



Smith also said that a soil committee was essential for proper soil management.

Allora's Past 75 years ago February 1937 **Farmer Invents Post Borer**

A machine capable or boring a mile of fence fencing a day, consisting of 352 posts and 2112 individual holes, has been invented by Mr. C. W. Free, a farmer of Headington Hill. The machine is built into a 1908 model English car and takes its power from the clutch shaft. It has proved highly successful and has the obvious advantages of speed and less physical exertion over the hand operated brace and bit method that Mr. Free has replaced.

The boring bit is connected by a long, flexible shaft to the power source and the bit turns at 1000 rpm.

Allora's Past 100 years ago February 1912 **Death of an Old Alloraite**

"Old Timer" writes:- "I see by a recent paper that an old Allora identity has passed away in the person of Andrew Riddle. Though not a public man, Riddle was a man well known for 50 years on the Downs, in the old days as a teamster on the roads before the railways, later for years with the late Samuel Gordon, working some of the earliest threshers in the district, and various farming and other work. He was a good stamp of a fast vanishing band of old pioneers who gave their best to their employers, whist demanding a man's recognition of their manhood, and whose only great fault was the occasional "break-out'. I am sure that a lot of old hands will join in my sincere wish of peace to his ashes".

(It is interesting to note from the diary of John Spry Roberts, that in 1867 Samuel Gordon's threshing team consisted of twelve men; Andrew Riddle was the driver, there were five machine men, two shakers, one straw man and three fanners. They were paid 3/4d per day)



Warwick's Guy Street trees a threat to public safety: New generation of trees to be planted

Seven mature trees in Guy Street, Warwick, have been declared a hazard to the public and must unfortunately now be removed.

Mayor Ron Bellingham said he was sad that the London Plane Trees (Platanus species) must go, but public safety had to

"These trees have been in place for many years and have provided this location with a beautiful streetscape and magnificent colour. I am as disappointed as anyone that some of them must go," the Mayor said.

"However, it is important that Council checks the health of older trees in the region to ensure they are in good health and not a danger to the public." Cr Bellingham said.

"Unfortunately, a recent health check by an independent tree expert found that seven trees between Grafton and Fitzroy Street were in such ill health that they were in danger of falling, or dropping large limbs. The arborist found they are beyond any treatment and need to be removed.

"Five other trees will stay for now and require on-going

Check your water meter

After a number of ratepaver requests for water rates relief due to excessive consumption from water leaks. Council is urging residents to check their water meter regularly.

Acting CEO Andrew Ireland said that residents should regularly check their water meter to detect any leaks and should also check that there are no leaks around water infrastructure on their properties such as tap connections.

"Now is the time to make sure your water consumption is on track, your meter is reading correctly and you don't have any leaks around the meter itself or elsewhere on your property." Mr Ireland said.

"By checking the numeric display regularly, you will be able to determine whether excessive amounts of water are being used.

"It is also recommended that residents perform an overnight leakage test to check for any leakage at pipes and taps."

If you read your water meter last thing at night and then first thing in the morning you can calculate how much water is being lost through leakage.

For this to be accurate, you must not use any water during the night.

Subtract the previous night's reading from the morning reading. This gives the volume of water 'lost' overnight.

If you lose more than one litre per hour, you should check for dripping taps, faulty toilet cisterns or other forms of leakage. Any more than 10 litres lost per hour is very significant and should definitely be investigated.

Instructions on how to read a water metre and performing an overnight leakage test are available on Council's website and in the pamphlet enclosed with your water rates notices, which are due to be issued in April, or you can contact Council on 07 4661 0300 or 07 4681 5500.

have already had reports of near misses with branches falling - Council was left with no other alternative but to schedule removal of those trees in the worst health as public safety must take precedence.'

Michael Bell, Manager Parks and Projects, said it was Council's intention to replace the trees, and that three potential species had been short-listed as replacement trees.

"As identified through our Vision 2040, our aspiration is to provide our community with a clean and green environment for everyone to enjoy," Mr Bell said.

"Very shortly we will be surveying the public to tell us which of these approved Warwick street species they would prefer to see as replacement trees in Guy Street."

To limit disruption to the public, the seven trees will be removed on a weekend in May 2012. Anyone with questions can contact 07 4681 5543.
