


great array of communication equipment and research on display is still there to be seen today. The display was made possible by an \$80,000 Federation Grant shared among eight small Southern Queensland museums. Historical Society President at the time Mrs. Olive Shooter hailed the day as a great success.

An added attraction and particular highlight of the upcoming second Historical Society 'Display & Demonstration Day' will be the attendance of at least twenty motor cars manufactured before the First World War ended in 1918. The treasured vehicles and their owners will be taking part in the Veteran Car Club of Australia's Allora Veteran Car Rally hosted by the clubs Queensland branch and organised by club members and Allora residents Doug & Elizabeth Partington. The oldest cars date from pre 1905 and will make an impressive addition to the Allora Historical Society's 'Display & Demonstration Day'. The cars and their owners will be in Allora for four days and will visit many local attractions travelling very slowly on the regions many interesting back roads and byways. A full Rally program will be released in the near future, but locals and visitors alike are urged to see the display of cars with their crews in period costume at the 'Display & Demonstration Day' at Allora's historic old Shire Chambers. Among the line-up of veteran cars there will be interstate entries and models from all corners of the alobe.

To refresh everyone's memories, along with the Veteran Car Club of Australia's Rally, the coming Allora Historical Society 'Display & Demonstration Day' will feature restored working demonstrations of the dairy industry, farming equipment, country music, spinners & weavers, an animal nursery & fashion parade, all set in an atmosphere of yesteryear and period dress. Those attending can enjoy a liberal splash of Aussie tradition in billy tea and a slab of bush damper and syrup to gnaw on while catching up with a yarn about old times. A host of stalls will catch the eye with an array including magazines, music, clothing, plants, dolls, giftware, woodwork, homemade cooking and much more, such as Olive Shooter's butter making display. Along with all there is to experience as Allora steps back in time, be sure to take in the 'Allora Calling, Go Ahead Please' display.

Students Embark on Western Front

The 'Western Front' battlefields of World War I, France, beckon the Pipes and Drums and the choir of the SCOTS PGC College Warwick as they prepare for a journey of a lifetime.

The students, along with the Symphonic Band of Faith Lutheran College, Redlands, and the Sydney Male Choir, will travel to France in April to provide musical support for the Anzac Day commemorative services, including the Dawn Service at the Australian National Memorial, Villers-Bretonneux.

The Anzac Day ceremonies are one element of a musical tour arranged by Angas Travel for bands and choirs. Other elements include concerts and other performances in the Somme area, Flanders and in Paris.

Members of The SCOTS PGC College Choir and Pipes and Drums are busily trying to fit rehearsals into their already hectic schedule.

Choir Instructor, Mrs Wendy Whittaker said if the rehearsal is anything to go by, the actual Anzac commemoration will be truly impressive. "We travelled to Faith Lutheran College in February to meet the other groups performing at the Anzac Day Dawn Service and participated in the only Australian based rehearsal," Mrs Whittaker said.

"There will be 38 singers in a party of around 70 travellers from the Sydney Male Choir, with ages ranging from thirty to over eighty. Age is no barrier when the four-part choir starts singing joined by 20 choristers from SCOTS PGC, along with 30



members of the Faith Lutheran College Concert Band as well as SCOTS PGC pipers and drummers to create a sensational sound which impressed all who witnessed the event," she said.

"The groups will perform hymns as well as the Australian and French national anthems at the Dawn Service, as well as giving further performances at locations around France and Belgium, including the Arc de Triomphe, Eglise de la Madeleine and Menin Gate," Mrs Whittaker said.

Secretary of the Sydney Male Choir, Mr Tom Coghlan, said going to Brisbane to rehearse with the young musicians from Faith Lutheran College, and the pipers and singers of SCOTS College, Warwick was a great experience. "We look forward to being with them in a number of events in France in April. Age will be no barrier when we make music," he said.

The Hon Bruce Scott (MP),

Member for Maranoa, visited SCOTS and heard the students perform before addressing those embarking on the tour. Mr Scott spoke about the enormity of the sacrifice made by Australian service men and women in the battlefields of France and the honour that has been given to the College students to represent their state and their nation at the commemorations. "It was a great honour to have students from my electorate play a part in these historic services," Mr Scott said. "The students will be great ambassadors for young people and Australians and their journey will be a life-changing experience."

Year 11 student, Amelia Cowley is a member of the choir. "It will be an amazing experience in that we will be faced with the full aftermath of the war".

"When we see the rows of headstones I think this will be a



defining moment in my life," Amelia said.

To assist with the tour, Warwick RSL sub-branch facilitated a grant of \$9427.20 towards expenses. Sub-branch secretary Gordon Neilson said it was a trip that would stay with the students forever and a tremendous life experience.

The official Anzac Day Dawn Service in France starts at 5.30am sharp, Thursday, 25 April 2013 and can be seen by live broadcast to Australia on the ABC at 1.30pm AEST.

Looking Back... PADDY PERKINS

The aborigine known to the European settlers as Paddy Perkins was not from Allora but was well known in the district, indeed all over the Downs. We will never know his real name, but Paddy Perkins was appropriate because of his liking of the product produced by the company owned by a man of the same name. Early newspapers contain several reports of Paddy's being before the courts for over indulgence. In this regard he would have been no different than many of the men he worked with in the shearing sheds.

There appears to have two aborigines who went under the name "Paddy Perkins" and some exploits have been attributed to both men. Spencer Briggs, who would have known Paddy, said that he used to shear regularly in the Goomburra shed and could put up a decent tally. George Anderson, who spent his working life at Deacon & Co. and died in 1978 at the age of 90, could remember as a boy seeing Paddy shearing at Goomburra.

In his younger days Paddy had been a member of the native police and was reputed to have been an excellent tracker. He was apparently the first tracker called following the "Gatton Murders" in 1898, but because the public had been allowed to walk over the site Paddy found it impossible to track the murderer. In the same year one of the tasks that he was given was to escort thirteen aborigines by train from Warwick to Brisbane where they were placed under the control of the Protector of Aborigines. These people apparently represented the last of the original inhabitants of

Spencer Briggs says that there was certainly a bit of the Irishman about Paddy, besides his first name. He said that if he had not exactly kissed the blarney stone, he had done the next best thing. Paddy and his wife Emma had a daughter who they named Amelia Grace. When the time came for her to be baptised they took her along to the Catholic priest. After the ceremony he slipped two half-crowns into Paddy's hand for her. No sooner had the parents gotten into the street when Paddy decided to take the child to the Church of England minister. Upon leaving, the Reverend gentleman handed Paddy two florins for the baby. Paddy knew that he was on to a good thing so they took the child to see the Presbyterian minister. Following yet another baptism he handed Paddy half a crown. Naming another clergyman, Paddy and his wife called on him. After the ceremony Paddy waited for him to put his hand in his pocket but alas! After being congratulated on having the baby baptised and been given advice on her welfare, they left empty

handed. Paddy remarked to Emma that he was a mean b.....

In 1891 Paddy got into a dispute with a man at the Hendon railway station. The fight ended when Paddy hit his opponent over the head with a hardwood batten. Not realizing the seriousness of his condition, bystanders sent for medical help. Dr. Pain not being available, the man was attended to by Mr. Player the chemist. In the meanwhile the train to Toowoomba had arrived at Hendon and Paddy had availed himself of the circumstances and had left the scene. Upon being examined by Dr. Pain the next day the man was immediately despatched to the Warwick hospital.

Spencer Briggs said that the last time that Paddy was seen in the Allora district, he and his wife and daughter were trudging through the mud to Hendon. He was lightening the situation by singing "Wait for the Wagon".

Paddy Perkins died at Hodgson Creek near Toowoomba in 1919.

"Robbie Moore brings a tonne of experience, he is a good leader, great talker and has plenty of pace" according to Coach Duggan.


Cricketers Celebrate Season Success
