


It was a popular choice, as seperately and together they do an extraordinary amount of voluntary work in thte district.

The Grants to Community Organisations - General Grants Program focuses on supporting local initiatives, local organisations, and events that enhance community wellbeing and opportunity.

Mayor Ron Bellingham offered high praise for the many groups within the region which provide services and activities that benefit the regional community.

"Through this grants program, Council is able to acknowledge the tremendous value of strong community groups, community initiatives and events to the social and economic well-being of our region," Cr Bellingham said.

Program offers assistance under the following categories:

Monetary Donation – Sponsorship up to \$150.00

Monetary Donation - Capital Project up to \$500.00 Fee Relief - Statutory Fees up to \$1000.00

Fee Relief - Disposal fees for garbage produced at an event conducted by a Community Group up to \$500.00

Monetary donation (sponsorship) could be used to assist with costs of hiring council facilities like the Stanthorpe Civic Centre or the Warwick Town Hall, or printing and advertising, or other costs associated with running an event.

The purchase of equipment for a community group or work on a clubhouse, such as painting, could qualify for a monetary donation (capital project).

Applicants are advised that fee relief (statutory fees) does not cover Council's general fees and charges. This category of funding relates to certain fees for approvals applied for under statute such as building application fees. There are also some statutory fees that are excluded such as annual food licence

Application forms are available from Council offices and libraries, or by telephoning Council's Customer Service Centres in Warwick (4661 0300) or Stanthorpe (4681 5500). The application form, along with information about the General Grants Program, is also available on Council's website at www. southerndowns.gld.gov.au. Go to 'Your Council' and click on 'Grants and Funding'.

Applications must be received by close of business on Friday, November 12 2010, and may be lodged in person at Council offices, or posted to the Chief Executive Officer, Southern Downs Regional Council, PO Box 26. Warwick.



The lady eyed the weight and said, "that is fine. I'll take both of them."





Tattoo artists require Council licensing

On the back of several complaints about unlicensed tattooists in the Southern Downs, Council is urging community members to be fully aware of the potential dangers of tattooing procedures. Director Planning and Environment, Ken Harris, warned of the potential for serious infection to occur during tattooing.

Looking Back...

Sport in Allora

"Do you Ping-Pong?" asked the advertisement in the Allora Guardian of 6th July 1912 for the opening night of the Allora Ping Pong Club. The club had a membership of 40 which had increased to 66 when the first tournament was held later that month. At least table tennis created more interest than quoits in Allora; an advertisement in September 1912 for the formation of a Quoits Club brought no further response.

The Allora Rifle Range Reserve was gazetted in November 1888 with the purchase of 20 acres of land from Mr. J. Stewart for military purposes. The Allora Rifle Club was formed in November 1890 but by 1892 had folded and the Rifle Range Reserve was advertised for sale. By the late 1890's the Allora Rifle Club had revived to such an extent that over 20 members competed in 1899 for the Gallagher Cup presented by Miss N. Gallagher. Dr. Francis Pain was Club Captain.

The Allora Rifle Range was formally opened on the 11th November 1901 by the Mayoress, Mrs. J. C. Kennedy, who fired the first shot at 200 yards, the markers declaring a bull's eye. The Allora Rifle Club was to conduct regular monthly shoots for the next 70 years.

Allora produced some champion marksmen over the years including Tom Maher who was selected in the Commonwealth rifle team in 1911. Mr. Maher was still competing and winning prizes over twenty years later. Mr. W. A. Moulday won the King's Prize at the Queensland Rifle Association competition in Brisbane in 1912. This was virtually the Queensland Championship with nearly 300 competitors.

By 1923 the Allora rifle range had been rebuilt, Mr. T. Maher being the contractor. At the official opening of the new telephone system at the range in 1925, Club Captain Mr. W. A. Moulday, congratulated new member, Mr. Percy Gartner, on his approaching marriage to Miss Eustance, not knowing that that union would produce Allora's next winner of the Queensland Rifle Association's Queens Shoot as it was then called.

At a meeting held at Spring Creek on the 13th April 1918 it was proposed that a soccer club be formed between Allora and Clifton and that it be called the Cunningham British Football Association. The meetings were to be held at Spring Creek. By May that year the Allora British Association Football Club had been formed and their first match against Spring Creek, resulted in a 4 goals to 2 victory for Spring

The Allora Soccer Football Club was formed at a meeting at the Royal Hotel in April 1925. It was decided to affiliate with the Toowoomba competition. Allora played in the familiar green and gold colours. A soccer football association was formed in Warwick in July 1925 and Allora played matches against Warwick. Tannymorel and Tenterfield. Representative matches were played against Toowoomba by a combined Warwick and Allora team.

The Allora Soccer Club was reformed at a meeting held in the Aladdin Cafe in April 1929 but soccer did not feature in the Allora Guardian after that year.

"Anyone considering using these services must understand the precautions that tattooists are required to take to prevent bacterial, fungal and viral infections like HIV, Hepatitis B and Hepatitis C," Mr Harris said.

"A professional tattooist is required to have a Personal Appearance Service Licence with the Southern Downs Regional Council and a certificate to certify that they have completed a competency standard endorsed by a National Training Authority in HLTIN2A - Maintain Infection Control Standards in Office Practice Settings."

Mr Harris stressed that all employees providing higher risk services also need to ensure they achieve this competency

"As a tattooist's client, you should always ask for proof of these qualifications before getting a tattoo and if they don't have a licence with council, don't get the tattoo as you risk disease and mistreatment," Mr Harris said.


Anyone finding themselves in this situation should notify council of the operator's details so council can investigate the matter further. If council proves a breach of the legislation for an unlicensed tattooist, the operator is liable for on the spot fines and further council action. Likewise, operators in the Southern Downs region without a Personal Appearance Services licence should contact Council's environmental health officers and apply for a licence.

When conducting inspections of licensed operators, environmental health officers ensure that the operator complies with a range of requirements including the use of sterile equipment and surroundings, changing needle assemblies and hand-pieces after each client use, and personal hygiene standards.

Post treatment care from a professional tattooist should also include the provision of after-care information.

"To avoid infection, a client should receive written information on cleaning the tattoo site and preventing infection, together with advice on healing times," Mr Harris said.



La Nina means big snakebite season for Queensland

Vets say they are expecting lots of snakebite cases in Queensland this summer due to an extremely wet spring brought on by La Nina.

"We're warning pet owners to be vigilant as the wet spring means a good breeding season for snakes with lots of food around," says Dr Jodie Wilson, President of the Queensland Division of the Australian Veterinary Association.

Queensland has experienced one of the wettest springs since records began in 1906 due to the rain-bearing La Nina, which typically causes cyclones, floods and heavy rains.


"Vets have already had lots of cases of snakebite throughout Queensland and we expect more in the coming weeks due to snakes being flushed out by the torrential rain," said Dr Wilson. "Dog owners should try to avoid snake prone areas, particularly if they are walking their dog off the leash at the end of the day. "It's important for pet owners to be aware of the signs of snakebite as you may not actually see your dog being bitten.

"Signs to watch out for include seizures, vomiting, bleeding around the bite, weakness in the limbs and inability to move. Soon after this the animal will often collapse with severely laboured breathing," said Dr Wilson.

Although snake bite can be deadly, treatment with the appropriate anti-venom can be very effective if done quickly. "If you spot any of these symptoms in your pet, quickly call the nearest veterinarian so that they can be prepared for your arrival at the veterinary hospital with the right treatment," said

Italian Beef Casserole

INGREDIENTS

1 kg chuck or boneless shin/gravy

- 1 large onion, diced
- 2 cloves garlic, crushed
- 1 red capsicum, chopped 1 green capsicum, chopped
- 2 tbsp plain flour
- 2 cups beef stock
- 2 tbsp tomato paste
- 1 tbsp dried oregano 400 g can diced tomatoes
- 400 g can cannellini beans drained



Preheat the oven to 180°C. Cut the beef into 2.5cm-3cm cubes. Season with salt and pepper, add about 2 tablespoons of oil and mix well. Heat a large frypan over a medium-high heat. Brown the beef in 2 or 3 batches. Remove each batch and place in a casserole dish. Reduce heat in pan and add a little oil. Add the onion, garlic and capsicums, cook for 1-2 minutes and stir occasionally. Sprinkle in the flour and stir until the vegetables are coated. Gradually pour in the stock, stirring well. Add the tomato paste and oregano. Pour over the beef in the casserole dish and stir to combine. Cover the casserole dish, place in the oven and cook until the beef is very tender. In the last 30 minutes of cooking time, add the tomatoes and cannellini

TIPS

• Cooktop method: Place the browned beef and other ingredients in a heavy-based pot. Partially cover, keep the heat low. Simmer until the meat is very tender. Stir occasionally, adding water if needed during the cooking time to keep ingredients just covered. In the last 30 minutes of cooking time, add the tomatoes and cannellini beans.

Tune into warnings this storm season

With the storm season looming Queenslanders are being urged to tune into warnings to help protect their property and loved ones.

South West Regional Director Bob Bundy said Queensland typically experiences extreme weather events throughout the summer months and it was important residents knew what to

"Emergency services use a range of methods to warn the community about severe weather and other emergencies that require preparation and action at a household level, so it's vitally important residents know what to do in terms of tuning into warnings," Mr Bundy said.

"Being complacent could risk lives. Warnings are urgent and require residents to act immediately on the information provided.

"What ever the emergency is we encourage everyone to remember four simple steps 1. Tune in 2. Log on 3. Listen out and 4. Act.'

"Step 1.Tune in means tuning your battery powered radio to your local radio station to listen for weather and warning updates"

"Step 2. Log on refers to logging onto official weather advice and disaster and emergency management websites such as the Bureau of Meteorology, Queensland Disaster Management Services or your local council website.

"Step 3. Listen out refers to listening out for the Standard Emergency Warning signal (SEWS), Emergency Alert voice messages to your landline or text messages to your mobile phone, local community safety announcements on radio and television, for sirens and loud-hailer announcements, for emergency services personnel door-knocking.

"Step 4. Act refers to immediately acting on the advice provided, this includes ensuring all householders are aware of the warning and advice provided and also involves checking on neighbours and friends who may need special assistance. This step also includes activating your household emergency plan, locating and collecting your emergency kits and activating emergency arrangements if requires.

Mr Bundy said it was vital all Queenslanders took the time out to get to know the above steps.






