

### Looking Back...

Allora's Past 75 years ago November 1937 Harvesting Accident

Adolph Imhoff, 42, farmer of Hendon, was harvesting when his right leg came into contact with the blades of a header which stripped the flesh from ankle to toe. He was taken to the Allora Hospital where 25 stitches were inserted in the wound.

### Allora's Past 100 years ago November 1912 **Passing of a Pioneer**

The funeral took place on Friday of Mr. Joseph Stay who died after an illness of several weeks. Mr. Stay had been for 20 years the town clerk of Allora, which position he resigned a few years ago, and in the carrying out of his duties Mr. Stay won the respect of all. He was born in Somersetshire, England, and had reached the age of 74 years. He came to Australia 48 years ago and had spent the last 30 years in Allora where he brought up a family of 7 sons and 3 daughters, all of whom are widely known and respected. The deceased also leaves a widow for whom much sympathy is expressed.

The funeral was represented by all classes of the community and the hearse was immediately followed by members of the Town Council who acted as pall bearers. A large number of wreathes were sent including one from the Town Council. The Rev. S. Baggaley officiated.


### Allora's Past 125 years ago November 1887 Wheat Harvest

(Donald Clark emigrated from Scotland in 1854. He came to Queensland from Victoria. and on the 13th and 14th June 1860 purchased 147 acres in five blocks to the immediate north of the town of Allora. He built the Dalrymple Hotel in the town towards the end of 1860 and probably at the same time, built a two roomed cottage on the farm, one of the first sawn timber dwellings in the district. Following the sale of his Allora property. Clark leased "Terrica" at





Levburn and had an association with Thomas Hanmer at "Talgai". The sheep advertised for sale may have been running on either of these properties. He then moved to "Merinda" at Goondiwindi before taking up "Moyness" at Yandilla where he died in 1903)



### Council awards major NDRRA contract

Southern Downs Regional Council has awarded two major contracts for the NDRRA (Natural Disaster Recovery and Relief Arrangements) Flood Restoration Project ("the Project") in relation to flood recovery roadworks to be undertaken across the region.

NDRRA funding is provided by both the Commonwealth (75%) and Queensland (25%) governments to assist local governments in the restoration of essential public assets following a disaster event. The flooding which devastated the region in December 2010 and January 2011 was declared a natural disaster event, and therefore, Council was eligible to make submissions for NDRRA grant assistance for restoration works.

Council has decided to deliver most of the construction of the restoration works via a single large contract, with a relatively small proportion of the works being delivered by day labour. The contract for the Project construct works has been awarded

to Probuild Civil (Qld) Pty Ltd (Probuild), a civil engineering contractor, in the amount of \$21,662,268 (excluding GST).

GHD Pty Ltd (GHD), an engineering, architecture and environmental consulting company, has been engaged to provide the Project consultancy services for an estimated amount of \$1,091,387.00 (excluding GST). GHD will undertake the contract superintendent role and will supervise and administer the contract for construct works on Council's behalf. "The awarding of these contracts has been a long process with Council being required to send submissions to the Qld Reconstruction Authority for approval to carry out the works under the NDRRA," said the Mayor, Cr Peter Blundell.

"We are extremely pleased that the costs of the Project have been approved for funding."

NDRRA funding will cover the entire cost of the Project. As a condition of funding works are required to be completed by 30 June 2013.

"The Project will cover works to 735 roads at 5.516 sites across the Region, which is a massive undertaking," the Mayor advised.

"The program for the works is currently being developed and Council will provide residents with information about when and where these works will happen when the program has been finalised," the Mayor said.

Works are expected to commence in late November 2012.


