Congratulations to Allora Show Society's entrant, Elizabeth Tate who was voted Runner Up in the Rural Ambassador Competition for the Darling Downs show region last Tuesday night in Toowoomba. Elizabeth shared the stage with the winner, Sophie Curtis, Millmerran Show Society's entrant. Elizabeth is the daughter of Ian and Simone Tate of Goomburra. The 3 judges commented that any one of the 6 entrants were worthy of the award. They are all exceptional young adults. This competition is open to males and females, married or single, aged between 20 and 30 years as at 1st May 2011. The aim of the "MARSH Rural Ambassador Award" is to highlight the importance of young people in rural and regional Queensland, in particular those associated with the Agricultural Show movement. The award identifies those people actively involved in their local Show, who have a sound knowledge of current rural issues affecting their local areas, Queensland and Australia and have a strong affiliation with agriculture. The award seeks young people who symbolise

the rural spirit - people with vitality who are forward thinking and with a passion for the land and local agricultural shows. The competition is run on four levels, The local Show winner progresses to a Sub-Chamber final where the winner competes in the State Final held during the Royal Queensland Show (EKKA). The winner of the State Final then competes at the National Final held at a State Royal Show. This is a national competition, but with New Zealand joining us in 2008 it has expanded to international status. Elizabeth is now employed as the physiotherapist for Qld Health based at the Biloela Hospital.

Allora flood data up for community review

Allora residents are invited to a Community Open Session on Saturday 17 September 2011 to review new data from the December 2010 and January 2011 floods that has now been incorporated into the Condamine Rivers & Tributaries Flood Study.

The Flood Study is being prepared for Council to help accurately map the flood plains around Allora and other areas for future development decisions.

Mayor Ron Bellingham said the town of Allora and the surrounding agricultural areas were significantly affected by the recent flood events.

"At the time of these floods, the Condamine River and Tributaries Flood Study was already underway," Cr Bellingham said.

"These events provided an ideal opportunity to test the computer flood model performance in replicating the flood behaviour.

"Analysing the data from the two flood incidents is intriguing, as the water behaved differently in each event, and this has been most useful in informing the flood study."

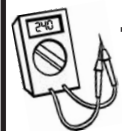
Discussions with local landholders provided the study team with a sound understanding of the complex flood behaviour associated with Dalrymple Creek and the break-out flow to the south of Allora.

The flood model's replication of the recent flood events can be viewed at the Allora Community Hall on Saturday, 17th September from 11:00am to 2:00pm.

"The session is an opportunity for residents to view the flood maps and computer animations in an informal atmosphere with members of the flood study team," Cr Bellingham said.

"As well, residents can provide their suggestions on measures to minimise the impacts of flooding on the town and the surrounding area."
