Fishing day serves up carp feast

European Carp was the catch of the day at the recent Carp Fishing Day in Warwick.

More than 300 people turned out for the fishing competition as part of the Love my River celebrations held by Condamine Alliance and the Condamine Headwaters Landcare Group.

The day's efforts netted 60 pest fish including European Carp and Goldfish. The heaviest fish weighed in at 3.2 kilograms and prizes were awarded to everyone who caught a pest fish.

The day was supported by the Warwick District Recreational Fish Stocking Association, Fisheries Queensland and the Boating and Fisheries Patrol.

Carp and Goldfish are just two of the many pest fish species found in Australian waterways.

Pest fish are predators and compete with native fish for food

and space. They also spread disease and damage delicate habitat.

The Condamine Alliance River Rescue Program works to protect native fish species by raising awareness amongst the

community and finding practical ways to eliminate pest fish from the waterways.

Native fish populations have steadily declined in the Murray Darling system since European settlement. Researchers estimate their numbers have decreased by more than 90%

Condamine Alliance River Rescue Manager Kevin Graham said the first carp fishing day was a great success.

"This is the first time we have held a fishing day in Warwick and we are very pleased with the enthusiastic response from the community," Mr Graham said.



Looking Back...

Allora's Past 25 years ago September 1986 School Reunion

On the 27th September 1986, 31 former pupils of the "Class of 66" met at the Allora State School for a 20 year reunion. Most had enrolled on the 28th January 1964 as the first Year 8 class of the Allora Secondary Department. On that day 39 pupils, 21 of them old hands, 9 ex-St. Pat's and 9 wide-eyed innocents from various one-teacher schools including Victoria Hill, Talgai West, Deuchar, Headington Hill and Pilton, met in the old Rural School domestic science room, in those days in a double story building with the woodwork/metalwork rooms underneath. They were welcomed by their new teacher, the versatile Mr. Graham Dorman. Graham taught English, French, Maths, Science and Geography. The only subject apart from Domestic Science and Woodwork/Metalwork that he didn't teach was History which was taught by the Head Teacher, Mr. Stan Dittman.

The 1986 reunion was also attended by Graham Dorman and five other teachers who were added to the staff after the first year. The day began with a roll call and inspection of the school premises much enlarged since 1964. The former pupils and

teachers then adjourned to the Allora Bowls Club for drinks and savouries, followed by a smorgasbord dinner and a night of reminiscing.

Of the 44 or so pupils enrolled in the class from 1964 to 1966 only Terry Doyle that I know of, has passed on. Perhaps the class and teachers will gather again in 2016 for a 50 year reunion.

Tuesday night saw a further addition to the roll of students at Delaney's Allora college and night school. Mr. Delaney announces that he is opening on Tuesday afternoons from 3 to 5 p.m., a shorthand class for young boys and girls. The fee is only 7/6 per term, and there will be two lessons weekly, one personal and one by post. He is also opening a class for engine drivers and boiler attendants by joining which, candidates can qualify for certificates of competency under the Act.


There are hardy roses,
