organized by a committee of five with Mrs. Marge



New Butchers

Pat and Terrie McVeigh announced that as from Monday, 4th July, 1988, that they would be taking over the butchery and fruit and vegetable business previously operated by Len & Mrs. Batterham and Neil at 50 and 52 Herbert Street.

Len Batterham started in business in Allora in January 1953 when he leased the butchery at No. 68 Herbert Street from Mangan's. In March 1956 he took over the butcher shop at No. 52 from "Paddy" Ryan and operated both shops until January 1957. After relinquishing the lease of No. 68 he traded at No. 52 until he leased the shop to Keith Anderson in May 1970. After five years on the farm to the north of the town, Len and Neil again took over the butchery and traded as Allora Meat Supply until the sale to Pat and Terrie McVeigh.





Interrupted Studies

Mr. Harold C. Pain, son of Dr. F. Pain of Allora, who has been pursuing medical studies at Edinburgh University, has found the rigors of the Scottish climate rather too trying and has returned to Australia. He is at present in Allora and is studying for his approaching examinations at Sydney University where he proposes to resume a career temporarily interrupted by a slight breakdown in health.

studies were further interrupted in September 1914 when he enlisted in the A. I. F. and was posted to the Australian Medical Corps, serving at the 1st Australian Casualty Clearing Station at Gallipoli. He was serving at the time of the evacuation and was transferred to the 1st General Hospital at Heliopolis, before returning to Australia in 1916 to resume his medical studies. In March 1917 he re-enlisted, serving as an artillery gunner in France, and after the armistice, with the Service Corps in Germany. Following his marriage in Australia in 1920 he returned to Edinburgh University to complete his medical studies. 1925 saw him studying for his Law degree at the same university so he must have realized that medicine was not his thing.)





Flood reconstruction works on the Drayton Connection Road



Warriors Topple Ladder Leaders

Talented halfback Matt Duggan was the key to Wattles sensational 50 – 28 victory over top of the table outfit the Gatton 'Hawks' on Saturday evening at Platz Oval, further cementing the Green & Gold 'Warriors' in

third place in the hotly contested top five rungs of the Toowoomba Rugby League ladder.

Wattles winger Tim Hentschel was on hand to score three of the nine tries his side claimed in what was possibly the 'Warriors' most important victory of the 2013 season so far. The former South West 'Mustangs' open age finisher broke the second half points seal after just two minutes of play to cruise in for his initial four-pointer, cashing in again in the 57th and 65th minute to complete his hat trick, his final effort after running down a Brenden Wilson kick was a gem. Hentschel debuted in first grade for Wattles in the final fixture match of the 2003 season, his career honours including winning the Toowoomba Rugby League's prestigious Frank Purcell Memorial Trophy, as Best & Fairest Player in All Grades for the 2003 season. That same season saw him top the try tally in Under 18 with an impressive 29 touchdowns. A decade later he is well in contention for try scoring awards, currently boasting a total of fourteen tries from twelve matches.

Gatton's Stanthorpe based representative halfback Jason Wilmot crossed for the first points of the match after just three minutes of play for the 'Hawks' to lead 6 - 0, but the 'Warriors' kicked into gear and ran in three unanswered tries to lead 18 - 6 at the 21 minute mark.

Centre Brenden Wilson and winger Robbie Moore scored for
