






#### Allora Community Auction 2012

#### Looking Back...

Last week, Historical Society members John & Lvn Wright and mvself visited Murray & Merle Briggs to inspect an old port full of documents originally belonging to Murray's grandfather, Spencer Briggs. Murray had come into possession of the port, unwanted by the family, during a divide-up of the belongings of his late aunt, Noel Briggs in Allora. The port contained photos, letters, a book manuscript, diaries and accounts dating from 1821, a treasure trove to the fanatical local history buff but a pile of old rubbish jokingly referred to by Merle Briggs.

One thing that I found was that the articles, "A New Chum's Troubles" printed in the Allora Guardian from May 1889, were written by Spencer Briggs and were in his own words "The

author's first attempt at the art of literature". Spencer Briggs went on to write a regular column under the pen name "The Angel" and eventually to become the editor of the "Guardian". The following is the first of those articles:

#### A NEW CHUM'S TROUBLES

I was the other day sent by my boss to get a load of ant bed to floor the kitchen with. I was provided with a shovel, a dray, two horses and the necessary harness. I started, alorving in the fact that I, as a new chum, was trusted with all this paraphernalia. I reached the wilderness at Hendon and soon found an ant bed. I knew it was an ant bed as soon as I stepped onto it. There were, on a rough calculation, fifty seven ants to the square inch, so there could be no mistake about it. I thought that the sooner that I got it on the dray the better. I shovelled. The ants didn't seem to sting but they were nasty creeping things. They ran up the handle of my shovel and



but the damage was done with Brothers scoring four further second stanza touchdowns to cement victory and slide into second place on the premiership ladder.




