

Allora Landcare Group

The Allora Landcare Group (ALG) has begun work to develop the bitumen parking area on Forest Plain Road that gives access to Allora Mountain Reserve. For those who are not familiar with the area, it is about 50 metres off the highway on the left hand side. Originally built by Council, and with a formal sign inviting visitors to the Reserve, it became neglected over time and covered with weeds. As we have written in earlier messages in the Advertiser, ALG intend to develop the Reserve into an environmental park, similar to Rosenthal Scrub in Warwick. Progress has been slow but sure. Our first goal has been securing vehicular access to the reservoir. Access is limited and further complicated by the development of the Allora refuse station. However, following a number of meetings with SDRC officers, we are delighted to report that we have been given in-kind Council support, and so work has begun on planning an access road. In the interim, Council has given us approval to develop the parking area. We see this as an opportunity to achieve something tangible in the short term. We have commenced mulching the car park surrounds, with the mulch provided free of charge by Council. The planting of appropriate trees and shrubs will take place after weed control has been achieved. The planting will be undertaken by ALG and, following meetings with the principals of Allora State

Allora Medical Centre a Reality

Many within the Allora district would have woke last Thursday morning, and tuned in to their radios or retrieved the tabloid from the front lawn, to hear or see the news that the local Allora Medical Support Group Inc. have longed for over the past 24 months. The group, that was formed exactly two years previously, had been successful in their bid for a National Rural and Remote Health Infrastructure Program grant to help build and equip a new medical centre in Allora. Federal Member for Maranoa Bruce Scott confirmed the grant amount of \$285,607.11 had been approved, \$243,118.18 for capital works and \$42,488.93 for equipment. Mr. Scott said "The Allora Medical Support Group should be commended for its proactive actions to make the medical centre a reality."

AMSG Chairman Jon Constable, who likened the announcement to Christmas, said "This is a very exciting time and we are most grateful for the support of the federal government."

The seed was planted with the Allora community back on March 16th 2010, a seed that can be said to have germinated last week, a seed that will eventually grow into a new, state of the art medical facility in the heart of "the Best Little Town on the Downs".

In early 2010 the Allora & district community were struggling with local doctor access of half a day per week or less, no

Looking Back...

Goomburra Memories from 100 years ago

Walter Whatley came to Goomburra in 1912 and was present at the opening of the Allora to Goomburra branch line. He purchased the property "Wando Vale" and in the following year, married Miss Helen Boadle of "Glen Helen". Walter was, at the time, secretary of the Goomburra Branch of the Queensland Farmers Union and was presented with a marble clock. In 1972 he donated that clock to the Allora museum and wrote down some of his early memories:

George Gwynne drove the cream cart and Ernie Ardron ran the mail three times a week.

J. Dougall grew corn at the head of the creek and fattened pigs with it. When they were ready for sale, he loaded some bags of corn on the dray and dropped it in small heaps on the road. In this way the pigs followed the dray until they were yarded in Allora

About 1910-1912 wheat growing started and Charlie Smith from Berat did the thrashing. Jack Turner carted to the station with his bullock team.

In the early days a bunyip used to be heard thundering in the Big Water Hole at the head of the creek but seemed to disappear after a big flood.

A total eclipse of the sun occurred and Goomburra was in the "halo of totality". Everybody watched it through smoked glass. The hens went to roost at 4 p.m. and got up again later.

Inverramsay School was opened in January 1914 and Charlie Masters was the head master for many years.

During the 1st World War a Patriotic Fund was run with raffles and dances to a very energetic beat. Each returned soldier received a presentation from the Patriotic Fund.

The Goomburra Farmers Union was heavily involved in the secession of the Allora Shire from the Clifton Shire in 1915. The decision was made at a largely attended meeting of the district

in the Goomburra Hall, when speakers from all over the Shire met and talked the matter out. The motion was put and Walter, as secretary and anxious to get home to his wife, seconded the motion.

The Farmers Union was also responsible for getting the phone line extended from the station to Dougall's and gravel road up to "Melmerle" (W. W. Holmes')

In about 1919 flying foxes started a colony in a 4 acre patch of scrub opposite Inverramsay. That year all the box trees came out in full bloom and for weeks the foxes flew over every night eating the blossoms.

Also in 1919 the first ambulance came to Goomburra when Mrs. Erhart was very ill. Two horse teams belonging to H. Griffiths and J. Long pulled it across the boggy patches.

Goomburra Polo Club ran for several years and played in the Toowoomba Carnival. Notable ponies were Twilight and Black Bess, with Jim Anderson's Twilight winning all the local sprint races.

1920 was the first year of the State Wheat Board and W. Neale did the classifying. Delivery did not start until June and the horse teams used to line up from early in the morning. Later, grain sheds were built at Berat and Goomburra. At 4.30 one morning Andy Jensen passed "Wando Vale" with a rooster on top of his wagon load of wheat. It crowed to its mates at every house on the way to Goomburra.

There were scattered patches of prickly pear which the farmers poisoned with arsenic pent-oxide using a stabber which injected the poison into the plants until the cactoblastis came and finished the pear. Walter remembers when the first noogoora burrs came to Goomburra on some cattle taken to the head of the creek. The seed washed down a few years later in a flood, much to the sorrow of the farmers.

The Whatley family sold their Goomburra property in 1934 and moved to Dalby before finally settling on "Tilbury" at Dulacca. Walter died in 1982 at the age of 95.



Conservation Skills Workshops for Allora Historical Society Volunteers

Volunteer members of the Allora and District Historical Society last week hosted the second visit to the community by Lydia Egunnike, a Museum Development Officer based at the Museum Resource Centre for Southern Inland Queensland located at the Cobb & Co Museum in Toowoomba. Lydia is a wellknown paper conservator who most recently worked in that capacity at the Queensland State Library in Brisbane.

The purpose of her visits is to assist local volunteers to assess and develop strategies to manage the important photographic collection and other paper objects held in the two museums at Allora.

A very significant aspect of the collection is the almost complete collection of Mayoral Portraits from the Allora Municipal Council 1869 – 1915 and Chairman portraits from the Allora Shire Council 1915 – 1994.

During the series of 4 workshops planned, volunteers will learn how to repair insect damage, replace damaged supports with archival material and to develop appropriate preventative strategies and suitable storage methods for the future.

Volunteers will also be taught skills which will enable them to

photograph and digitize the collection by professional photographer and tutor, Don Hildred, who hails from Warwick, but conducts a successful art photography and teaching business in Toowoomba.

This project has been made possible through a Southern Downs Regional Arts Development Grant, jointly funded by Southern Downs Regional Council and Arts Queensland.

Anyone who wishes to be part of this project should contact Dorothy Haig. New volunteers will be made very welcome.

access to a building that could serve as a specific medical centre, a vague plan for a new medical centre based on the former Allora Shire Council chambers building in Herbert Street and a huge community concern about the lack of local medical services in Allora.

The motivation was there for a public meeting with over 600 people squeezing into the Allora Community Hall set on developing a plan to assure medical services for Allora's future. A group to take up the challenge of pursuing the much needed medical services was endorsed by the meeting, the group being Jon Constable, Roy Smith, David Dwan, Ann Balmain, David Brown & Glyn Rees. That group of concerned citizens was joined by Southern Downs Regional Councillors Neil Meiklejohn, Denise Ingram & Joanne McNally, who along with Council's Economic Development Officer formed the Allora Medical Services Taskforce.

On the 26th of July 2010 the Allora area based component of the Allora Medical Services Taskforce met to form an association established for the purpose of, amongst other purposes, the

establishment of ongoing administration of a medical centre for the community of Allora. The group, who had decided to go it alone, was to be known as the Allora Medical Support Group (AMSG), and the committee appointed was Jon Constable (Chairman), David Dwan (Vice-President), Glyn Rees (Secretary), Kellie Robson (Treasurer), Roy Smith, Ann Balmain & David Brown.

The AMSG achieved incorporation, and countless hours of voluntary work by committee members, and astounding community support in the way of fundraising has seen the Group, and the Allora community rewarded with the recent announcement of the generous National Rural and Remote Health Infrastructure Program grant.

While there have been many moments of frustrations, and an

came to the fore, donating significantly from their own hard earned funds, along with many, many very generous individuals. On the subject of generous individuals, the AMSG and the Allora community will forever be indebted to former long time Allora resident the late Mr. Eddie Hahn. Mr. Hahn, in an amazing gesture for Allora and its community bequeathed \$400,000 to the AMSG in support of the establishment of a new medical centre. While the medical centre goal was much more than a dream, Allora Medical Support Group Chairman Jon Constable said with the NRRHIP grant, the \$400,000 bequeathed by the late Mr. Hahn and the \$120,000 raised by the wider community, the medical centre project was guaranteed to go ahead.

Currently the AMSG are in discussions with the Southern Downs Regional Council about subdividing a vacant block near the current medical centre on Herbert St, to enable the new building to be constructed. Expert advice is being gathered as building plans are being developed for a Centre that will address Allora's medical needs long into the future. Specifics about when work will commence on the new building are not yet available, but it is expected that the new centre will be up and running by mid 2013.

"When it's all been spent and the centre is up and running we won't have a lot left over, but we will have a medical centre that will serve this community for generations." according to Mr. Constable. "We are very grateful to the Southern Downs Regional Council who have been very supportive and have assigned a project officer to identify problem areas and oversee construction".

As it stands, Allora is served by Dr Kaye Ellis and Dr Leith Geisel and a range of allied health service providers who work out of the small but very recognisable building at 45 Herbert Street, the heritage-listed surgery very familiar to the large majority of Allora area locals.

Mr. Constable said the Allora Medical Support Group Inc. would own the new building and the doctors would rent it back from them

With much of the hard work now done, Mr. Constable, a driving force for the cause from the very outset, recognizes and thanks his AMSG committee for their commitment, dedication and focus, and also the community who stepped up to contribute in any way possible to the new medical centre cause, "it was just another example of Allora's community spirit, we can't thank those who contributed or assisted enough".

Souths Success in Ragh Trophy Clash

It was all one way traffic at Toowoomba's rugby league headquarters on Sunday, the Southern Suburbs "Tigers" running roughsho0d over the "National Farmer's Warehouse" Wattles "Warriors" to the tune of 68-10. The "Tigers", early season tips as premiership favourites, returned to the winner's circle against Wattles after a horror stretch in recent weeks where they lost four matches from the past five outings.

The thirteen try to two romp saw the "Tigers" win the "Ragh Family Trophy", an award contested annually by Souths and Wattles, donated in 1995 by the Ragh family who shared a long involvement with both clubs.


