

Southern Downs' pest survey underway

Southern Downs Regional Council pest control officers will be visiting properties from now through to 22 May 2012 to check for instances of declared plant pests as part of a series of rotational inspections of the whole region.

The current survey will map the distribution and spread of declared pests across the region, with particular emphasis on some areas.

In the Northern Zone that will be Warwick, Junabee, Wiyarra, Tannymorel, Murray's Bridge, Loch Lamond and the areas that border Junabee Road and Warwick Killarney Road. In these areas they are looking at all pests but in particular for instances of African Boxthorn, Tree pear, Weedy Sporobolous grasses, Honey Locust, Blackberry and Mother of Millions.

In the Southern Zone the focus will be on Cannon Creek, Applethorpe and The Summit, with emphasis on instances of Fireweed, Blackberry, Weedy Sporobolous grass and Annual Ragweed.

Council will also be mapping rabbit harbour and educating people on pest animal control for wild dogs, foxes, rabbits and

"Our goal is to have an environmentally sustainable Southern Downs," said Tim O'Brien, Manager Environmental Service. "Controlling declared pest plants is extremely important in maintaining a healthy environment and productive agriculture. "Some of these plants are harmful to livestock, whilst others can quickly infest crops," Mr O'Brien said. "Some provide refuge for pest animals, and some, like Parthenium weed, can even harm human health.

"While it is the landholder's responsibility to control declared pest plants on their property, we will work with them to help identify pest plants and to help with understanding the best practices for treatment.

"Pest management is something we need to work on together. To assist landowners with plant pest control, Council has large pumps and spray units available for hire at reasonable rates," he explained. "We are also asking residents to let Council know if they notice pest plants on road reserves."

Council works with Landcare and environmental groups to assist them with field days and plant pest education programs. If you have a group that would like assistance please call 07 4661 0300 or 07 4681 5500.

The current survey began on 22nd February 2012 and will run for three months, expiring on 22nd May 2012.

Allora's Past 25 years ago March 1987 Grain Depot for Lease

Operators of the Allora grain depot, Bulk Grains Queensland, is assessing two applications from Allora district growers interested in entering into an agency agreement to operate the depot for the next twelve months. The agreement would be on a trial basis from the start of the 1987 winter crop harvest. The appointed operator would be required to carry out all tasks associated with the receival, storage and outturn of all grains.

Trooper R. Sinton very worthily represented the Allora detail of the 14th Australian Light Horse at the Pratten military tournament last week. In the face of keen competition the trooper won the individual tent-pegging, the handicap sprint for all-comers, the alarm race, and the steeplechase, and also shared second honours with Corporal A. Smith in the Gretna Green race. We must congratulate Trooper Sinton on his prowess.

(Trooper Rolland Sinton enlisted in the 2nd A. L. H. Regiment, A. I. F. on the 21st August 1914. He served at Gallipoli and in Egypt and had been promoted to the position of Squadron Sergeant Major when he was awarded the Serbian Silver Star for distinguished service. He returned to Australia on the 20th June 1919 with the rank of Lieutenant. Rolly Sinton was the father of Bill and Bob Sinton of Allora)

WIRAC closes pool, courts for maintenance

Warwick Indoor Recreation and Aquatic Centre's pools and sports courts will be closed for planned maintenance from 31 March to 16 April 2012, with the gymnasium remaining open. WIRAC manager Don Warrener said the pools would be drained to allow an overhaul of the sand filtration system for the

"While they are empty, we'll replace the sand media and the laterals in the sand filters, a required maintenance that needs to be done every 10 to 15 years," Mr Warrener said.

"We'll also take the opportunity to do some regular maintenance in the pools, such as caulking the joints between the tiles, repainting all the non slip areas and poolside signage, and repainting the inside of the rapid river pool."

The dry court area will also be closed for its bi-annual resurfacing.

"The courts are overdue for resurfacing and you can see the lacquer starting to peel away, which can make them slippery," Mr Warrener said.

"We'll be sanding the courts back and applying fresh lacquer, as well as marking new basketball keyways because the required shape has changed."

There will be no Holiday Activity Programs during the Easter school holidays due to this work.

"We apologise for any inconvenience while this necessary maintenance is done." he said.

WIRAC will put a hold on direct debit payments from members while the pool and courts are unavailable, but people with gym memberships will still be able to use the facilities.

The outdoor pools at Allora and Killarney close on 16 March and 30 March respectively for the end of the summer season.

Council supports local businesses

Over 70 percent of goods purchased by Southern Downs Regional Council in the last twelve months have come from local businesses.

In the 12 months to 15 January 2012, purchasing figures show that 71.49 percent of Council supplies have been sourced from locally owned or operated businesses.

Total expenditure for this period was \$27.2 million.

Mayor Ron Bellingham said this demonstrated once again how much Council puts back into the community.

"Wherever it makes sense for the ratepayer, we will choose to go with a competitive local supplier, so that more local dollars stav local." Cr Bellingham said.

Goods and services from legal advice to excavation supply to traffic control and even toilet paper have come from local providers.

He said it was not possible to purchase some goods and services locally due to legislative requirements, lack of local suppliers, or competitive group buying for local government.

"Clearly we have to weigh up the benefits to the community as a whole," the Mayor said.

"We must be able to buy the right goods and services for a particular job at a competitive price, and will consider a local supplier that meets those needs."
