Looking Back...

The Commercial Hotel


With the re-opening of the Commercial Hotel last Friday after extensive renovations, I thought that I would outline some of its history.

Francis Kates opened one of Allora's first general stores on the north eastern corner of Herbert and Drayton Streets in 1863. The business was sold to Kennedy Brothers in 1876 and by the 1890's, John Kellv's Commercial Stores occupied the building. In 1892 Francis Kates commissioned local builder W. G. Gillam to draw up plans for a new hotel to be built on the site. Gillam had built the new St. David's Church in 1888 and supervised the erection of the new hotel by Toowoomba contractors, Grigg & Meninnhett.

The hotel opened on the 1st April 1892 and the first licensee was John Kelly who for the previous five years had been licensee of the Royal Hotel. In 1904 when Frank Kilmister was the licensee. the hotel was extended on the Herbert Street side, with four new bedrooms upstairs and roomy sample rooms downstairs.

The freehold of the hotel passed to Frank Kates on the death of his father in 1903 and from Frank Kates to the Misses Mona and Florence Kates in 1918. John (Jack) Dodd purchased the freehold in 1923 thus ending 31 years of ownership by the Kates family.

The license of the hotel has passed

through 41 sets of hands prior to the current licensee Robyn Miles, each holding it for varying times. Jack Dodd, licensee from 1923 to 1938, and Merv. Parmenter, 1986 to 2001, being the longest serving licensees. The hotel celebrated its centenary on the 28th and

29th March 1992, and Julie Merv. Parmenter overseeing a very successful weekend of historical activities

It is good to see what is Allora's oldest hotel building get a new lease of life and we hope that it can again reach its heydays of the 1960's and 1970's when it was the meeting place for cattlemen after the

local weekly cattle sale, and the mid 1980's to the early 2000's in the time of Merv. and Julie Parmenter.

Current Allora and district residents with a known connection to the Commercial Hotel include Jim Quinlan and Pettigrew, Beryl great grandchildren of John Kelly, and the Marshall family from Table Top, great grandchildren of John Thomas Marshall, licensee from 1911 to 1915.

"Jacky Dodd and Dan O'Shea wait for me at the end of day". A

line remembered by Keith Masters from an Allora concert skit referring to the licensees of the Commercial and Railway Hotels waiting for the visit of the local police sergeant at closing time.




Authors speak at Warwick library



Storm King Dam wall strengthening begins

Upgrades to Storm King Dam continue with the start of works on Monday this week, to strengthen the dam wall to withstand a one in 100.000 year flood.

The work follows completion of inlet works in late 2011. The total cost of the project is estimated at \$1.25m, which is 40 percent funded by the State Government.

Rock anchors and dowels will be installed into the wall of the dam to safely pass 100 percent of Queensland's Acceptable Flood Capacity specifications as required by the Queensland Government.

Council has contracted Geotech Pty Ltd, a structural engineering company specialising in post tensioning work, to anchor steel cables vertically through the dam wall into the bedrock.

The project must be completed by June 30 to meet strict deadlines set by the Department of Environment and Resource Management (DERM).

Residents should not be worried about the stability of the dam, said Peter See, Director of Engineering Services.

"The dam, currently, is capable of withstanding any major floods that is likely to occur in its lifetime," Mr See said.

"However, the State Government has decreed that because it is upstream of Stanthorpe, it must be able to withstand a one in 100.000 year flood." he explained.

"Such a flood is unlikely to occur, however, should it occur in the future these works will ensure that the Stanthorpe community will not have to worry about the dam failing."

Storm King Dam was originally built in 1954 and supplies the drinking water supply for Stanthorpe. This work is not expected to interrupt the Stanthorpe water supply.

This work continues Council's program of maintenance and replacement to water mains around Stanthorpe. Council recently upgraded water infrastructure in the Stanthorpe main street and in 2010/11 Council replaced over 130 valves and hydrants along the Stanthorpe water mains.
