

In the Allora Police Court following his transfer from Allora to Laidley, Sergeant King was commended by the Chairman of the Bench, Mr. William Deacon J. P., on his resolute execution of his duties. The remarks were endorsed by Mr. Patrick Donovan J. P. and Allora solicitor Mr. G. V. Jenkins. An informal farewell function, attended by townsmen and seven local magistrates, was held in Tattersalls' Hotel the same evening)

Rebecca's Waterfowl Success







Queenslanders urged to be aware of winter home fire risk

With the arrival of cooler temperatures across Queensland tipped for this week. RACQ Insurance is cautioning householders to ensure their home heaters are safe to use. RACQ Insurance Executive Manager Communications, Mike Sopinski, said that with cooler nights and mornings heaters are being put into use after many months in storage.

"At this time of year, Queenslanders need to be especially aware of the potential risks posed by heating devices, particularly those that have been stored for some time and may be overdue for a safety check," Mr Sopinski said.

RACQ Insurance research showed faulty electrical appliances including home heaters were a major cause of house fires. RACQ Insurance claims data from last year showed the prevalence of home electrical fires during the cooler months:

- May (5.1 per cent)
- June (7.3 per cent)
- July (7.3 per cent)
- August (9.8 per cent)

The day of the week home electrical fires were most likely was Thursday (19.3 per cent) and Wednesday (17.1 per cent), while the greatest danger times were between 10am - 11am (11.1 per cent) followed by 4pm - 5pm (9.4 per cent).

"Residents should maintain heating equipment even when the appliance is not in use. Improperly installed, damaged or misused heaters are frequent sources of preventable incidents," Mr Sopinski said.

"Before switching heaters on, home owners should check for damaged cords and blocked filters, particularly in older equipment. People should also be careful when buying second-hand electrical appliances and thoroughly check the unit for safety."

RACQ Insurance urged Queensland householders to consider these simple steps to prevent and manage home electrical

- Never attempt to fix or service electrical equipment yourself. Take appliances to a licensed electrician for all repairs.
- · Check for damaged or exposed power points. Don't use them - have them inspected and repaired by a licensed
- · Check for frayed or damaged electrical cords on appliances. If damaged, don't use the appliance - have it inspected and repaired by a licensed electrician.
- · If an electrical appliance emits any odour or smoke, immediately turn it off at the power point and have it inspected and repaired by a licensed electrician.
- · Inspect and clean filters on air conditioners.
- · Always switch off the appliance, turn it off at the power point and disconnect the cord when the appliance is not in use.
- · Never leave an operating appliance unattended for a long period of time or while vou're not at home.
- Install and maintain smoke alarms in the house, as required

Mr Sopinski said that Queensland fire protection laws required domestic dwellings to have smoke alarms installed. The laws also required householders to regularly check and maintain them.

"The Queensland winter can surprise with its sudden cold snaps and we expect home heating appliances to work overtime over coming months," Mr Sopinski said.

"Through adopting these simple measures, the high-risk home fire winter season will be much safer for all householders."



Many are going without things we take for granted like nutritious food or a warm bed. Many are questioning how they will get through the winter months with what appears to be a never ending increase in the cost of

"We are seeing large numbers of families - including working mums and dads - who just cannot make ends meet. A number of these people are making heartbreaking decisions about whether to feed their kids or pay their bills. Without doubt we are seeing more clients suffering from stress and anxiety than ever before."

"The people we are seeing have issues that are increasingly more complex. They have a large number of debts."
