Looking Back...

Yankee Gully Road

Yankee Gully: even the name conjures questions. Was it named after an American? Was he a gold miner, bullocky, drover? What did he do to have a gully name after him? The road holds a wealth of history. Joining the present settlements Hendon and Pratten, it follows the route used by bullockies and teamsters in the 1840's and 1850's from the crossing over Dalrymple Creek at the site of the future township of Allora to the properties in the south west. At the height of activity on the Talgai goldfields in the 1860's it would have been a well used road. With the building of the railway to Hendon in 1869 it was the route of the telegraph line from Hendon to Goondiwindi, and before the rail line was extended to Warwick, the route of the mail service to Pratten and beyond.

One of the most interesting features on the road is the sandstone cutting about 5 kilometres from the Hendon end. It is about 150 metres long and about 3 metres deep and is reputed to have been built by convict labour. If this is so, it would date from the 1850's when the last convicts were transported to Moreton Bay. The marks of the hand drills can still be seen on the cutting face.

Just to the west of the cutting, on private property about 60 metres from the road. can be found a small marked grave. Narelle Henry of Massie, who has done some research into it, says that it is believed to be the grave of a four year old boy called Tommy Mole, the son of drovers passing through the area. The death may not have been registered because the first death of a Thomas Mole in Queensland was in 1906. The first registered death of a child with the surname Mole was an un-named male in 1859. He may not be connected to the

Yankee Gully grave, but it is interesting to note from the Queensland records that he was the son of Frederick and Mary Jane Mole. There were thirteen births registered to this couple from 1850 to 1880. During the same period there were eight deaths, including four in the one year (1878)

Further to west of the grave site, a large mound of dirt can be seen on private property close to the road. This is reputed to surround a 300 feet deep well dug by Chinese market gardeners with gardens adjoining the site. The vegetables may have been grown to supply miners on the goldfields.

With stories of a brewery operating in the area and caves that supplied shelter to bushrangers, it is a pity that more of the history of the area was not recorded before it was lost. If anyone has any further information about the area please contact a Historical Society member. Thank you to Trevor Shields for giving me a guided tour of the road.

"The signs are part of Council's commitment to keeping the community informed about the projects which Council is undertaking," advised Michael Bell, Manager Parks and Major


"This is all about educating the community on what Council is delivering on the Community Plan and supporting the strategies within the plan." Mr Bell said.

Don't forget to be Waterwise!

The recent hot weather has caused a rise in water usage and Council would like to remind residents of the permanent water restrictions which are in place for the Southern Downs.

The permanent restrictions allow for domestic premises to use water outdoors for 3 days a week, before 10am in the morning and after 4pm in the afternoon. This usage is based on your house number.

For houses with an odd number or no house number your days are Sunday. Tuesday and Thursday.

For houses with even numbers your days are Saturday, Monday and Wednesday.

The Southern Downs Regional Council has adopted these water conservation measures as part of its ongoing commitment to being Waterwise. These restrictions apply to all towns in the Southern Downs Region with a reticulated water supply.

Council's Drought Management Plan contains four levels of restrictions: permanent water conservation measures, medium, high and extreme restriction levels. Permanent water conservation measures are currently in force and will be in force even when water supplies are plentiful.

"Maintaining permanent water conservation measures will be an ongoing reminder to residents and businesses alike to use water efficiently at all times," said Peter See, Council's Director Engineering Services.

"Council is committed to managing water effectively and efficiently so that we are prepared should drought conditions return to the region," said Mr See.

Certain work defined as building work' in the BSA legislation may only be undertaken by licensed contractors or, if úndertaken by unlicensed contractors, only to the value of \$3,300. However, work falling outside of that definition may be performed by unlicensed contractors and is not subject to any value limit. To check whether a contractor holds a BSA licence visit www.bsa.qld.gov.au or call the BSA on 1300 272 272.


