### Scout project marks Browns Falls route

Southern Downs Regional Council celebrated a unique project to mark the best route to reach Browns Falls at Killarney. Venturer Scout Scott See worked with Council's Parks Coordinator John Newley to carry out the project as part of Scott's work towards obtaining the Queen's Scout award.

Over a period of four weekends, Scott helped by other scouts from the Heights Glennie Scout Group worked on marking the best route to reach Browns Falls. He marked the route one weekend, returned a weekend second (only to be flooded out), tweaked the route on a third weekend and then, finally, marked the route with round red

plastic markers. The markers show able-bodied people the best route to follow along the creek.

"There is no constructed footpath in this area and prior to marking the route it was possible to get disorientated or, in a worse case, to be injured, as happened to a parent on a scout excursion some years ago," explained David Tuxford, Director Business & Community Services.

"Our thanks go to Scott and the scouts, who have done a fantastic job on this very worthwhile project. Council was very pleased to be able to assist them in their efforts," Mr Tuxford added.

A sign showing the markers and explaining how to get to the falls will be in place on the pathway. Council provided the sign and the markers and Scott and other scouts carried out the work.

#### Blazing bonfires, decorated fire drums and fireworks warm winter: Winter in Killarney Bonfire Night at Warwick Jumpers and Jazz Festival

Fancy sipping mulled wine or a citrus hot toddy by the warmth of a fire breathing dragon or flaming echidna? Or, possibly a 10 foot tall fiery Ned Kelly? Love a bit of fire or need to re-connect with your inner pyromania? Winter in Killarney Bonfire Night is for you!

The rapidly-growing-in-fame Winter in Killarney Bonfire Night, part of Warwick's iconic Jumpers and Jazz in July Festival, will fire up winter on this Saturday, 20 July 2013 at the Killarney Polocrosse Fields, cnr Acacia and Willow Street, Killarney.

It's a winter get-together that warns away the chills thanks to a giant pine bonfire (expertly lit and supervised by the rural fire brigade), around 20 creatively decorated fire drums (otherwise known as 44 gallon drums), fireworks, music and some warm winter cuisine including damper and stew, pumpkin soup and gourmet curry and sticky date pudding from local produce powerhouse, Southern Downs Harvest.

Metalworkers, amateur and professional, re-fashion the old fashioned kind of 44 gallon drum outdoor heater into functional works of art which are then lit up for the Winter in Killarney Bonfire Night celebrations.

Now in its fourth year, Winter in Killarney Bonfire Night organiser, Louise Brosnan says the idea was borne out of the popularity of Guy Fawkes Night in the UK.

"I lived for five years in the UK, where Guy Fawkes night is still a hugely popular event. While visiting Rye in East Sussex, my husband and I were swept up in the theatre of their mid-winter event, where a fiery street parade finishes with a celebratory bonfire five stories high." Ms Brosnan said.

"This sparked the idea to develop a creative project locally in the Warwick region around fire drums and now four years on, the Killarney community is immensely proud of the annual event and proud to be a part of Jumpers and Jazz in July," she said.

The fire drum exhibition consists of all shapes and forms and each year, the mix of new and old entries are judged on creativity, skill and attention to detail.

Killarney's local metal workers Jason Green and David Bishop have regularly been at the top of the leaderboard since the event began with entries such as his 2011 Green Train and 2012 Hot Rod.

There are few limits to creativity and size and Paul Graham has become well known for his large creations including a 10 foot tall Ned Kelly and a fire breathing dragon.

The centrepiece bonfire is proudly sponsored by local sawmill, Pineflex who generously donate all the pine required for the fire.

The evening includes entertainment from local band Studio Two and a children's jumping castle.

The night concludes with a huge firework display, proudly presented by Southern Downs Regional Council. Cost is \$10 per person (children under 16, FREE). Bring chairs or picnic blanket and plenty of warm clothes.




