Fred debuted for Queensland against New South Wales in 1927 eventually wearing the maroon State colours in 32 matches. Fred, who played six test matches for Australia, also headed to Britain on two Kangaroo tours, an exceptional feat, in 1929-30 and 1933-34. Colin Laws debuted for Queensland in 1928, running on in twelve matches for his state across his playing career.

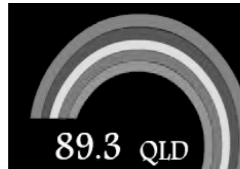

"Under the State Government's Waste Reduction and Recycling Act 2011 Council is required to prepare a Waste Reduction and Recycling plan," advised Southern Downs Regional Council Mayor, Peter Blundell.

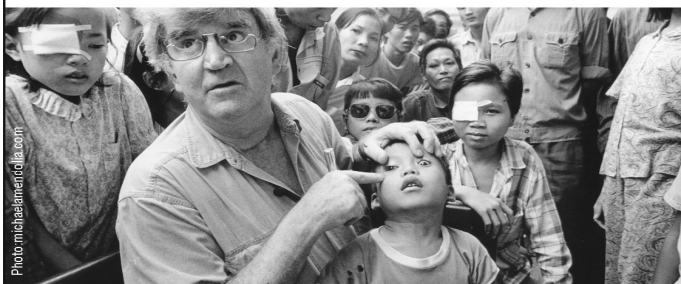
"Future adoption of the plan after public consultation will commit Council to a capital expenditure of approximately 15 million dollars and significant staff time over the ten year period," the Mayor said.

**Looking Back...**

**Allora's Past 25 years ago June 1988**

**Andy Carney**

Well known former Allora and Warwick businessman, Andrew Birdwood Carney, died at Bribie Island on the 3rd June 1988. Andy Carney was born at Allora on the 14th May 1920 and started work at the Warwick Co-operative Society's Allora store in 1935. He left to join the A. I. F. in 1941 and served in New Guinea and the Solomon Islands. Andy married Malveen Horton of Spring Creek in St. David's Church in 1942. He returned to the Co-op store on his discharge from the army. In 1949 he formed a partnership with Norm Fiechtner and Dick Hansen and bought Allora Motors, conducting a very successful business until its sale in 1960. Andy then started Andy Carney's T. V., Radio and Electrical in Allora before expanding to Warwick. Ill health caused the sale of the business in 1965. Andy Carney was a keen sportsman in his younger days, and served many organizations in later life including the Bowls Club, Lions Club, R. S. L. and Masonic Lodge. He was survived by his wife Malveen, sons Ross, Keith and Neil and daughter Ann.

**Allora's Past 100 years June 1913 Licensing Court**

At the Allora Licensing Court, Police Magistrate Mr. J. S. Berge went into the matter of the Annual Assessments of the Allora and district hotels as required under the new Liquor Act. The assessments are required in order to set the annual license fee and Mr. Berge

inquired carefully into the details of the individual cases. He compared the material contained in the inspector's report with the personal statements of the licensees, taking into consideration weekly rental, price paid as a premium, rates, taxes etc. At the conclusion of his investigations he announced his estimations of the annual value of the local hotels as follows:

### Apply for Pensioner Rebate Subsidy Scheme by 21 June

Southern Downs Regional Council is reminding eligible pensioners that they must apply by 21 June 2013 to be eligible for the Pensioner Rebate Subsidy Scheme for the 2013-2014 financial year's rates.

The Queensland Government's Pensioner Rate Subsidy Scheme provides a subsidy of 20 per cent (up to a maximum amount of \$200 each year) of the gross rates and charges levied by Council.

"Pensioners should note that even if they already receive the rebate, they will need to reapply if they have moved since their last rates notice," said CEO Andrew Roach.

"If you currently receive the rebate and your details haven't changed since last year, you do not need to reapply."

Council administers the scheme and the Department of Communities reimburses the Council.

To apply simply call into Council and one of our friendly Community Contact Officers will assist you with the application. Don't forget to bring in your eligible pension card, which needs to be sighted by a Council officer.

To be eligible you must hold a current State Government Pension Concession Card issued by Centrelink or a Repatriation Health Card for All Concessions (Gold Card) issued by Department of Veteran Affairs.

## Horticultural Production report for Southern Downs Region released

A report into Horticultural Production in Qld's Southern Downs Region, commissioned by the Economic Development Unit of the Southern Downs Regional Council (SDRC), was presented last Thursday by Stephen Tancred, Senior Horticultural Consultant from Orchard Services, Stanthorpe. The report was prepared by Stephen Tancred and Clinton McGrath, Senior Extension Officer with Qld Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry, Toowoomba.

Horticultural is a large part of the economy of the Southern Downs Region. It requires significant inputs, is labour intensive and a wide diversity of horticultural crop are grown.

"Accurate and current horticultural statistics are a vital tool for Regional Councils to plan and allocate resources and interact with State and Federal agencies," Mr Tancred advised.

"This report will also provide a resource for a whole range of agencies and consultants conducting future investigations in the region," he said.

The report details the 4,210 hectares of production by 277 horticultural producers in the Southern Downs Region that is valued at \$299.86 M at the wholesale level.

The report provides detailed information on the following:

- Value of production for the region
- Variety of production, including specialist crops
- Strategic role of the region's production nationally
- Need to understand our production and primary industries as a basis to identify potential value adding, expansion and innovative opportunities

The vegetable industry is the largest industry by area and value with 2,095 hectares of vegetables grown, with 85% of this area comprising brassicas, lettuce, beans, fresh cut baby leaf, tomatoes, capsicums and heavy vegetables.

There are 1,446 hectares of orchard crops grown, with the main being apples, followed by stonefruit, with some small areas of pears, persimmons, figs and olives making up the balance.

Some 481 hectares of wine grapes and 23 hectares of table grapes are grown in the Region by some 97 producers.

"This report will provide Council with an improved understanding of the scale and scope of the Region's agricultural industries," said SDRC's Mayor, Cr Peter Blundell.

"This important research fills in some of the gaps in our knowledge and assists us to understand the important contribution the industry makes regionally and our strategic role in domestic food production," explained the Mayor.

"Having this information will also assist Council in our negotiations with State and Federal government and will provide us with a strong basis for identifying opportunities for value adding and investment attraction," the Mayor added.

new government, it is time for a new focus on the problem." "Litter messages need to be continuous and on-going," Burnett said.

"A strong media campaign could be paid for through litter fines. A whole generation of young people have missed out on litter messages, and they are now driving cars, and throwing rubbish onto our roads.

"We have also seen an explosion in fast-food outlets in that time - with the same young people the biggest fast-food customers, and fast-food packaging is our biggest litter problem.

(McDonalds packaging is the biggest single brand counted in the Australian Branded Litter Study for 2012/13)

"It is all connected and it needs co-ordinated action and more funding to lift Queensland to a cleaner level," Burnett said.

Queensland towns are invited to enter the 2013 Tidy Towns competition and show off their commitment to litter prevention, recycling and energy conservation, highlighting their standards of "clean and tidy".

However, work falling outside of that definition may be performed by unlicensed contractors and is not subject to any value limit.
