

#### Business urged to reduce, reuse and recycle

With only three months until the new Queensland Industry Waste Levy kicks in on 1 December 2011, Southern Downs businesses are being urged to take steps now to reduce the amount of waste they are sending to landfill.

"This is a state initiative aimed at reducing the amount of waste going to landfill, and it's coming up in just three months time," said Council's Director Planning and Environment, Ken Harris. "It will soon cost businesses more to take their waste to landfill, and the only way to reduce that cost is to generate less waste,"

"Businesses should look at reducing, re-using or recycling as much waste as possible to keep their waste costs down."

The new State Government levy will be \$35 per tonne for all commercial and industrial (C&I), and all construction and demolition (C&D) solid and liquid waste going to landfill

This will be charged on top of the normal gate fees at Southern Downs Regional Council waste facilities. Council has been asked to collect the levy on behalf of the State, with all monies from the levy paid to the Queensland Government.

"We're suggesting to business owners that now is the time they should consider what other processes they can put in place to help increase the amount of recycling they are doing and reduce the amount of their waste going to landfill," Mr Harris

#### Queensland Infrastructure Plan

Southern Downs Community members are also encouraged to make submissions to the State Government's Queensland Infrastructure Plan (QIP) by 9 September 2011.

As it currently stands, there are no major infrastructure project priorities planned for the Southern Downs Region.

Cr Vic Pennisi said this was unacceptable.

"I am concerned that there is no focus in the QIP on much needed water infrastructure projects like Emu Swamp Dam or a Warwick ByPass in this region," Cr Pennisi said.

"I think it's very important that we at least identify future road or rail corridors so that local governments can appropriately adjust their town planning schemes to allow for that long term vision to occur." Cr Pennisi said.

"I encourage people to have a look at the QIP and make a submission if they feel passionate about it - it's absolutely necessary that every region has some input.'

The QIP will replace and build on the previous South East Queensland Infrastructure Plan and Program (SEQIPP) and the Far North Queensland Infrastructure Plan (FNQIP) to provide a plan which covers the whole of Queensland.

#### Draft policy to impact producers, not iust miners: Mayor

The Draft State Planning Policy for the Bligh Government's Strategic Cropping Land Policy is now open for consultation and Southern Downs Mayor Ron Bellingham said the community should take a good hard look.

"We applaud the intent of this new policy to protect our best agricultural land from heavy industry like mining," Cr Bellingham said

"However, when you look at the fine print, it has major implications for what producers themselves can do with their land and for Council's planning schemes." he said.

"It effectively removes local decision making for anything other than basic farming activities.

"We're asking the community to take an interest in this because we think it will effectively ban a whole range of activities which are quite common in this area today."

The proposed policy applies to farming land only, not towns and urban areas, and restricts new buildings and developments. except in exempt categories.

"It appears to allow some things that are appropriate on strategic cropping land, such as animal keeping, intensive horticulture and cropping, but our concern is that it bans everything else," the Mayor explained.

For example, you could build a winery, which is exempt, but if you wanted to have a restaurant or craft outlet associated with that winery it would not be allowed. You also can't add a few cabins to an existing farm to supplement income, for instance. While animal keeping is allowed, this essentially only applies where no new buildings need to be built. So feedlots and free range pig or chook farms would be OK; poultry sheds and piggeries would not.

The policy could also have major impacts in the Granite Belt, with new sheds associated with a rural industry allowed, but only if they are less than 750m2 in floor space, the Mayor said. "That's a very small shed in the orchard or horticulture industry," Cr Bellingham said. "A number of producers have packing

sheds over 4,000 square metres in size. "Council's perspective is that quite a large range of these other activities could be appropriate and even desirable, subject to proper environmental and impact assessment, under Council's

#### Artists put finishing touches on designs for new Stanthorpe piece

Two international and one Queensland artists are this week putting the finishing touches on their concept designs for a major new public art piece to be located in Stanthorpe.

The Climatic Art Piece, which aims to highlight Stanthorpe's status as Queensland's Capital of Cool, is to be located near the Visitor Information Centre.

Expression of interest were called at the end of June and the panel met on July 21st to commission three artists to develop designs according to a brief.

The brief was created using community input and feedback.

The three concept designs from these artists will be presented to a Selection Panel next Tuesday 13 September 2011.

The Panel, made up of people from the art, agriculture, tourism, wine and commerce communities as well as Council representatives, will ensure the designs meet the brief.

The designs will then be presented to the community to vote on a preferred piece.

Residents will have two weeks to cast their vote, which can be done online or via hard copy available from Council offices and a range of other locations.

The selection panel preference and community vote will then be presented to Council at the end of September for a final

"However under the Draft State Planning Policy in its current form, it won't matter, because Council won't be allowed to approve their use.

"It appears that it essentially takes away a lot of local decision making capability.

"I believe the Queensland Government needs to revisit the wording of this draft to allow for development of small scale environmentally appropriate activities that compliment cropping and are relatively widespread in this area today."

Council is reviewing the implications of the draft policy on the proposed Southern Downs Planning Scheme.






