Reppel's Opens Doors Officially

Last Saturday afternoon Allora's Reppel's B & B was officially opened by State Member of Southern Downs Mr. Lawrence Springborg MP in surrounds akin to an English garden. Over seventy guests, family members & friends, that also included Southern Downs Regional Councillor Mrs. Mally McMurtrie, travelled from around the Downs and Gold Coast to be part of the official launch of a four year exercise by owners Danny Henricks and Christina Newcomb, that saw the 120 year old building at 21 Drayton Street Allora, restored to historical significance.

The quaint old building, surrounded by finely manicured gardens punctuated by a multitude of different coloured roses, lavender and lovingly trimmed buxus hedges, boasts a long history. That history intrigued Danny & Christina, and wherever possible they have drawn from it to influence their restoration, preserving the history as much as possible enhancing what is now Reppel's B & B.

Initial owner and Allora pioneer Henry Reppel arrived in the Allora area from Germany in 1862, a shepherd on Goomburra Station. He moved to Allora town in 1884 and opened a bakery, before establishing the Temperance Boarding House with his wife Maria that is now Reppel's B & B. He provided accommodation for shearers and apprentice blacksmiths in the

area. In 1903 the bakery was taken over by his son Harry Reppel, and the boarding house was carried on by daughter

Among the official guests at the opening function was Harry Reppel's grandson Bernie Reppel.

The official opening, under the direction of Master of Ceremonies Ted Cowley, took place on the veranda of a small building at the rear of the B & B, itself honed to look a natural attachment of the main building restoration. That building, the stage for the opening, which normally caters for storage now, was in fact a solicitor's office in Allora's early days.

Christina Newcomb, addressed all attending as part of the ceremony, thanking the many who had assisted over the course of the restoration exercise. Danny's mother Mrs. Lil Henricks headed a lengthy list of those thanked, having played a significant role in the decision to buy the former home of long time Allora locals Noel & Marg Parsons. That decision made over a coldie at the Maryvale Hotel, saw the birth of an adventure that has finally resulted in Allora's own delightful English flavoured accommodation venue, oozing local historical significance and charm.

Danny and Christina are very grateful for the interest

and support they have enjoyed from the Allora community. which included donations of the odd collectable such as photos, paintings, old plates & cutlery, old bottles & jugs, furniture and many other items; to add to the building's early Allora atmosphere. They especially acknowledge the assistance of locals Jeanette Lollback, Louis King, Troy Zocchi & Christina's father Bruce Newcomb, along with her children Sean & Olivia Coker. Beetle & Sue Wakeford and the staff at Allora's True Value Hardware were also recognised for their support and service over the past four years.

The Reppel family were singled out for special thanks, making numerous donations to the surrounds in what was a restoration of their ancestor's building. Those donations included a walking stick that sits in the B & B hallway, formally owned by family member Mary Paton who operated the Boarding House in the late 1800's.

Noel & Marg Parsons, who had previously lived at the Reppel's B & B address for over 30 years were also thanked, Christina acknowledging them both for "selling their beautiful house, we know how much you loved living here, and I can assure you we love it just as much".

Christina described the difficulties of the challenging four year restoration, the massive scale of the project, especially in the attention to detail, the burn out factor, and the pressures on her and Danny as they forged on with their goals. There were "exciting times, uncovering old newspapers, coins and bottles among other things" but there was also "really tough days, and tearful days".

While they took their initial guests back in early June, travellers from Brisbane & Ipswich in Allora for the Community auction. Reppel's B & B is now firmly stamped on the Darling Downs accommodation map, with Laurence Springborg's declaration on Saturday afternoon that the building was officially opened.


Register4 celebrates 1ST birthday with launch of breast cancer research project: Local residents sign up to participate

This Pink Ribbon Day. Register4 is celebrating its first birthday with the launch of its first research project, the Baseline Health & Lifestyle Questionnaire.

Register4 is an initiative of the National Breast Cancer Foundation. CEO Carole Renouf says, "We now have a critical mass of over 25 000 members on Register4 and are in a position to offer the first breast cancer research project'.

The first project on offer is the Baseline Health & Lifestyle Questionnaire. Developed by some of Australia's leading Epidemiologists, the Questionnaire will allow researchers to investigate potential links between breast cancer and factors such as diet, lifestyle and genetics.

The Questionnaire takes about 20-30 minutes to complete and includes information on topics such as medical history, breast cancer and screening, exercise and general health and

Information from the Questionnaire will provide important baseline information for designing research studies where Register4 members will be participants. It will also allow researchers to be more responsive to new breast cancer issues as they arise.

'All Register4 members will be invited by email to complete the survey, but as with any research project on Register4, it is their choice to participate', Ms Renouf says.

Register4 aims to find a cure for breast cancer, by matching researchers and people willing to participate in their studies. Researchers often struggle to find such people, and this slows down our search for answers to breast cancer. People aged 18 years and over are urged to join at www.register4.org.au

State Honours for Allora's **Brodie**

Fifteen year old Allora based sporting star Brodie Sharman has added yet another honour to his lengthy list of achievements after recently gaining selection the in Queensland Indigenous Under 16 rugby league squad to play New South Wales in February. The match will be played prior to the annual National Rugby League All Stars match at Skilled Park, home turf of NRL team the Gold Coast Titans.

Brodie said he was

"incredibly proud" to have made the squad after competing in the 2011 and inaugural Murri Carnival at Firth Park on the Gold Coast. The successful carnival saw almost 60 teams from across the state take part in the competition that featured three divisions - Open Men, Women's and Under 15s.

Brodie was a member of the Toowoomba Warriors side at the Carnival, playing alongside his 14 year old brother Josh.

The 2012 Queensland Under 16 side with Brodie as a member will be coached by former Brisbane Broncos & Penrith Panthers NRL back rower Sid Domic. Domic debuted for the Broncos in 1993 as an 18 year old, before going on to play 92 NRL matches. He also played 136 British Super League matches turning out for Warrington, Wakefield, London Broncos & Hull

A rugby league devotee since first running on in Wattles Junior Rugby League Club's Under 11 side six years ago, the lock forward with abundant natural talent has clocked up an impressive list of achievements in the "greatest game of all".

He made his debut for the local District League representative side, the Warwick & District "Chargers" as an Under 12 player, and has been a regular in that side since. He represented in the QRL South West "Mustangs" at the QRL State Junior Championships in 2009 & 2010, and over the past season has been a member of the Toowoomba "Clydesdales" contesting the state wide Cyril Connell Cup.

Brodie is also firmly established as a more than capable competitor on the athletics field. The Year 10 Allora State School student plying his talents over the past week at the Queensland Secondary Schools Athletics Championships at Brisbane's QE II complex.

He competed in the 100 metre sprint, the relay, long jump, discus and shot put against the best from across the State. A record holder at Warwick All Schools and Border Region Carnivals, he has experienced success at State level previously, appearing at the National School Championships on two occasions, in Sydney and Hobart.

Australian and North Queensland "Cowboys" star rugby league halfback Johnathan Thurston is Brodie's hero, Thurston himself spending some of his youth on the Darling Downs and wearing the QRL South West "Mustangs" representative colours as Brodie has, on his way to fame.

2012 is shaping up as a year of challenges for Brodie Sharman, and while he will wear the "Maroon" of Queensland in February, he is also aiming to add a South West "Mustangs" jersey to his wardrobe and compete in the Queensland Under 16 Junior Rugby League Championships at Kawana in July. Not short on goals is Brodie, listing a berth in the Darling Downs Secondary Schools Open Age side also among his targets.



Allora's Past 25 years ago October 1986

Ladies Bowls Club Jubilee

The Allora Ladies Bowls Club Golden Jubilee was celebrated on October the 29th, 1986. The President, Mrs. Jean Lancaster, outlined the history of the club:-

The Allora Bowls Club was officially opened on the 8th December, 1934. A public meeting was called for the 21st October, 1936, for the formation of a Ladies Bowls Club. The foundation president was Mrs. A. Shale, Mrs. Mary Peachey was the first secretary and Mrs. Jean Davies the first treasurer. Mrs. W. A. Deacon accepted the position of foundation patroness with a donation of 1 guinea. The first playing day was on the 28th October, 1936 and the men offered their bowls for practice. The ladies had to be dressed in white or cream and wore a ribbon rosette of the same colours as the men's club.

Mrs. Mary Peachy, the foundation secretary, was invited to roll the first bowl at the Golden Jubilee celebrations but was unable to attend because of a recent fall. Mrs. Mary Smith, president of the S. D. L. B. A., opened the day and congratulated the Allora Club on 50 years of bowling.

Allora's Past 100 years ago October 1911

New Catholic Parish

St. Patrick's Parish came into being when it was separated from the Warwick Parish in October 1911. The official hand over took place at Tattersall's Hotel, on the corner of Drayton and Forde Streets, then owned by the O'Callaghan family. The late Mr. D. A. (Gus) Connolly of Warwick was a ten year old altar boy when he accompanied the Rev. Father Michael Potter to Allora for the hand over ceremony which he described as follows: "Father Potter travelled from Warwick to Allora by horse and sulky. The dinner was set up in the dining room of the hotel and the guests sat down at the long dining room table. After the meal was partaken the Rev. Father Potter rose to his feet and made an appropriate speech officially handing over the Allora Parish to Father Corrigan, Father Corrigan suitably replied and accepted the responsibility of his new charge".

The horse pulling the sulky was named Kitty and while the dinner was taking place, would have received the best of attention from the hotel groom to prepare her for the return trip to Warwick which started shortly after the handing over was completed.



Flood sand to go from Quart Pot Creek

A specialised long reach excavator arrived from Brisbane Tuesday night to start work on de-silting Quart Pot Creek in Stanthorpe on Wednesday.

Around 900 cubic metres of sand that washed down in the 2011 floods will be removed in the exercise, said Council Engineering Services Director Peter See.

Works are funded through the Stanthorpe River Improvement Trust (SRIT) and required a special permit from the Department of Environment and Resource Management (DERM) to conduct excavation in the Creek.

"The River Improvement Trust is happy the work is now going ahead, and we thank the Council very much for having the right equipment here as soon as possible after the DERM permit was issued," said Adrian Finlay, Chair of SRIT.

Mr See explained that the works were necessary as the sand has made the Creek shallower in places, which promotes algae growth and stops plants from thriving.

"There has also been concern from residents that it may make a future flood worse in the area, so it will be removed as flood mitigation." Mr See said.

"This is a specialised job requiring a type of digger that has been in high demand all over the state since the floods.

It is expected to take one week to remove the sand between Locke Street and Folkstone Street. Sand will be stockpiled on the creek bank inside temporary silt fencing and then carted to CF White Oval the following week for fill.

All works are subject to favourable weather conditions.

Fireflies lighting up Main Range National Park

Forget glow worms - fireflies (or lightning bugs) are currently lighting up Main Range National Park, about 40k east of Allora and 110 kilometres west of Brisbane.

Warwick Visitor Information Centre Supervisor, Charee Aspinall is urging everyone to be

"This only happens once a year for about three weeks, during mating season and it is truly amazing," Ms Aspinall said.

"In the early evening, flashing lights can be seen cruising around in the forest and quite often, they will land on and light up anyone walking by."

It is believed that the flashing light is used by males and females to attract each other. The light is created by an enzyme (luciferase) which reacts with other chemicals in the insect's body to produce light energy. The firefly regulates the emission of light by controlling the amount of air supplied to the cells. The regularity and intensity of the flashing may help fireflies identify males and

Main Range National Park, features impressive mountain peaks, escarpments and ridges that offer breathtaking views. A popular bushwalking destination, this Gondwana Rainforests of Australia World Heritage Area is home to rare and endangered wildlife.

Ms Aspinall suggests that a picnic BBQ for dinner at the National Park would be the perfect way to enjoy the firefly experience.

"A short drive to the Fassifern Valley Lookout afterwards, where you can see the lights of Brisbane, would be a sensational end to the evening," she said.

Allora three year old Alexander Kotsopoulas who was enthralled sitting in the driver's seat of Graeme McMillan & Ted Woodrow's 1929 McCormick/Deering tractor, to long time local identity, 82 year old Keith Masters, who not only found the displays of the day interesting, many brought back vivid memories from his life time in the district.

The Rotary Club of Allora were kept on their toes churning out the burgers to keep the crowd's hunger pangs at bay, and the billy's and camp ovens were clattering as the "Treacle Trio" of Trevor Shields and Wayne & Linda Frizzell raced to meet the demands of the very popular billy tea and damper stall.

For all who made their way to Allora and paid their entry fee at the doorway of the century old former Allora Town Hall, now the Historical Society headquarters, there was an almost endless line of local history to absorb, and stalls, attractions and food to be enjoyed.

From veteran tractors, trucks & other vehicles, farm machinery to restored buggies and carts, corn threshers, and a few farm animals, it was all there. Kookie Tickle's now famous "milking cow" was in full swing among a collection of working machinery, while children navigated around the displays courtesy of "Outback Billy Cart Rides". However, the Society's "primary focus is on the old Council Chambers that requires a lot of repair work to restore it to its former glory". Part of the hardworking Historical Society's vision also is that "the precinct would become a place of learning and discovery for school students as well as the public".

There is little doubt that the Allora Historical Society are making excellent progress preserving our past, their current museum and precinct along with their vision for the groups future will see the history of the Allora district preserved for future generations.
