Historical Society Highlight Local History

With the title in mind, 'The Best Little Town on the Downs', up Allora way we happily admit we are not one of your bigger communities in this southern end of Queensland when it comes population and physical size. But when you start talking history the little town on the banks of Dalrymple Creek punches well above its weight. In 1884 the first fossil evidence of early human occupation in the Allora area, the Talgai skull, was found on Talgai station, embedded in the wall of Dalrymple Creek, with radiocarbon dating suggesting the famous skull is between 9,000 and 11,000 years old.

Following European settlement, the history of the Allora area is entwined with two famous pastoral homesteads in the vicinity, being Glengallan and Talgai. The original 'Talgai' run was taken up by E.E. Dalrymple in 1840, the creek that runs through Allora named in his honour. Talgai homestead itself stood on 300,000 acres & was built in 1868.

That's yet a smear of the history the Allora area boasts, but thankfully the history that has been bred in the area is being maintained for current & future generations by the determination and dedication of the Allora & District Historical Society. In October 2011 the Historical Society brought history to the community with their inaugural 'Display & Demonstration Day' within the more than a century old former Allora Shire Hall (now museum) and it's surrounds. After that event, Society President Mr. Allan Darr couldn't have been happier with the outcome which was

the culmination of many months of preparation by his hard working committee.

Well for all of those that experienced history that day, it's on





Night works on Cunningham Highway (Albion Street), Warwick

The Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR) advises night works on sections of Albion Street, between the Alice Street intersection and Wood Street intersection has started this week.

These emergency flood repair works involve milling and filling, road surface repairs and resurfacing works.

Works are being carried out from Monday to Friday between 5.00pm and 6.00am to reduce traffic delays and maximise safety for the travelling public and roadworkers.

Due to the nature of this work, some increase in noise and dust levels can be expected during these operations.

All efforts will be made to maintain access to properties and businesses during the project, however some interruptions may be experienced.

Changed traffic conditions include reduced speed limits, lane closures and traffic control.

The Allora Historical Society is holding a Demonstration & Display Day with the theme of The Dairy Industry on 20th April 2013. The following is from a series of articles telling the story of the Dairy Industry in the Allora district each week...

Shooter's dairy **built 1950**

Les and Madge Shooter came to farm at Victoria Hill in 1933. There was an old hand built dairy on the farm which is situated on the Dalrymple Creek.There would have been a small herd of cows and some pigs to use the separated milk. Madge kept a diary of daily life on the farm. Like many other farmer's wives, Madge often did the milking while Les was working the farm planting grain crops for the cows and pigs. In the earlier days Cyril Shooter picked up the cream.



Madge records in her diary that a new dairy was built in 1950.

Local timber was taken to Geck's sawmill to be sawn for the

new building. The neighbours from the surrounding district came to help with the construction of the three bail dairy with an engine and separator room and with a concrete floor. Mr Bertram came to install the new milking machine. The Shooters milked 16 to 18 cows at this time and the cream was picked up by Bill Hansen. Another interesting entry tells of a pig being slaughtered on the farm and shared among the neighbours. Next time that there was a pig killed it would be by another neighbour and shared around.

The old dairy although now 63 years old is in very good order. The doors to release the cows after milking still work and the timber is in good condition. Two old wooden stumps still remain and one can picture the Shooter family sitting on them changing the cups. An old broom and shovel lean against the wall and the old Lister Cream Separator still sits on the stand to complete the scene.




Swimming Club Achievers Recognised
