Renowned Poet Features in Allora's History

The Toowoomba Literary Society recently visited the Allora district researching the family of internationally acclaimed poet George Essex Evans. They were hosted on an historical tour of the former Essex Evans family property by former owners Max & Margaret Phelan and former Allora resident & historian Mr. Tom McVeigh.

In 1881 four members of the Essex Evans family from Wales, consisting of two sisters and two brothers came to a property known as "Wigan" some three miles south of Allora. It was a lease of ten years from the government, having been resumed for closer settlement from Goomburra Station.

The lease was in the name of the two sisters, but when purchased as freehold ownership passed to John Evans, one of the brothers. The other brother George Essex Evans became a well known poet, with his most famous poem being "Women of the West". Evans's father, John Evans Q.C. who was a member of the British House of Commons, died in 1864 when Evans was only a few months old.

Both brothers contributed much to the development of the Queensland Public Service as senior Public Servants.

The property, now known as "Ora Downs", was visited recently by members of the Toowoomba Ladies Literary Society as part of their Centenary Celebrations, thanks to the present owners Mr. and Mrs. Chris Shaw.

Currently retired in Allora, former owners of the property Max & Marg Phelan, explained to the Society members of the history of the property from the early days until their purchase.

Mr. Phelan shared how he had been told by an old time resident of the area, the late Norm Hamill, that the first home was situated on a special area of five acres about a quarter of a mile from the present house location. The property was managed for the Essex Evans family by Mr. R. Sinton and produced seed malting and cape barley, wheat & lucerne,

along with Jersey and Ayrshire cattle, Brahma poultry and also stood a Clydesdale stallion "Glenken" for use by neighbouring

The home was sold to Mr. Bill Morris of a local farming family when the last of the Essex Evans family died in 1930. It was renowned as a showpiece, built with large rooms, high ceilings and verandahs and fireplaces, while commanding a view of the picturesque Goomburra Valley. Mr. Phelan told the visitors that he and his brother Brian, in their bachelor days were very frequent visitors to the home. Their Aunt Kitty was a renowned chef and Uncle Martin a most generous host.

The home's cellar is in immaculate condition, but recollections of what was stored there are a little to hazy.

Mrs. Phelan took the visitors on an inspection of the home explaining how it functioned in the early days, Society Members enjoying a journey into yesteryear.

The richness of Queensland's wheat harvest may be gauged from the fact that farmers in the Allora district have obtained 45 bushels per acre. The deliveries in the Allora district have been classified as Q1. The Wheat Board commenced taking deliveries at the Allora depot on November 4 and Ellinthorp, Goomburra and Berat on November 7.

Mana is one of the friendly faces with the bright smile many will be familiar with as the bar attendant at the Railway & Commercial Hotels.

The 29 year old psychologist from the far northern Argentinean city of Oberá, is travelling the world on a working holiday. Oberá is in the province of Misiones, located about 1,150 km north of Buenos Aires, very near the Brazilian border. The city, which is also known as the "City of the Churches" since it features more than 30 churches belonging to a diversity of denominations, has a population of 61,700 inhabitants. The region is predominantly agricultural, with timber among the leading industries.

Mana is enjoying her stay in Allora, "the people are so friendly", but the time is fast approaching when she is to embark on the next stage of her journey. With her visa to expire in March 2014, Mana will enjoy Allora's Spring for another two or three weeks before heading north to experience the north Queensland coast and then south to Melbourne.

The graduate of the National University of Salta, Mana's parents are both dentists, and she is the eldest of four sisters. While currently over 12,000 kilometres from home, Mana still manages to retain links with her culture. Over a chat she calmly enjoys a beverage very common in her homeland made from the 'yerba' plant, not unlike tea, consumed from a cup with a straw that has a strainer. The hot version of the drink is 'Mate', while when cold it is 'terere'. The plant is harvested similar to tea, taking only single new leaves.

Spanish is the main language in Argentina, but Mana and many of the younger people learn English, which is taught in schools in a basic form. She also used to attend additional English

classes outside of school, something that has helped tremendously as she travels.

After departing her family and friends on her journey in March last year, Mana spent thirteen months in New Zealand, which included three months travelling around both the north & south islands before working for a transport company in Auckland.

Arriving in Australia in April, Mana worked in Sydney before venturing on to Brisbane. She first saw a koala & kangaroo in Brisbane, animals she had never been aware of.

She misses her family and three dogs, and after departing Australia she is heading to South East Asia and planning to meet her mother in Thailand. From there her sights are set on Europe and working in Denmark & Ireland.

Where ever the four winds take Mana her time in Allora will always be special, a lifetime link with friends and a country so very far away.




