



Mayor takes first steps towards implementing policy

In his first week as the new Mayor of the Southern Downs, Peter Blundell has taken the first steps towards implementing his campaign policy.

"I would like to thank the electorate for the faith they have shown in their Councillors and for electing me as its leader.
