forward, but on 26th July 2010 the Allora Medical Support Group (consisting of the seven named community members) came in to being to oversee the pursuit of the Medical Centre proposal, and manage the facility on completion on behalf of the Allora District community.

The completed facility, a project valued in total around \$800,000 and constructed by builders C.F. & J.E. Miles, will supply medical services long into the future for the Allora district. The new Medical Practice opened for business this morning with Allora elder statesmen and former Bulloo Shire Mayor Mr Stan May seeing Dr Kaye Ellis in the new facility's initial consultation.

The Allora Medical Practice will be officially opened at a function on Friday, December 6th at 5.00pm.



Allora Landcare Group activities move from the Allora Mountain to the Farm, on Friday, 8th November, with the hosting of a 'zero-till' Field Day, at the property of Rod & Vanessa McLennan at 608 Willowvale Road, Willowvale.

Rod and Vanessa have operated a zero-till Dairy Farm very successfully, for guite a few years on a mixture of sandy-loam ridge soil and black-soil flats in the Glengallan Valley. A zero-till operation, in a dairy farming situation is guite a rarity, and the Allora Landcare Group feels that this Field Day would be of great interest to both Dairy Farmers, farmers who operate grazing enterprises and people who are interested in the concept of zero-till.

A local agronomist will be in attendance to handle any enquiries on Seed, Chemical and Fertilizer.

The day will begin at the Property on Willowvale Road at 9.00am, on Friday, 8th November. Rod's Farm is 6km west, from the Eight Mile Turn-off, along Willowvale Road, and also 6km in an easterly direction, from the Massie Hall (on the Warwick Allora Back Road). See you there.

Looking Back...

Allora's Past almost 50 years ago

Reunion Anyone?

A meeting with Maria Williams (nee Cavanagh) at the "Roseneath" Open Day last weekend reminded me that it will be 50 years ago in January next year that our class was enrolled at the Allora State School to become the first year of the Allora Secondary Department. I thought that it would be great for someone with enough faculties left, to organise a small reunion. Where have all the years gone?

Allora's Past 125 years ago Neighbouring Village

Sunday last may indeed be considered a red letter day at that remote village situated about 13 miles from Allora. Clifton is a small railway terminus, nestled down on a vast plain, surrounded now by numerous settlers who obtain their livelihood from tilling the soil and stock breeding. The hamlet is sparsely populated, containing but few dwellings, one public house and two stores. This forms an outline of what Clifton consists of - exclusive of course of the neat little Roman Catholic Church, the blessing and dedication of which the masses had that day assembled to celebrate.

PHOTOS

The Historical Society has been given access to some interesting photos recently. Phyllis Shooter has lent us a photo of the Ellinthorp Railway Station. The siding to the west of Allora was built in 1878 to service the needs of George and Charles Clark, owners of the Talgai property. It was known as Clark's Crossing before, in the following year, being changed to Talgai. In 1913 the name of the station was changed to Dalrymple, but because of confusion with a station of the same name in north Queensland, the name was again changed in 1916 to Ellinthorp, the name coming from Ellinthorpe, the Clark's property in Tasmania. The station mistress was




withdrawn in 1951 and the station building removed in 1954.

We have also been given the loan of a photo album belonging to the Weber family. This comes via Denyse Back from Dalby who is a great granddaughter of Henry and Minnie Weber. The album contains many old photos of Allora dating from the 1870's. The Weber's lived at what is now 66 Forde Street. The included photo shows what the

average well dressed beekeeper was wearing in Allora in the early 1900's. The lady on the left holding the smoker is, I believe, Mrs. Sarah Williams (nee Erhardt). The lady holding the frame of honey is her cousin, Mrs. Minnie Weber. The hives were situated on the block where "The Homestead" now stands

Members assisted with the catering and enjoyed a wonderful day in the beautiful rose gardens. It was pleasing to have some many people who came from near and far also visit the museums. Research Officer Colin Newport, was especially pleased to discuss family history and receive the loan of an old photo album for copying. "Roseneath" originally was the home of Michael and Christina Erhardt. Many of their descendants visited their ancestral home and look into the old slab hut still standing in the grounds.

Don Thomas launched his family history book on the Anderson Family on Sunday at "Roseneath'. Don had used the Allora Historical Society's records in his research for the book. The result was a credit to Don. Colin wrote the foreword in the book and was happy to be of assistance as the Historical Society always benefits from the exchange of information. Don Thomas's book is available at Museum for \$25.00.

Preparations for the Demonstration and Display Day on 12th April next year are continuing. Society members have made contact with people who were involved in the timber industry in some way. We have had offers of items and photos for display. We would appreciate any assistance in the way of photos and family stories of involvement in the timber industry. Thank you to Leona & Hazel Sinton who gave us information and loaned photos of the Geck Sawmill. Research into the timber industry also embraces buildings, building contractors and carpenters and has revealed how much of the Allora business centre was rebuilt a number of times after disastrous fires. The stories will be printed in 'The Advertiser' closer to the open day.

Our next fund raising activity will be a street stall on 29th November with a raffle and money board being run in conjunction. The Historical Society members would appreciate any donations towards their stall.

Men's Sheds to receive \$150,000 online boost as new study reveals their mental and physical health benefits

Beyondblue will give a free computer and a year's internet connection to all new sheds to connect thousands of men across the country and help end social isolation.

The unprecedented pledge, which will be funded up to \$150,000 by beyondblue and is supported by Telstra, will allow all new sheds established from today to connect with other sheds and promote themselves and their activities online.

It comes as the findings of the largest Men's Shed study ever conducted in Australia are revealed, including the sheds' significant impact on members' mental and physical wellbeing and how the sheds are viewed by members as places that inspire a sense of purpose and belonging.

beyondblue Chairman Jeff Kennett AC, who will announce the funding at the Australian Men's Shed Association Biannual Conference in Golden Point, Ballarat, Victoria at 9.45am this morning, said the pledge would further the shed movement's goal to help get blokes talking to one another and improve their wellbeing.

"This new research and the fact there are almost 1000 sheds now operating across the country shows the tremendous success of the Australian Men's Shed movement," he said. "The movement is vitally important because it helps reduce loneliness and build friendships, particularly in non-metropolitan areas, and this in turn brings major mental health benefits. This financial pledge will encourage more communities to establish Men's Sheds and reap the mental health benefits they bring. It will also allow shedders to use the web to connect with other sheds via beyondblue's The Shed Online, promote their shed and use The Shed Online's resources to research any health concerns they may have."

The Men's Shed study, conducted by UltraFeedback, compared the mental wellbeing of almost 1,500 shedders with sociallyisolated non-shedders to measure the mental health benefits of social interaction.

It found:

- shedders' mean wellbeing score of 54.3 out of 70 was higher than the non-shedders' mean score of 51
- shedders scored higher on all individual measurements including confidence, clear-thinking and cheerfulness
- shedders scored higher the longer they were part of a shed, with those who had been there less than a month scoring 48.4, rising to 54.6 after a year and 55.3 after two years
- the study also compared the physical health of the two groups, with shedders again scoring higher on every measure, particularly physical functioning and vitality
- the study revealed 80% of shedders are retired, 60% agreed they're more knowledgeable about health issues since joining and 41% agreed that they can discuss issues in the shed that

they can't discuss anywhere else.

Beyondblue CEO Kate Carnell AO said the study confirmed what the Men's Shed movement had long known.

"Men often join sheds to connect with other people in their community and enjoy the benefits that come with that, and we now have hard proof that joining a shed improves lives," she said. "This research shows almost all shedders list being socially connected as the main benefit of membership, with many emphasising the importance of the shed as a place where everyone is valued equally. The study shows that this sense of acceptance leads to openness and sharing among members, which in turn fosters a sense of purpose. Many also said they joined a shed to serve the community by making and fixing things, and we can see the all-male environment promotes mateship and learning. When people are happy and have a sense of purpose and support, like they get from a Men's Shed, they are much more likely to be healthy, and that's what these results show."

Australian Men's Shed Association CEO David Helmers said the research showed what sheds had achieved in the past and the pledge to give all new sheds computers and internet connections would ensure this good work continues well into the future.

THE RISE & RISE OF MEN'S SHEDS: **AROUND THE WORLD AND BACK** AGAIN – OVERSEAS DELEGATES IN OZ

In little more than a generation, the Aussie Mens Shed phenomenon has grown into the biggest men's organisation in country - involving close to 1,000 community sheds and 125,000 people - and it is a health initiative that has been exported successfully to the world.

Every two years the Australian Mens Shed Association (AMSA) holds a National Conference, giving "Shedders" an opportunity to gather "shoulder to shoulder" to share information about their projects and ideas.

This year the Victorian Branch of AMSA is hosted the biannual conference at the Ballarat Lodge and Convention Centre, October 27-29, with a new global network set to be finalised. This year's conference was themed "A Sustainable Future" and focused on the contribution Mens Shed's make to men and their communities as a sustainable preventative health measure

The World's foremost authorities and "Shedders" alike gethered in Ballarat for the 5th National Mens Shed Conference, AMSA Executive officer David Helmers said "This year's conference follows in the wake of the success of previous events and it is the first time the conference has been held in a major regional centre.

Record numbers of delegates attended the conference. With over 250 Mens Shed's located within Victoria the conference was at the heartland of the Mens Shed movement. And this year's conference has also attracted a number of international delegates including John Evoy the CEO of Irish Mens Shed Association.

The International delegates also attended a meeting to formalise the International Affiliation of Mens Shed Associations and an organised Shed Crawl visiting a number of sheds throughout Victoria preceding the conference. Mayor Cr Peter Blundell, who will be Chair of the Board, said he believed the Futures Board was a major milestone in the development of the Southern Downs.


