Allora Queensland Fire & Rescue Service staff has been involved in delivering fire education recently at both the Allora State School and St. Patrick's School, Allora. Lieutenant Peter Koina and Firefighter Andrew Petersen were more than pleased with the attention they received from students as they explained and demonstrated basic fire safety techniques and passed on necessary knowledge. The visits wouldn't be complete without students taking a tour of the fire truck, and having a go at the fire hose.

Fire Ed is one of the longest standing, and best-known programs of Queensland Fire & Rescue Service.

In 2008 a new Fire Ed School Community Safety Program was released for children in their early years of learning (Prep-Year

The social context of community safety is used to promote the student's development and demonstration of knowledge and understandings of the key concepts of community, safety and responsibility. This is done through the active learning processes of investigation, communication, participation and reflection.

The program now incorporates an outcomes-based approach and covers the key concepts of community, safety and responsibility. Queensland Curriculum and Reporting Framework essential learnings are also covered in the Key Learning Areas of English, SOSE, Health and Physical Education, Mathematics, Science, Technology, the Arts including Media, Drama and Visual Arts.

The new Fire Ed is not just "Stop, Drop and Roll," but an





updated, interactive School Community Safety Program delivered to Grade ones but can be used from Prep to Year three by all teachers.

The new, interactive package incorporates an amazing Big Book with key learning messages and four safety rules, a Teacher's Resource Manual and an informative, fun and interactive DVD, all developed by Prism Education Services.

The essential and much-anticipated firefighter and fire truck

The essential and much-anticipated firefighter and fire truck visits in grade one are still highlights of the program but are now supported by the new education package. Firefighters will be visiting your school to discuss and explain the important role of teachers in the new Fire Ed program.





Looking Back...

Allora Flour Mill

A recent email from Rod Gisler, a greatgrandson of Friedrich Gisler who with his Christian. brother operated the Allora Steam Flour Mill from to 1892, prompted me to tell the story of the mill (It also being the 5th Thursday in the month, "Years Ago" items had been exhausted)

The Allora Steam Flour Mill was built in 1871 by James Dougall for Francis Kates on the 1 acre allotment in Drayton Street between Kates' general store on the corner of Herbert and Drayton Streets and the water lane. It was operated under a partnership of Francis Kates, James Dougall and Robert Cooke. In 1887, Kates then being the sole owner, sold a 2/3 share of the mill to Swiss brothers Friedrich and Christian Gisler. On his arrival in Australia in 1872,



Friedrich's first job was to install the machinery in Neden Bros. Darlington Mill in Toowoomba. Similar machinery may have been installed in the Allora mill.

On the 2nd October 1892 the Allora mill burned to the ground. Although there were signs of a break-in, the fire was blamed on a severe electrical storm which occurred at the time. Amongst the items listed at a salvage sale on the 3rd December 1892 was an "IRON CHIMNEY with stays".

At a sale of the land and mill salvage held on the 22nd September 1894, the chimney was again offered for sale. In the 29th September 1894 issue of the Allora Guardian, Christian Gisler called for tenders for the carrying of the boilers, chimney and engine to the railway at

ALLORA HISTORICAL SOCIETY SHOWCASE THEIR RESEARCH CENTRE AND LIBRARY

Not only does the Allora Historical Society have a vast collection of items which reflect the history of the district, it has many resources to aid people who are researching their family histories.

The first newspaper in Allora, the Allora Guardian, is restored on microfilm. The paper was first printed in 1888 and ceased operation in 1934.

Within a short time a group of Allora businessmen including Hubert Deacon and Frank Donovan provided the funds for Mick O'Connor to print The Allora Advertiser in a shed in Raff Street. Mick had previously worked at the Guardian office.

The Historical Society holds a copy of the Advertiser dated 1940 and every issue of the Advertiser after 1949 except 1952. (If anyone has a copy of any of the issues of that year or any issues before 1950, the Society would be grateful to copy them)

The Historical Society has folders with photos of churches, business houses, farming, hotels and houses.

There are folders on all the various sports that have been played and are still played throughout the district.

Research Officer, Colin Newport has built up an extensive collection of family files. Many family members who have left the district come back and make use of these files. The Historical Society is always happy to help out and share and exchange information and photos.

Colin has made a personal collection of Darling Downs History books which are kept at the Old Shire Hall. He is happy for people to come and make use of them on the premises.

Many people have shown interest in the display mounted in Jon Constable's chemist shop window. A direct result of the display was the sale of five copies of "The Diaries of Spencer Briggs" which was compiled and printed by Historical Society members. Dr. Geoff Briggs who recently traveled to Allora from Tasmania, saw our display. His brother Murray bought the books and was helpful in identifying photos taken from negatives donated to the museum many years ago by his aunt Noel Briggs.



to the Historical Society By Michael Beck, great grandson of William Leggatt. This saw was most likely used on the building of the Railway Hotel, St. David's Rectory, Miegunyah Private Hospital (now Rackley's Home) and his own home in Herbert Street beside the Medical Centre.
