

Strong Enquiry in Warwick's Axis Industrial Park

According to Warwick based Economic Development Officer, Nick Edols, enquiries from companies seeking to set up manufacturing, warehousing and or transport and logistics' operations in Warwick's Axis Industrial Park have been very strong over the last six months.

Axis contains nearly all of the serviced industrial land that is presently available in the Warwick area. The Council's Economic Development Unit has been working closely with the owner of the park, Dave Cooke and his collaborators, in facilitating interest, and follow-up activity associated with the enquiries.

While a number of sales of industrial blocks have occurred to date, the rate and depth of enquiry and interest has been strong enough to raise expectations that in 2013, Axis Industrial Park will see a number of new players set up business. Indeed, highly experienced local Warwick agent Rob Koremans believes that within five years the park may well have reached near full capacity with more than 20 businesses operating in the industrial park. This is really interesting In terms of future employment growth for the town.

Nick Edols says this surge in interest is not surprising as this industrial land situated close to Warwick has a number of competitive advantages. The cost of the serviced land at Axis is typically around \$65 per square metre, less than half the cost of some competing industrial parks in neighbouring regions. When you couple this cost factor with Warwick's strategic




location on two major highways, its 2 hour proximity to Brisbane, its stable workforce, the park's ability to operate 24/7 (in a large part of the estate), Warwick's quality lifestyle and good value housing, then the growing interest in this industrial estate is understandable.


At Axis Industrial Park it's all about meeting individual requirements. In situations where companies are not wishing to purchase property and undertake construction, the developer in most circumstances is prepared to construct a custom built facility and lease to the investor. Also, blocks can be amalgamated or split to ensure they fit the investor's current and future industrial land area requirements.

Feedback from potential investors includes a further positive note in that Axis is located on sandstone not black alluvial country. This leads to significant cost savings in construction of foundations and concrete slabs.

The Chief Executive Officer of Southern Downs Regional Council, Andrew Roach sees Axis Industrial Park as being very important for the future of the local economy and community of Southern Downs and looks forward to seeing Council invigorating and steering its investment attraction activities to help realise the expectation of a new and thriving industrial precinct.



Wheat Deliveries

Deliveries to the various wheat depots in the Allora area this year will constitute a record for the district. It is expected that total deliveries will be about 135,000 bags, as compared with the previous





record of 120,000 bags. The total at the Allora depot is expected to be at least 60,000 bags compared to 33,000 last year. The Ellinthorp shed is full and a dump has been commenced, about 36,000 bags are expected. Last year the total was 12,000. Considering the adverse season, the quality of the wheat throughout the district is surprisingly good, being 80% to 90% milling wheat. Last year the grade was nearly all Q1. This year rust affected the wheat in all parts of the district.
