Historic Homestead to be Auctioned

One of Queensland's most historic homes, Talgai Homestead near Allora, will be put up for sale at the end of the year. Built in 1868, the homestead is listed with the Australian Heritage Commission and is in excellent condition according to its owner of twenty years, Mr. Douglas Panton. Mr. Panton said that architect's estimates put the replacement value of the house at 2 million dollars and he expected it to sell for between 1 million and 2 million dollars. Fully restored by the Panton family, the house features period furniture valued at \$200,000 which will be included in the auction.

Mr. Panton said that he would like to see the house bought by the Federal Government and always remain part of Queensland's heritage.

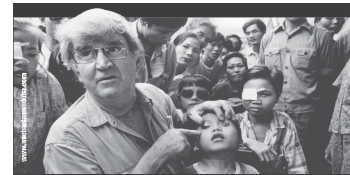

Rates discount period ends soon

Ratepayers in the Southern Downs region are reminded that the deadline to receive the discount on payment of rates is 5pm on Friday 14 September 2012.

Acting CEO Andrew Ireland said that 30 percent of rates had so far been paid, but that many people choose to pay their rates close to the discount deadline.

"We do remind people, particularly those paying by BPay, to make sure their payment is received by Council by 5pm on the due date," said the Acting CEO.

"Many financial institutions require a couple of days to process payments and send them to Council," he advised.

"Only people who have paid rates and charges in full by the due date will be eligible for the 10 percent discount."

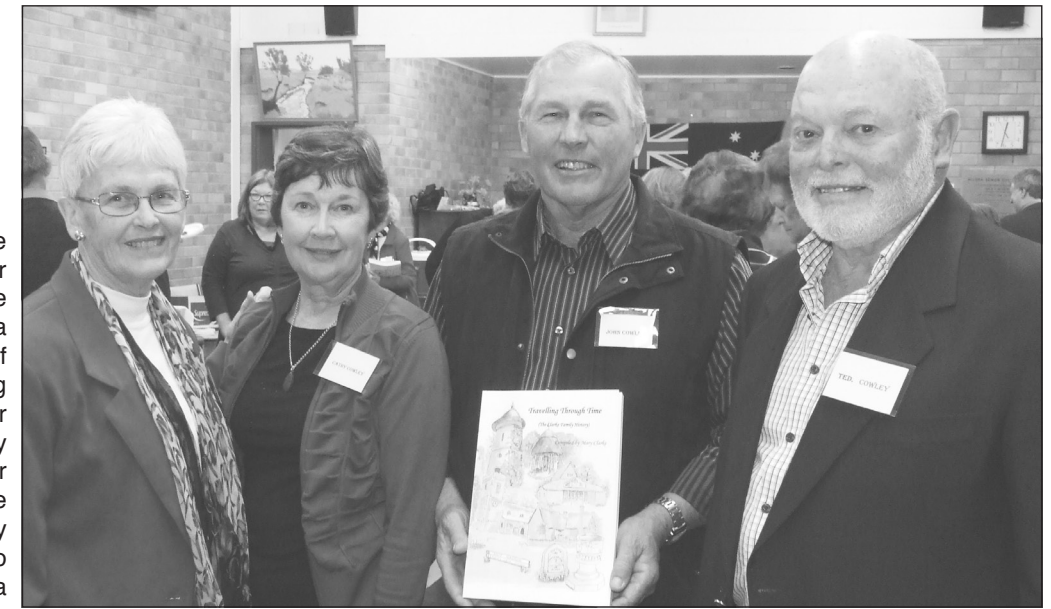

Mary Clarke Launches Clarke Family History "Travelling Through Time"

Allora's records of history were enriched on Saturday, September 1st, when around 65 members of the Clarke family and the Allora community celebrated the launch of Mary Clarke's book, "Travelling Through Time", at the Allora Senior Citizens Hall. The Clarke family gathering was a first time meeting for many family members. A copy of the book, that records the Clarke family history in such detail, and also features Allora area history, is now a part of the Allora Historical Society library.

"Travelling Through Time" is an enthusiastic celebration of the lives of the members of the Clarke family seen through Mary Clarke's eyes. Its pages span several centuries, recounting details of lives from those of the family founders in Northamptonshire in England in the 1700s, to stories from the countless cousins who reside in Australia today, descendants of patriarchs, Henry and Joseph Clarke, who arrived in Allora in January 1865. The book is also a unique tribute to the tenacity of family historians, and the rich tapestry of ideas and information that their work brings to our lives.
