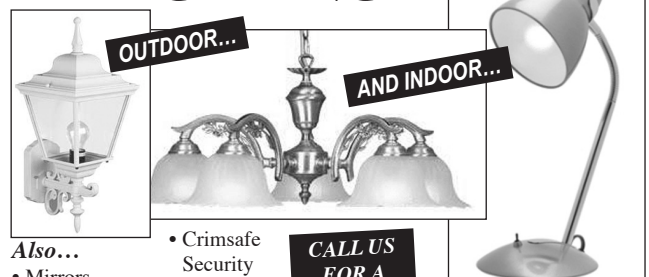

Hit by Forest Devil

An employee of the Allora Shire Council, Leslie Longhurst (27), married, of Allora, was gravely injured when he was struck on the head when using a forest devil to clear trees in preparation for the construction of a new road at Deuchar.

Longhurst received a compound fracture of the skull when a cog slipped as he was about to release the lever and the bar struck him on the forehead rendering him unconscious. A report from the hospital gives his condition as serious. *(A forest devil was a hand operated winch used to fell standing trees)*

Talgai West Sale

The sale of the 22,500 acre Talgai West Estate was conducted at the Town Hall, Warwick, on Wednesday, 30th October, 1912. The property had been subdivided into 102 farms ranging in area from 100 acres to 300 acres and was offered for sale by the Scottish Australian Investment Company Ltd. Several of the farms were sold prior to the sale by negotiation with the existing share farmers. Eleven farms with a total area of 2,000 acres were sold on the day of the sale for an aggregate of nearly £14,000. The highest price realized was £11/15/0 per acre for prime lucerne land while ridgy land brought £2/5/0 per acre. Successful local buyers at the sale were, C. Cocks, G. Grayson, N. Chandler, R. Frizzell and W. Morrell.

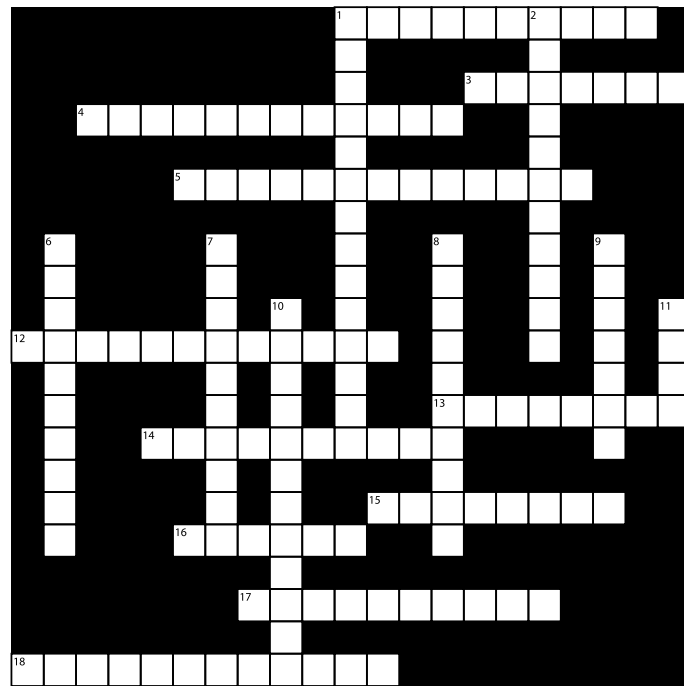

RURAL AREA POLICE REPORT (covering Aug/Sept 2012)

- 03/08/12: Single vehicle rollover crash occurred along the Yankee Gully Rd Deuchar involving a Holden Barina vehicle. The crash resulted with an injury to a 16-year-old passenger. Police have issued an Infringement Notice to the 17-year-old driver for failing to fulfil his duties by reporting the matter to police.
- 08/08/12: At approx. 10pm offender/s have attempted to enter premises at Inverramsay Rd, Goomburra, but have been disturbed in the attempt. No entry was gained and no property was reported stolen or damaged.
- 10/08/12: A 38-year-old Clifton resident was charged with unregistered, uninsured & false plates' offences after being intercepted by police while driving along Forde Street in a Ford Falcon sedan.

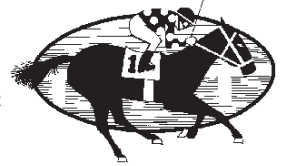

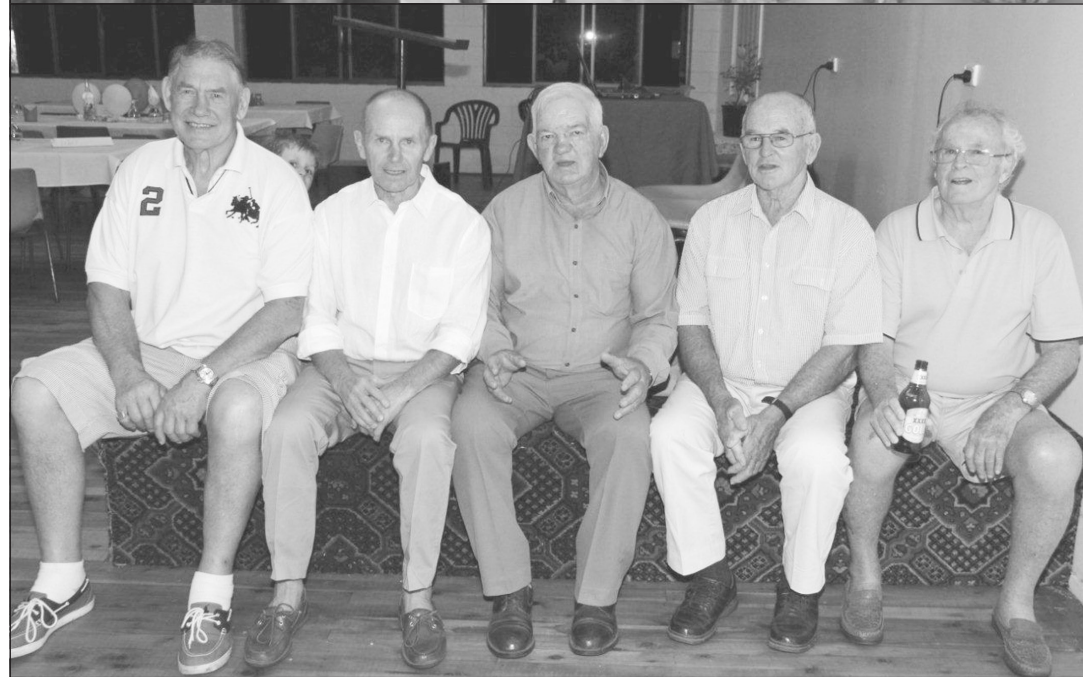
The Mayor, Cr Peter Blundell will open the Forum on Saturday morning and welcome all the young people attending.

footballers, including Barry Muir, Dennis Manteit, Les Johns, Earl Harrison, Jimmy Payne, Noel Cavanagh, Frank Drake and Ray Laird, joining with John in the celebrations.

John's footballing achievements are legendary (he played at 5/8th) and include playing for Australia continuously between 1963 and 1968, play continuously for Queensland between 1961 and 1967, securing 5 premierships (two were with the Brisbane Brothers and 3 with All Whites Toowoomba) and 3 Bulimba Cups.

Completing three Kangaroo Tours (when tours were a six month duration) and playing 14 tests for his country is an achievement most can only dream of, he is known in rugby league circles as a living legend.

Barry Muir, considered by many as Australia's best halfback, made a toast "to the great, and I mean great, Johnny Gleeson". John (known locally and to his family as Jack), said he had fond memories of his days as a footballer: "Les [Johns - (considered by many as Australia's greatest fullback)] and I were roommates during my three tours overseas. During these tours I received many injuries, but I would do it all over again given the chance." A Q&A with the Australian players, hosted by famed sports writer Bernie Pramberg, was a once in a lifetime opportunity for attendees.

John's brother Trevor Gleeson gave an emotional speech outlining his lifetime of achievements and simply summing up by saying, "Jack you have been our hero and you still are." Jack's Nephew Jon Gleeson (Allora) recited a perfect rendition of a poem by Rupert McCall entitled "The Men Who Wore The 'Q'", which paid tribute to Queensland players before the days of State of Origin.

Jack said it was a magic day. "I am so proud of my family, for putting on such a great day, and I am really appreciative of everyone's efforts."

Jack said he had no idea about the party until he started getting strange phone calls from old mates saying they would be at his party, and he'd say "What party?"

Centenary of Canberra Project Seeks Allora Artists

Creative Director of the Centenary of Canberra, Robyn Archer AO, has called on artists in the Allora region to participate in one of the centenary program's key national projects, One River.

Launched on Saturday, 20 October, at the Regional Arts Australia national conference, One River is a large scale community engagement project recognising Canberra's location within the Murray Darling Basin.

A key component of the One River program is creative collaborations with artists and communities in ten locations across the five states and territories that are part of the Murray Darling Basin. Each of the 10 successful project applicants will be allocated funds of \$15,000 for the local delivery.

It's heartening that we can use the occasion of the capital's centenary year to record and disseminate these stories."

Through a range of activities, One River will bring together cultural, scientific and economic thinking about our waterways, reaching out from the national capital to connect with communities and towns along the river's path.

One River will encourage people to tell their story, to listen to others' stories and ultimately, to create a new story about our relationship with this most iconic of Australia's waterways. These collaborations will result in local presentations in the first half of 2013 and a final outcome in Canberra in late August 2013.
