With their 4000 km plus adventure about to unfold before them, the Happy Hippies in all their 'flower power' splendour will be joined by some fellow Great Endeavour Rally entrants in front of Allora's Railway Hotel around 9.30am today. Let's get as many supporters there as possible to see the ladies hit the road in their quest to raise 'Dust & Dollars' for the wonderful charity, the Endeavour Foundation.

The Great Endeavour Rally has become a tremendous tradition since its humble beginnings. The first Rally was in 1988 as a bicentennial project, where 37 cars participated and travelled from Toowoomba to Kooralbyn Valley via Birdsville,

HARRY GWYNNE: Soldier, Farmer, Family Man & Gentleman ...he will be missed! – By Laurie Gwynne

Harry was born on July 31st, 1920 in Allora at the Mygunyah Private Hospital which is the building sited two doors east of the old Commercial Bank building on Warwick Street. His parents owned a property called 'Naseby' about 2 km south from the Goomburra Road at Berat. He attended the Berat State School, which was a 5 km trek each way, from age five to thirteen.

Initially he walked to school with his sister Dulcie then later rode a pony three up with his sister and younger brother. He once told me that he didn't dislike school but he couldn't wait to leave and work on the family farm. He eventually left school in 1933 at Grade 7. His early working career consisted of driving horse teams, milking cows and saving five pounds to buy a pushbike. The pushbike became invaluable later in his courting days. Whilst he had known our mother all his life things took a romantic turn at the Ekka in 1938. The romance blossomed and culminated in their marrying on November 1st, 1941 in this same church. By this time he was in the army and he had a five day leave pass to marry then back to camp at Gatton. Harry was subsequently transferred to army camps at Gympie, Goomeri, Nambour and Gympie again over the next year and he told me he received a telegram whilst at Nambour advising that I was born on December 8th, 1942.

He was then shipped overseas and the next 4 years became a blur of military active service concluding with his return to Australia on News Year Eve 1946. I can vaguely remember his homecoming and wondering who this man was that has installed himself into my mothers and my lives. He probably received a chilly reception from me initially

but soon assumed the role of my loving father.

Harry moved us to a house at Deuchar, and he and his brother in law Eric Hentschel cut cord wood for the boilers at the Allora butter factory. Whilst at Deuchar Alan was born on December 18th, 1946. My Christmas present that year was a Cyclops pedal car which I insisted we take to the Allora hospital to show my mother and new brother, and where I proceeded to ride it off the veranda much to my parent’s alarm. They shouldn’t have worried, as over the following years I think every child and grandchild rode it off various verandas without any major injuries, and my grand daughters are threatening to continue the tradition.

In 1947 Harry and Mum moved the family to Talgai to a share farm which he worked until 1949.

He then moved his family back to his parent’s home property of ‘Naseby’ near Berat and started to build a house. Whilst the house was under construction Harry built a garage with a stamped earthen floor in which we lived for 18 months. Harry was very resourceful and he and his brother Tood cut the trees at Leyburn and had them milled for the house. Harry and Mum were ready to move into their new house in July 1950, a short time prior to Keith’s birth in August 1950.

As Harry’s Family continued to grow with Judy’s arrival in February 1954 he realised that there was not enough on the ‘Naseby’ property to support them all, so in 1955 he bought ‘Riverside’, and after much repair work he and Mum moved their family there in February 1957. ‘Riverside’ became the centre of Harry’s life and the future home of his and Dulcie’s family.

He continued to prosper and in 1961 he purchased the adjacent farm from Mr. Bert Erhardt for 11,750 pounds.

Harry and Dulcie became good travellers driving all over Australia. They visited Shirley and me in Darwin twice between 1972 and 1974. He told me that the cost of travelling by vehicle on those trips was approximately \$20 per 1000 km.

Between 1977 and 1979 they travelled to New Zealand, Norfolk

Island and to various cities around Australia for army reunions. In 1982 Dad and Mum travelled to the US and Canada visiting farms (forever the farmer) and agricultural facilities. This was followed by trips to Fiji and Tasmania and annual two weekly caravan trips around Queensland.

Harry and Dulcie decided to retire and in 1991 and they moved into their new house in Darling Street in Allora. As Dad described it to me, he lost his mate of 59 years when Mum passed away in 2001.

Harry found a great friendship with his neighbouring farmer Ian Shearing and over the ensuing years they enjoyed travel to some of the country’s most remote areas. As family we celebrated few birthdays with him as he and Ian spent them in remote localities. I believe they crossed the Simpson Desert five times.

Following the passing of our mother Dulcie, Ian has been a tower of strength for Harry providing the rest of the family solace in knowing that he was happy and safe.

Harry also enjoyed his travels with his family often reminiscing about the trip down the Darling River with Keith & Jill and Judy & Fred. I had the pleasure of having him accompany me on a trip to Innamincka and Cameron’s Corner in company with Keith and Jill. Dad loved nothing more than being with his family, and on two occasions we had reunions where we all camped up at the head of the Dalrymple Creek in the Goomburra Valley. I think at those camps we had 34 of his descendants and their partners present.

Harry was always heavily involved in his local community. He has been involved with the local branch of the RSL since his return from active service in 1946. Through the RSL he became actively involved in Legacy assisting widows of war veterans. He has been involved with the Allora Show Society, including being its Patron for many years. He always enjoyed his role as a steward in the cattle section.

He was also a keen competitor and active member of the local Bowls club, a tradition that is been followed by Alan and Gay.

One of his great loves that he often spoke of was his time with the Light Horse, and he was delighted when the 11th Lighthorse Warwick Montrose Troop made him their Patron.

Harry departed this world pretty much on his own terms; his last conscious hours were spent with his best friend playing Yartzee and having a quiet whiskey. He often told me that was how he wanted to go. We should celebrate the fact that we have had the company, wisdom and love of such a remarkable man for so long. He was a man who loved and was loved by all his family and friends. He leaves behind four children, nine grandchildren and fifteen great grand children. Some years ago I asked him to list the five most significant things in his life and his response was his wedding day and the birth of each of his four children.

It is interesting to have an insight into how the younger generation perceive the death of their great grandfather. Our 4 year old granddaughter when told that her much loved great grandfather had passed away said “well when he passes here I hope he stops to see us”.

I believe that he has passed by all of us and has stopped by in our hearts and will long be remembered and loved by us all.

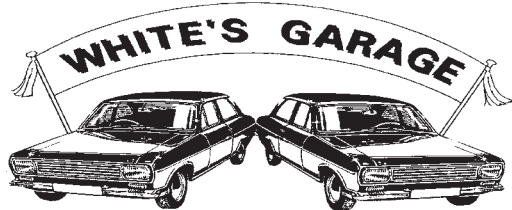
