Southern Downs Regional Council Mayor Ron Bellingham officially opened Allora's new playground in Stuart Henry Park on Tuesday afternoon along with students from Allora State School & St. Patrick's School.

Allora play precinct completed as Council opens \$83,000 new playground at Stuart Henry Park

Mayor Ron Bellingham was today delighted to officially open an \$83,000 new playground at Stuart Henry Park, Allora, a lovely country town between Warwick and Toowoomba.

Nestled in between the Allora Swimming Pool, basketball courts and Skate Park, the new playground sees Stuart Henry Park become the hub of a children's "play precinct".

The colourful new playground features a complex new fort and monkey bar series, double chain swing set and a bird's nest swing, all meeting current Australian safety standards.

"I'm delighted to open this substantially upgraded facility for the Allora community," Cr Bellingham said.

"This is the 14th playground upgrade in the Southern Downs during the term of this Council, and is all part of plans to provide clean, safe outdoor spaces for families to actively enjoy," he said.

Also opening this week is the 15th playground upgrade for the Southern Downs, at Chase Estate Park in Warwick.

Upgrades to the playground at Canning Park in Killarney are currently underway.

"In the last three and a half years our Parks & Gardens team

have done an outstanding job replacing eight public amenities blocks and making substantial upgrades to 15 parks across the Southern Downs, not counting the current Killarney projects," Cr Bellingham said.

"We're not going to stop here," he said. "Every year there will be consideration given to other parks in our capital budget." "We'll be looking first and foremost at safety, upgrading those parks with old or outdated equipment that doesn't meet current Australian safety standards."

Landholders, candidates advised of local laws for election signage

In the lead up to the state and local government elections, candidates and property owners are advised to be aware of the local laws regarding election signage.

Only one election sign per property, or Lot, is allowed under Southern Downs Local Law 1.4 for Advertising Devices and the sign must not have a face area larger than 1sqm. No signs are permitted on road reserves or Council controlled land such as footpaths or parks.

"It is the property owner, not the sign owner, who will face penalties if laws are breached," explained Rod Ferguson, Council's Chief Executive Officer.

"It is the property owner's responsibility to meet the local law. So if a candidate approaches you to put a sign on your property, it is important you are aware of the local law requirements," Mr Ferguson said.

"The intent of this local law is to protect the amenity of an area. For example, during the 2008 local government election there were 23 councillor candidates and five Mayoral candidates, so if the local law was not in place there was potential for 28 signs on any one block."

Council carried out compliance inspections region wide on Monday. The release fee for signs which were impounded by Council is \$100 per sign.

Candidates can apply to Council to have more than one sign on a Lot on a case by case basis.

The rules are different for real estate signage, with the local law allowing one sign for each real estate agent marketing the property, up to a maximum of three signs on the one Lot, with each sign allowed a face area of up to 1.2sqm.

It was later split, the eastern part of the property being purchased by Charles and George Clark. This section was later again divided, the 22,500 acres to the west of the railway line being purchased by the S. A. I. Company with George Clark retaining East Talgai)

tradition takes on extra meaning on Saturday given it is the 20th anniversary of the first time the Shield was contested. The Barrett Family Shield was donated by the Barrett Family in 1993 as the prize for the annual Warwick "Cowboys" verses Wattles "Warriors" First Grade Pre-Season trial. It had been suggested at a Wattles Rugby League Club committee meeting in 1992 by then Wattles Club Secretary Peter Glass that a trophy be introduced for the annual trial between the neighbouring clubs, and Wattles committee member Mary Hamblin (nee Barrett) offered a trophy in the Barrett Family's name. The Barrett name is synonymous with rugby league throughout the South West Queensland region.

The family has very strong rugby league links in the Southern Downs area, their roots with the Warwick & Wattles Rugby League Football Clubs. The Barrett brothers, Tom, Leo, Ron & John played with the famous Collegians Rugby League Club of Warwick. Tom, who sadly passed away in 1996, also played a season with Wattles.

A dedicated worker for the game, Tom was awarded Life Membership of the Warwick "Cowboys" in 1995, & was joint winner of the prestigious "Merv Lancaster Memorial Sports Volunteer of the Year" award, also in 1995. Annually, Under16 aged junior rugby league representative sides from the Warwick & District Junior Rugby League and the Toowoomba Junior Rugby League contest the "Tom Barrett Memorial Shield".

John Barrett has also had a significant involvement in rugby league in the St. George area in South West Queensland, and the game on a State & National front. He served from 1994 until 2008 as the Chairman of the Queensland Rugby League's South West Division and a Director on the Queensland Rugby League Board. He was also a Director of the Australian Rugby League Board from 2003 to 2008. In 2001 & 2002 he served as a Manager of the Australian Rugby League team, including the all conquering Australian "Kangaroos" tour of Papua-New Guinea and Great Britain. A Life Member of the St. George Rugby League Club and the QRL South West Division, John was recognized for services to rugby league in 2005 when he was the recipient of the "Order of Australia" in the Queen's Birthday honours.

When one considers the involvement in the game of Tom, Leo, Ron & John, Barrett sisters Mary (Hamblin) & Joan (Bourke) could do little else but also have a rugby league interest. A former long serving committee member & a Life Member of the Wattles "Warriors", Mary can also boast considerable achievements in the game. While a more than astute Treasurer for many years for the "Warriors", Mary was also President of the club in 1992 & 1993. This was a historical feat, the first ever female President of a club in the Toowoomba Rugby League competition. Mary also has the honour of being the inaugural winner of the Toowoomba Rugby League's "Club Person of the Year" award in 1999.

Mary & husband Alwyn Hamblin's four sons, Paul, Darren,



Glenn & Cameron have all appeared for Wattles in Barrett Family Shield matches, while their cousin Dayne, son of Tom & Gay Barrett, has previously lined up for Warwick. Dayne's younger brother Frank also ran on for the Warwick "Cowboys" before leaving the area to play with Newcastle and Balmain in the Australian Rugby League competition. Frank has turned very successfully to rugby league administration, having spent three years as the General Manager of the Newcastle Rugby League, and later, as General Manager, Frank was at the helm of the New South Wales Rugby League Western Sydney Development Academy for some time, before taking over as Manager of Media & Football Operations for National Rugby League Club, the Bulldogs. He is currently based in Melbourne, the General Manager of Communications for the Melbourne Storm.

Another talented family member to don the red, white and blue of the Warwick "Cowboys" & feature in Barrett Family Shield history is Michael Barrett, son of Leo & Theresa, Michael's sister Joanne has been a regular member of the Australian Women's Rugby League side since 2007. Joanne made the presentation of the prestigious Shield on behalf of the Barrett family last year, after the Wattles "Warriors" had defeated the Warwick "Cowboys" by 26 - 12.

Wattles have won the Shield on eight occasions, Warwick are ten time winners, with a drawn result in 2000.

The senior grade action kicks off this Saturday afternoon with the Under 18 clash between Warwick & Wattles at 4.00 pm, followed by Reserve Grade at 5.30 pm and the main game at 7.00 pm.

The best & fairest player in the Barrett Shield "A" Grade clash will receive the "Terry Doyle Memorial Medallion", the award first presented in 2011 in memory of the former Wattles President & Life Member, won by Wattles forward Brady Glass. Wattles teams to meet Warwick in this Saturday's Barrett Family Shield pre-season trials are:




