to make a payment.

If experiencing difficulty in making your rate payments, you may apply for approval to pay rates by instalments. If you have a current, up to date rates arrangement then interest will not be charged on the overdue balance. A new rates arrangement needs to be entered into each year.

Rates can be paid in advance in smaller amounts throughout the year using a variety of methods. If fully paid by the due date the discount is allowed. Hi-Tech Stock Transport

Keep your eye open for a new hi-tech stock transporter on our local roads from now on. On Saturday the new rig turned a wheel for the first time outside Allora Butchery for our photo shoot.

Allora livestock agent Mr Noel Veal commissioned Hendon engineer John Schelback to build the fully removable and customisable stock crate. The crate, which is 22 feet long and is fitted with internal dividers and side loading, as well as rear loading doors, is mounted on a Hino chassis, which also incorporates a Hiab crane.

The Hiab allows the driver/operator to remove the crate in one go, thereby converting the truck into a flat bed unit suitable for general carrying duties such as bales and grain, and makes it easy and quick to load and unload the cargo.

Keeping things local, the signage was also made in Allora by Janylle Henry, and finished by McCosker Signs of Warwick.

The new enterprise, which will cover Toowoomba, Warwick, Stanthorpe and our local surrounding areas, is now up and running and has already been contracted for stock haulage duties by Stocktonvale Pastoral, Allora Butchery and the Hendon Valley and West Talgai Feedlots.

Rates in less than two weeks

To receive a 10 per cent discount, Southern Downs' ratepayers will need to pay their rates by next Monday, 27 September.

Director of Corporate Services, Andrew Ireland said that with less than two weeks before discount cut-off,

Council had collected just 34 per cent of rates with \$23 million still outstanding.

"Rates must be paid in full by the close of business on Monday, 27 September to receive the 10 per cent discount," Mr Ireland said.

"Discount will not be allowed on payments made after 5pm on that day."

Mr Ireland urged any ratepayer who has not received a 2010/11 rates notice to contactCouncil's Customer Service staff.

Stanthorpe and Warwick offices will be open from 8am to 5pm and the Allora office from 1pm to 5pm to assist those making payments in person. A variety of other payment methods are also available.

Former Warwick Shire residents can also pay in person at the Dalveen and Leyburn Post Offices or any Warwick Credit Union branch, with former Stanthorpe Shire residents also able to pay at any post office.

Payments can be made by post via cheque or money order, by direct debit or Bpay, or online at www.southerndowns.qld.gov. au. However, the Allora office does not accept over-the-counter cash payments above \$150, but will happily accept







Blue Care receives national acclaim for safe driving

A Queensland organisation best known for its 'blue nurses' has won national praise for encouraging driver safety among its staff, winning an Australasian Fleet Managers Association (AfMA) award in Melbourne on Friday night.

There were three categories in the 2010 Fleet Awards and Blue Care, a leading not-for-profit community health and residential aged care provider, won the esteemed Fleet Safety Award.

Blue Care's fleet of 1452 vehicles travel more than 32 million kilometres each year to provide vital care for the frail aged and people living with a disability.

Blue Care Executive Director Stephen Muggleton said it was an honour for Blue Care to accept the award and he paid tribute to the organisation's 10,000 staff and volunteers.

"In 2008 we introduced a series of driver safety and environmental educational initiatives aimed at supporting safe driving and reducing our organisation's carbon footprint," he

"This award is a reflection of our staff and volunteers'

commitment to embracing those initiatives and the hard work by our Fleet Services Unit and industry partners to deliver it."

Blue Care's research projects and driver education programs were delivered in partnership with:

The Royal Automobile Club of Queensland (RACQ); Centre for Accident Research and Road Safety (CARRSQ) at The Queensland University of Technology and;

Webfleet Fleet Management Services.

Blue Care Fleet Services Manager Mark Stephens said more than 3000 staff and volunteers attended the driver education programs throughout the state, and all 260 centres utilised the drive-safe resources produced with the theme, 'Drive safe, people are depending on you'.

"The education and research programs have resulted in a 16 per cent reduction of carbon emissions. 35 per cent reduction in the number of third party accidents and 25 percent reduction in traffic infringements in the past 18 months," Mr Stephens

"Our staff travel in varying and congested road conditions across cities and in rural and remote locations; and while they are focussed on the care of others, this education has reminded them of the importance of their own wellbeing as well."

Research and new technology trials introduced at Blue Care since 2008 to further enhance vehicle safety include satellite tracking and reversing sensors and cameras.

Dave's Delectable Dísh...

Roast lamb with lemon and honey



Preparation time: 5 minutes

Cooking time: 90 minutes

INGREDIENTS

1½ kg easy carve lamb leg 2 tbsp olive oil

1 tbsp lemon juice

2 cloves garlic, peeled and sliced 2 tbsp warm honey

roasted tomatoes, roasted potatoes and steamed green beans to serve

Serves: 6

Preheat the oven to 180°C. Mix olive oil, lemon juice, garlic and honey. Season the lamb with salt and pepper. Place lamb in a large oven bag. Pour lemon and honey mixture over lamb.

Tightly tie the end and cut 3 slashes in the top of the bag. Place lamb into a roasting dish, roast for 1 hour for rare, 1 hour and 15 minutes for medium, or 1½ hours for well done.

Remove lamb from oven and rest for 15 minutes before carving. Carefully remove lamb from oven bag, place lamb on a serving plate and pour over any juices.

Serve with roasted tomatoes, roasted potatoes and beans.

TIPS

- Suggested roasting times per 500g for lamb: lamb loin (boned and rolled), leg or shoulder (bone-in), easy carve leg or shoulder
- Cook at 180°C. Rare 20-25 min, Medium 25-30 min, Well done 30-35 min.
- Judging your roast's degree of doneness using a meat thermometer. The internal temperature for: Rare – 55-60°C, Medium rare – 60-65°C, Medium – 65-70°C, Medium well – 70-75°C, Well done – 75°C.
- You can also use tongs to test the roast's doneness. Gently prod or squeeze the roast - rare is very soft, medium rare is soft, medium is springy but soft, medium well is firm and well done is very firm.
- Roasts need to rest for about 10 to 20 minutes before carving. This gives the juices in the meat a chance to redistribute, giving a moister and more tender result.


