






"The River Trust carries out an important role within our community and is supported by the Southern Downs Regional Council in its functions," said River Trust Chairperson, Mr David Brown.

"Works that protect and improve the bed and banks of the rivers and creeks and the prevention or mitigation of flooding within the Trust Benefit Area form part of the undertakings of this group.

The Trust Benefit Area is extensive, encompassing the whole of the former Shire of Warwick.

Over the past two years, the River Trust has been actively involved in the Condamine River Flood Study which has been undertaken by Council. Other operations have been limited due to the level of water flows in the river system and the saturation levels of the banks caused by the flooding disasters of 2010/2011.

"This year, we are intending to spend approximately \$180,000 performing exotic vegetation removal, bank stabilisation and debris removal in the Warwick, Allora and Killarney town reaches, and in certain sections along Bracker Creek, Emu Creek, Dalrymple Creek and Farm Creek." advised Mr Brown

"These works form an important part of protecting our river system.'



Revamp for region's history

Farming Waste disposal causes problems

Southern Downs Regional Council would like to remind residents that farming waste is not to be disposed of at Council's locked transfer stations.

In recent weeks, Council has been made aware of an increase in the amount of farming waste being disposed of at the locked transfer stations in the southern regions. These transfer stations are provided for domestic waste only, and any commercial and industrial waste, including farming waste, must not be disposed of at these facilities.

"When farming waste, such as t-tape, plastic mulch and hail netting, is disposed of in the bins at the locked transfer stations, it is transported to the Stanthorpe Waste Management Facility mixed with domestic waste," said Tim O'Brien, Acting Director Planning and Environment.

"The farming waste does not get separated from the domestic waste and due to the nature of the waste, it can cause major problems with the operation of the landfill," he advised.

"This includes making it difficult to cover the waste adequately, as required by environmental legislation, and the wire and t-tape can get caught in, and cause damage to, the machinery used to cover the waste." Mr O'Brien added.

Commercial and industrial waste, including farming waste, can be disposed of in the southern region at the Stanthorpe Waste Management Facility, and the Wallangarra Transfer Station. The Stanthorpe Waste Management Facility is currently open 7 days a week, from 7am to 6pm. The Wallangarra Transfer Station is open Friday- Monday from 8am-5pm.



Mr. Fred Cocks, secretary of the local church committee, outlined the financial position of the church which was considered most satisfactory. Following the service the ladies of the Guild dispensed afternoon tea in the Town Hall.

An inquest was held on the body of a child named John Holmes aged 4 years and 6 months, son of the landlord of the Dalrymple Hotel, at Allora by the coroner J. W. Aldred Esq. J. P. yesterday. From the evidence adduced, it appeared that the deceased, in company with his brother, a boy aged about 7 years of age, while in the act of playing on the bank of the creek, fell in the water and was drowned before assistance could be procured. The jury found a verdict accordingly. (Warwick Mail, 22nd October, 1862).

Cunningham's Gap Reconstruction

Update

The reconstruction works at Cunningham's Gap are about to reach a significant milestone with the opening of the new alignment to traffic through Clayton's Gully.

Traffic was switched from the existing alignment at Clayton's Gully onto the new highway alignment late on Monday afternoon. The new four lane alignment will give road users a safer and smoother ride.

Signage is in place to guide traffic onto the new alignment. Please remember to obey all signage and speed limits. These are in place for your safety and the safety of other road users. The recent dry weather has enabled the construction team at Clayton's Gully to make quicker than anticipated progress over the past couple of months. The lining of the gully with boulders to protect its slopes from future extreme wet weather has been completed. The remaining tasks include the installation of a guardrail, fencing and signage, and rehabilitation of the old alignment.

The anticipated completion date for this final reconstruction project at Cunningham Gap is late November, providing the good weather continues.

The Department of Transport and Main Roads appreciates your patience while these safety works are carried out.

More than \$57 million has been committed to the major reconstruction works at Cunningham's Gap.
