


Allora Saddles Up for Growing Cattle Drive

It may not be quite as arduous as the legendary Patsy Durack's epic 3,000 mile cattle drive that left Queensland for the Kimberleys in Western Australia in 1885 on a two year trek with 8,000 cattle, but the Allora Cattle Drive is progressing in almost epic proportions throughout the Allora district.

The subject of the Allora Cattle Drive is now well known and discussed throughout the Allora area, the latest in a line of fundraisers that are paving the way for a modern Medical Centre to be built at 45 Herbert Street Allora on land that was very kindly virtually gifted to the Allora Medical Support Group Inc by former owners Southern Cross Care.

While Allora locals Bruce & Cathie Wilson can take the accolades for the notion of a fundraising cattle drive, their only concern is that the money raising venture that has enveloped the "Best Little Town on the Downs" and it's surrounds plays a significant role in the financing and ongoing maintenance of a new Medical facility. To say Bruce & Cathie's son Garry is a "cattle man on a mission" is an understatement, Garry dedicating endless time and energy of late driving the Cattle Drive and leading a willing and enthusiastic band of community members trying to maximize the Drive's financial gain.

Garry has taken his efforts this week to another level as he promotes the Cattle Drive, which currently has attracted almost \$10,000 in cash donations and twelve donated cattle to be auctioned by stock & station agent Mick Nowlan at the Warwick Sale Yards on Tuesday March 13th. The Wilson livestock truck, a 1984 blue International "S" Line cruised into Allora's main street on Saturday afternoon with the sides of its livestock crate emblazoned with signage that is now spreading the message of the Allora Cattle Drive for all to see. And to emphasize the importance of the fundraiser supporting new medical facilities, the Cattle Drive Auction catch cry in hefty red print says it all, "Donating a Cow Today Could Save Your Bacon Tomorrow".

Allora Medical Support Group Chairman Jon Constable is not only amazed at commitment of the Wilson family and supporters who are doing such a tremendous job with the Cattle drive Auction, but the community as a whole, with many giving sterling support in any way they can, and many giving generously to what they consider to be an essential cause for Allora and its future.



Dave's Delectable Dish...

Barbecued lamb leg with corn salsa

INGREDIENTS

1½ kg leg of lamb, boned and butterflied

1 tbsp sumac

2 tbsp olive oil

1 red capsicum, finely

1 cup corn kernels

1 clove garlic, finely chopped

1 tbsp ground cumin

½ cup coriander leaves

1/3 cup small mint leaves

Preparation time: 6 minutes Cooking time: 40 minutes

METHOD

- 1. Preheat the barbecue flat-plate or char-grill plate to hot. Lightly score the inside of the butterflied lamb leg in a criss-cross fashion. Rub the sumac over the lamb, then brush or spray lightly with oil and season with salt and
- 2. Place the lamb on the barbecue, reduce heat to moderately-hot. Cook the first side of the lamb for 20 minutes, turn with tongs and cook for a further 20 minutes. Cover lamb loosely with foil and rest it for 10 minutes before serving.
- 3. While the lamb rests add the oil to a frypan and heat over a moderately-high heat. Add the capsicum, corn, garlic and cumin. Cook for 2-3 minutes, stirring occasionally. Remove from heat and stir in the coriander and mint. Serve the sliced lamb with the corn salsa.

- Ask your butcher to bone and butterfly the leg of lamb for you.
- Sumac is the dried fruit of a shrub, native to the Mediterranean. It is sold coarsely or finely ground. Sumac has a lemony, citrus flavour with very little smell. You could use grated lemon rind to replace it.

Leslie Dam pipeline repaired -

On Monday, 20th February a break occurred in the main water main between Leslie Dam and Warwick. Southern Downs Regional Council moved quickly to repair the break in the water main on the same day. Water restrictions were imposed for Warwick and Yangan during the time of the repair. No outdoor watering of any type was permitted and indoor water usage was to be minimised as much as possible.

The emergency water restrictions imposed earlier in the day were lifted around mid afternoon. Residents may now use water as per normal water usage guidelines. Normal water usage guidelines can be found on www. southerndowns.qld.gov.au. Temporary repairs have been made to the 600mm water main.

Director of Engineering Peter See said: "This has been a tremendous effort by our water maintenance and treatment staff. I'd like to thank all the staff who

worked so quickly and professionally."

"I'd also like to thank all residents for their cooperation in conserving water during this outage, there was a considerable reduction in usage on what has been a very hot day," Mr See

Council will schedule a planned maintenance in future to make permanent repairs once additional parts are available.

"Council is in the process of assessing all the current water and sewerage infrastructure in Warwick, some of which dates back to the 1940s, as part of its overall asset management and capital works replacement program."





Allora's Past 100 years ago February 1912

Allora Show

The people of Allora and district will have every reason to look back with satisfaction on the 28th Allora Show which eventuated on Wednesday last, as it was an extremely creditable one under the circumstances. For weeks past, the croakers prophesised disaster. The austerity of the season we have just passed through, the scarcity of prospective fruit and vegetable exhibits, the clash with Killarney and other matters ever emphasised in support of these pessimistic predictions.

Happily they proved to be false prophets and Wednesday's show may be set down as one of the most successful in the annals of the Association. Although there was a complete absence of agricultural and dairy machinery displays, and reduced fruit and vegetable entries, this was more than made up by sideshows, merry-go-rounds and other attractions.

Prestige was added to the event by the attendance of His Excellency the Governor, Sir William McGregor, accompanied by Lady McGregor. The president of the C. D. H. & A. Association, Mr. F. H. Kates, invited His Excellency to

formally open the Show.

The prize for Champion Milling wheat went to H. Stewart who defeated the local champion Mr. H. Masters. Mr. Masters, however, secured the prize in the Soft Wheat Section from Mr. L. Cowley.

There were record entries in the Horse Section. E. J. Anderson's "Royal Charlie" was champion stud draught stallion; R. W. Gordon's "Crystal", champion active working stallion and F. H. Kates' "Slade Park" champion blood stallion.

E. J. Anderson exhibited the champion blood mare while W. Huston entered the champion draught mare.

There were reduced entries in the Pantry Section but exhibits were of an exceptional standard. Sir William McGregor personally complemented Mrs. Erhardt and Miss Madge Kennedy on the excellence of the comestibles.

Pride of Allora: Matt Denny is 2012 Junior Sports Star

Allora's Matt Denny won the Daily News/Warwick Credit Union Junior Sports Star of the Year award at Monday evening's awards presentation at Warwick's Condamine Sports Club.

Along with his award, the Toowoomba Grammar School student won a \$500 cheque from the Warwick Credit Union after breaking two national records in 2011 and winning four gold medals in Australian championships.

He set new records in the under-16 hammer throw at the Australian Junior Championships in Sydney and finished the year in December with another record in hammer throw at the Australian All Schools Athletics Championships.

At the end of 2011, he held two national records in hammer, six state records and 14 school/club/regional and local records.

Matt Denny is currently ranked first in his age group in Australia in 4kg hammer, 1kg discus and 4kg shot.

His 2012 Daily News/Warwick Credit Union Junior Sports Star of the Year award is not his first, having also won the award in 2009.

Matt is not the first winner of the prestigious award to hail from Allora, with current Queensland Firebirds and Australian Diamonds netballer Laura Geitz and Queensland Reds rugby union forward Greg Holmes past winners.

Like Matt, Greg Holmes was an outstanding field events athlete before starring in rugby union while a boarder at Downlands College in Toowoomba.

Limited pedestrian access and changed speed limit on McCahons Bridge, Warwick

Pedestrian access across McCahons Bridge on Victoria Street in Warwick has been partially closed until further notice following damage caused by a heavy vehicle.

A 40km per hour speed limit has been imposed on road users of the bridge.

"Half the footpath is unavailable until further notice." said director of engineering Peter See.

"This means you can still walk over the bridge, but cyclists, motorised scooters and strollers cannot use this footpath at the moment."

Victoria Street. Warwick, is a state controlled road.

"Our understanding is that Main Roads engineers will assess the damage and a plan for repair will be formulated, but it is likely to remain partially closed for at least a couple of weeks.

"We suspect that at some point on Friday a heavy vehicle has driven up onto the footpath, breaking the concrete pavers," said Mr See.

Warwick Town Hall due for needed restoration

The historic sandstone Warwick Town Hall building is due to undergo a set of major renovations to keep it in good condition for future generations. This includes structural and stonework restorations to the 124 year old building, as well as drainage improvements, expected to take five months to complete.

"The Warwick Town Hall is an iconic building that is very important to Warwick," said Mayor Ron Bellingham. "It is essential that we keep it in good repair so that it can be enjoyed by everyone for many years to come."

For six weeks from 5 March 2012, parts of the front of the Warwick Town Hall will be fenced off for underpinning works. Underpinning will address settlement of the North of the front of the building that

has caused defects such as slight movement in the keystones and bedding courses.

"This movement has occurred over time," said Greg Thouard, Manager Facilities and Recreation. "Our contractors will need to excavate and then shore up under the areas that have

"People will still be able to access the Town Hall through the front entrance while these works are underway," Mr Thouard

When underpinning is completed, repairs to stonework by Queensland Heritage Masonry will start, with scaffolding erected on both pedestrian laneways beside the building.

"An exclusion zone will be installed to meet safety requirements," Mr Thouard said. "The pedestrian laneway on the northern side of the Town Hall will be closed and the laneway on the southern side will be reduced by half. Access to the front of the building will be available."

Stone works include re-pointing of damaged bedding between sandstone blocks; replacement of a damaged urn on the upper parapet; repair of a broken and loose capstone on the parapet wall; repair of columns and bases; realignment of keystones and cornices; and a low pressure clean of all stonework in the front section up to the parapet wall. These works are expected to finish in June.

Drainage works will also form part of the project. Mr Thouard explained that over time, the level of Palmerin Street has been raised and where steps to access Town Hall once existed, the entrance is now a ramp. "Underfloor ventilation has been affected by the change in street levels and our contractors will undertake remedial work to allow underfloor cross flow

ventilation," he said.

Work will be carried out by R&M Monteverde Pty Ltd and Queensland Heritage Masonry, consulting structural engineers Roy B Hoskins & Associates and architect Ridell Architecture. The current project is estimated to cost \$475,000, which includes monies set aside by Council over a number of years as well \$125,000 in grant monies. Funding of \$25,000 is from the Community Memorial Restoration Program and \$100,000 is from the Regional and Local Community Infrastructure

Program.

This is the latest in a series of ongoing restoration works for the building originally built in 1888. Over the past few years Council has repaired the clock and bell ringer, restored the clock face, replaced the side doors and restored the front doors and replaced damaged floorboards in the office area.

Heritage restoration of the internal bathrooms is a future restoration project.

An example of a ventilation outlet that has been partially covered by raised levels. Initially there was a step up to the Town Hall from the street level. On either side of this ventilation outlet the stonework has been worn away. The restoration will see a sandstone process used to make blocks like these look as good as new


