New facilities for Pittsworth and Clifton

Funding has been allocated to commence the replacement ambulance station and relief quarters at Pittsworth and to complete the replacement auxiliary fire and rescue station at Clifton.

Police and Community Safety Minister Jack Dempsey said in 2013-14, more than \$1 million would be spent on the Darling Downs projects.

"The replacement ambulance station and relief quarters at Pittsworth will ensure paramedics have the best equipment available to help them respond to local emergencies," Mr Dempsey said.

"Meanwhile, the replacement of the auxiliary fire and rescue station at Clifton will support local officers in their efforts to deliver quality services for the community.

"The works are just a fraction of the combined \$97.9 million the Newman Government plans to spend on ambulance stations and vehicles, fire and rescue facilities, urban and rural fire appliances, and other equipment over the 2013-14 financial year.

"We are working hard to ensure frontline staff are not saddled with out-of-date facilities and have what they need.

"Queenslanders deserve to have the best emergency services available and these upgrades will help ensure staff have the support to continue to provide outstanding services to the community."

Looking Back...

Old Bottles Found

Last week a collection of old bottles were uncovered in the back room of the Allora Advertiser where the floor boards had been lifted for renovations. The building that now houses the Advertiser was probably built by Joe Sharpe when he built the Central Hall in 1916. It was opened as the Central Cafe by Mrs. J. Middleton in 1923. The cafe passed through several well known hands including those of George Forster, Bill Masters, George Cunnington and the Frank Stewart family before it was bought by Nev. Hammond to house the Allora Advertiser in 1951.

One of the bottles in the find was a brown glass bottle with a partial label still attached which indicated that the contents were bottled in Allora. It may have possibly been a soft drink bottle, bottled by A. L. Ruhle & Co. at his factory at 86 Herbert Street in the late 1940's.

Soft drinks had been bottled in Allora since April 1890 when W. G. Gillam opened his steam driven aerated water, cordial and vinegar

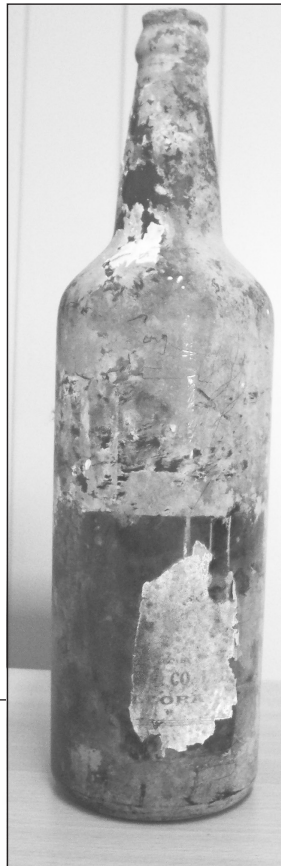
manufacturing business in Forde Street. In 1894 he added pink lemonade to his range and called it "W. G." after the famous English cricketer, W. G. Grace. The business was sold to Isaac and Esau Holmes in 1895. Gillam's bottles were embossed with his name and are collector's items today.

By 1900 Esau Holmes operated the business from a building in Drayton Street where White's Garage is situated today. A 1 1/2 hp Campbell oil engine was purchased in February 1902 to replace the horse works that had previously driven the plant. Esau Holmes sold the business in May 1902, possibly to P. Flynn who in turn sold to Wright & Wightman in July 1902. Stewart & Nicholson advertised opening up a new aerated water and cordial business in Drayton Street in November 1902.

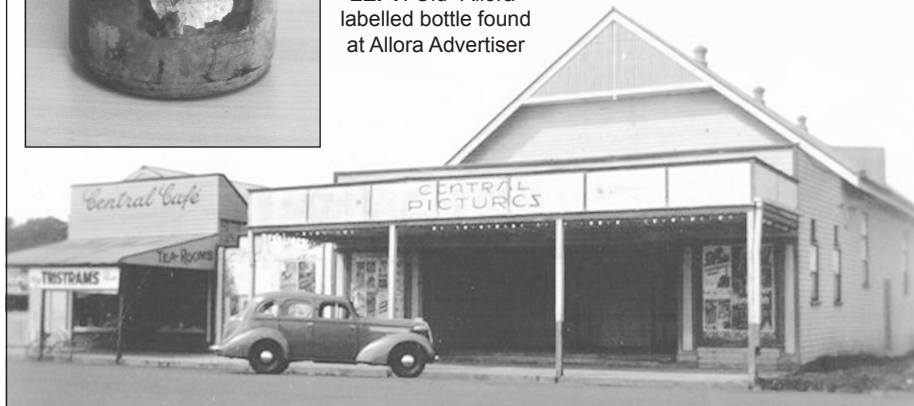
Christmas time seemed to be the optimum time for opening soft drink factories, and J. O'Dwyer opened a new factory on the corner of Raff and Warwick Streets in December 1905. He left the obligatory samples of his wares at the Allora Guardian office for comment. W. Harmer bought out J. O'Dwyer in 1907 and along with the usual flavours he added such things as Clarade, Kola Champagne, Cherry Cider, Thrum, Chilli Rum and Tickla to his range. The business was sold to Cantwell & Kelly in 1919 and passed through the hands of Joe Whitton senior, to Gus Kaiser who moved the plant to Forde Street.

D. J. Ruhle opened a new cordial factory in the old Allora Guardian building in Herbert Street in the early 1930's. In 1934 this was sold to A. L. Ruhle who operated the business until it was sold to L. K. & E. F. Jensen, trading as Allora Aerated Waters, in 1950. Mick Larkin took over the factory in 1957 and in turn sold, in February 1960, to A. L. Ruhle, at that time trading as Warwick Aerated Waters. By then the soft drink bottling was done in Warwick.

D. J. Ruhle opened a new cordial factory in the old Allora Guardian building in Herbert Street in the early 1930's. In 1934 this was sold to A. L. Ruhle who operated the business until it was sold to L. K. & E. F. Jensen, trading as Allora Aerated Waters, in 1950. Mick Larkin took over the factory in 1957 and in turn sold, in February 1960, to A. L. Ruhle, at that time trading as Warwick Aerated Waters. By then the soft drink bottling was done in Warwick.

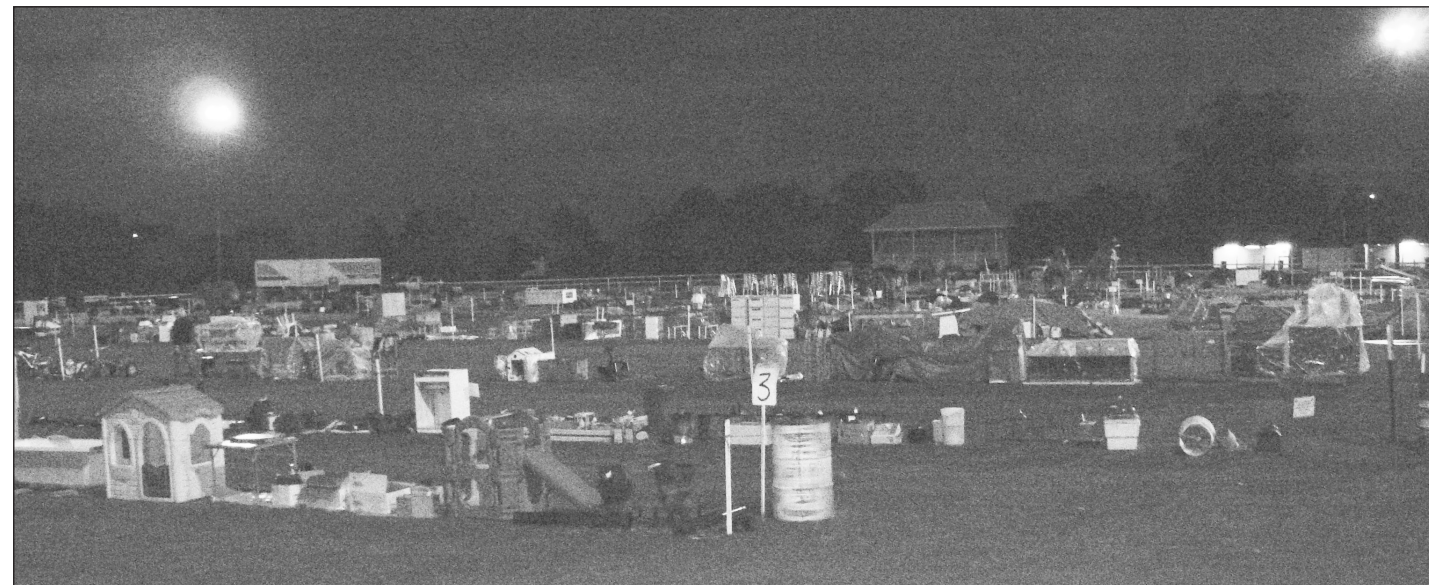

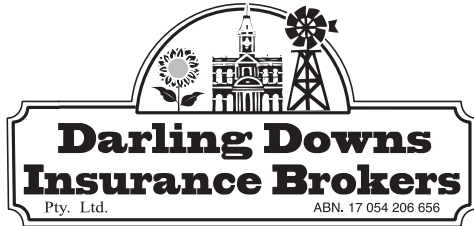

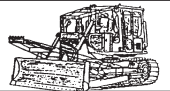
