Community Fund offers grants up to \$5000

Community groups can apply for grants up to \$5000 to deliver electrical safety or energy efficiency projects in regional Queensland.

Applications are now open for the second year of Ergon Energy's Community Fund with grants between \$200 and \$5000 available for individual organisations and \$50,000 in total to be shared.

Community Partnerships Manager Simone Sakzewski encouraged local not-for-profit groups to develop innovative ideas that could benefit them and inspire their local community to adopt energy efficient and electrically safe behaviours.

Examples of the sort of projects that could attract funding include those that:

- · Reduce energy consumption, particularly during the peak period between 4pm and 8pm.
- · Upgrade equipment to more energy efficient models.
- · Educate and encourage people to change the way they use energy.
- · Use or promote renewable energy alternatives (solar, wind, hydro and biomass).
- · Keep the community safe around electricity.

Looking Back...

Tony Abbott in Allora?

No, but a precedent may have been set in 1917 when Prime Minister, W. M. Hughes, addressed a crowd in front of Barnes & Co. on the corner of Herbert and Drayton Streets. The "Little Digger" was on an Australia wide tour to drum up support for the Yes vote in the Conscription Referendum. No publicity for the event appeared in the Allora Guardian but this may have been to avoid a repetition of the incident in Warwick on the 29th November, 1917, when he was pelted with rotten eggs, supposedly leading to the formation of the Commonwealth Police. The Prime Minister would have been preaching to the converted in a town where possibly more young people per head of population that any other town in Australia volunteered for war service, with forty seven names on the local memorial recording those who paid the supreme sacrifice. An anti-conscription meeting held in O'Callaghan's Hall on the 17th November, 1917, was attended by only thirteen people.


Householders Beware

Scholarship offers annual bursary for students studying ag

degrees

A Government scholarship that aims to attract school leavers into agriculture-related university degrees is now accepting applications. The Horizon Scholarship, an



initiative of the Rural Industries R&D Corporation, in partnership with industry sponsors, provides \$5,000 per year for the duration of a student's university degree.

The Horizon Scholarship also offers students annual industry work placements that give them first-hand exposure to modern agricultural practices, access to industry leaders, professional development workshops and opportunities to network and gain knowledge at a range of industry events.

RIRDC's Managing Director, Craig Burns said the Horizon Scholarship has been developed to support the next generation of agricultural leaders who will take up the challenge of farming for the future.

"We are looking for young people who are passionate about agriculture, with a keen interest in the future of our industries and who are ready to expand their networks and learn new skills," Mr Burns said.

Current Horizon Scholar, Eliza Star from Carrathool in NSW, said the Horizon Scholarship has helped build not only her networks, but her confidence as well.

"I have been involved in many activities stemming directly from the Scholarship, including participating in various workshops and conferences," Eliza said.

"I have attended various Ricegrowers' Association of Australia (RGA) meetings and events ranging from SunRice and RGA annual general meetings, to grower discussion groups and social events.

"The Scholarship is the best thing I have ever been involved in and the program allows you to get involved in such great



things. I encourage anyone who is about to start their studies to give the program a shot."

To be eligible for The Horizon Scholarship students must be entering their first year of university and studying a degree related to agriculture, such as agricultural science, rural science, livestock/animal science, veterinary science or agribusiness and plant science. Students must also have started their tertiary studies no longer than two years after leaving high school.

Scholarship recipients will be selected on the basis of their commitment to a career in agriculture, as well as their leadership potential and high school academic record. Applications close on 31 January 2014 and shortlisted applicants must be available for a telephone interview on 21 and 22 February 2014. The Scholarship winners are announced in late February 2014.
