In particular, the energy of the late Sue Cowley was instrumental in achieving this and we were delighted when her husband Ted spoke to her memory during the formal part of the morning. He also acknowledged the assistance she received from Jim Flesser during those early forays.

We were also delighted to welcome the Member for Southern Downs, the Hon Lawrence Springborg, and Councillor Glynn Rees from Southern Downs Regional Council (SDRC) both of whom gave up a Sunday morning in their busy lives to attend. We were thrilled that Lawrence also spent over two hours on the summit of the Mountain being educated in the pleasures and beauty to be found there. We thank him for this commitment. In his welcoming remarks, the President of ALG, Hughie Huston spoke about the Mountain and what can be found there when people choose to explore. Timber – Allora & District Historical Society Demonstration Day – 12th April

The original hotel building on the south east corner of Herbert and Drayton Streets (site of the Blue Cow) was known as the "Queens's Arms". The single storey hotel was built in 1866 for Michael and Christina Erhardt. Michael and Christina built their family home "Roseneath" on the corner of Arnold and Warwick Streets around the same time. Their son Joseph, who was the first Erhardt to change the spelling of the surname to Erhart, first worked for his father and later worked as a station hand on Goomburra Station. He then became a 'timber getter' and hauled timber by bullock wagon from the head of the Dalrymple for A Gordon & Co's sawmill.

Michael Erhardt had the license of the "Queens's Arms" until it was sold to Charles Henry Wills in 1879. It was probably at this time when the hotel was re-named the "Royal Hotel". Wills built a hall on Drayton Street which became known as Will's Hall. This building still stands today as part of White's Garage. After the "Queen's Arms" and the hall was leased to local farmer, John Kelley from 1880 to 1883, the hall was known as Kelley's Hall.

John Holmes became the owner of the freehold properties and the licensee of the "Royal" in 1884. John had gone farming after previously being licensee of the "Dalrymple" Hotel. John Kelly took over the license in 1887 and his advertisement in the "Guardian" reads – "The house is large and commodious, is centrally situated, well furnished throughout, and offers accommodation second to none in Allora...good stabling, and an efficient Groom in attendance".

In 1891 John Holmes called for tenders to erect a second storey on the building. Local builders Sharpe and Leggett's tender was accepted. The building included a sample room and auction room.

In 1901 when John Holmes died we learn from the details of his estate that rent of two pounds per week is paid by the licensee of the hotel to him. During John Holmes ownership there had been several licensees including his son David. Along with the hall on the adjoining block, John Holmes also owed two cottages and old stables. His son Esau operated a cordial factory in the hall.

When the "Royal" was purchased by Ellen McCormack (Ellen was the daughter of Patrick Kelley) in 1899 so began a dynasty of family ownership that was to last for over fifty years. The license was transferred to Ellen's daughter, Mary in 1927. Mary (later McKendry) held the freehold until the hotel was sold in 1957. When Jock McKendry, her son, was licensee from 1954 to 1957, he was the fourth generation of the family to be associated with the Royal.

As time went by the hotel was renovated, refurnished and re-fitted, "bought right up to the standard of a first class hotel". In 1915 the premises boasts spacious stabling and a secure motor shed. The licensee at the time advertised an Overland car for hire. In 1928, the licensee Mr G J Mahony called for tenders to paint the buildings. He advertises that he has secured the services of an 'up-to-date barber and hairdresser' and that he also offers a well furnished billiard saloon for his patrons.

A fire destroyed the hotel and several adjoining shops in 1931. It was reported that the total cost of damage to the hotel, baker's shop and café was Three thousand pounds. Nothing was saved, "so quickly the fire consumed the wooden building". The heat was so intense that the windows of the Barnes & Co. building across the road cracked and the walls of the "Commercial" Hotel on the opposite corner were blistered. The licensee, Mr C L A Wright and his family and two boarders escaped the inferno.

A temporary bar was maintained after the fire. Within a short time the owner of the property, Mrs J McKendry announced plans for a new two storied hotel, shop and billiard room. The walls of the new hotel were to be of fibro cement except for the weatherboard exterior. Mr E C Rice from Sangate was contracted to build the "New Royal", with local builder Mr W Leggatt supervising the work. Within two months there are

fifteen carpenters, painters and plumbers working on the building.

There is a full description of the new building and furnishings in the "Allora Guardian". It is described as "having the unusual yet pleasing appearance of an old English inn". There are eight bedrooms on the first floor with the double room being enhanced with a maple suite. The following description of the lounge brings to mind a room designed to cater for the comfort of clients. "An air of cosiness pervades the lounge, the furnishings, which include a Steinway piano, being selected to harmonise with the soft colour scheme of the walls". The licensee Mrs McKendry and her husband live in rooms on the northern side of the building and immediately behind them are the staff quarters.

While there have been many changes of ownership and licensee and a change of name to the "Blue Cow" since the building erected in 1931 it remains mostly unaltered. Some of the old stable buildings still stand in the hotel yard. The present owners Denise Dagleish and Jackie Gallagher changed the name from the "Royal" to the "Blue Cow" in 1996 after a visit to the Snowy Mountains and seeing Mount Blue Cow.

Rae and Jock bought the business outright in April 1976 and traded until the sale to the Kerkin's in 1989)

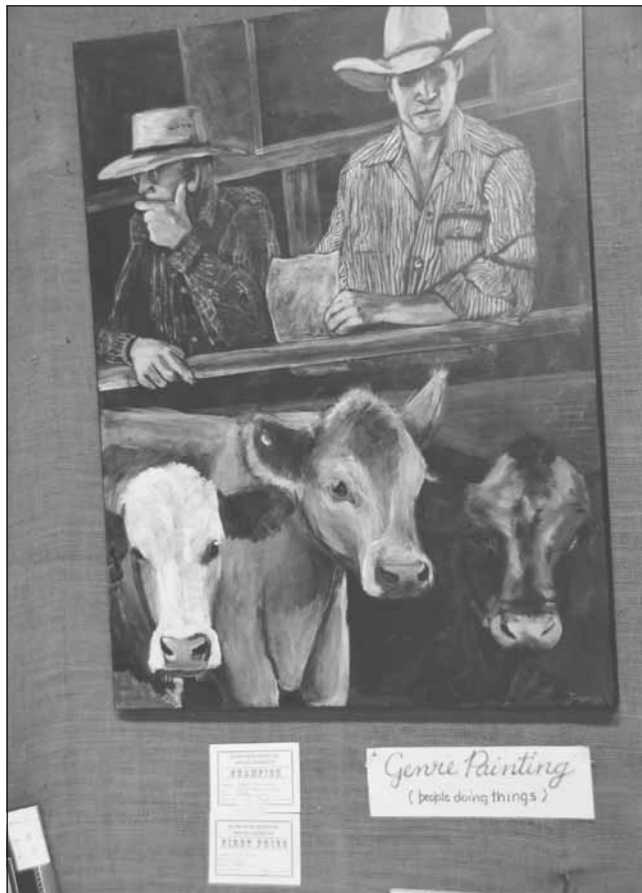

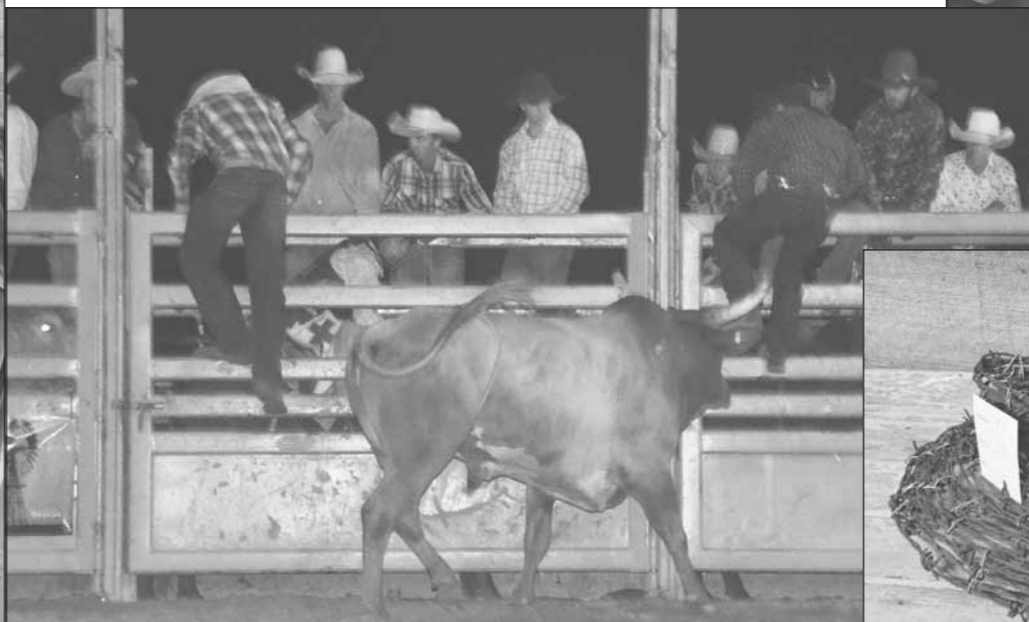

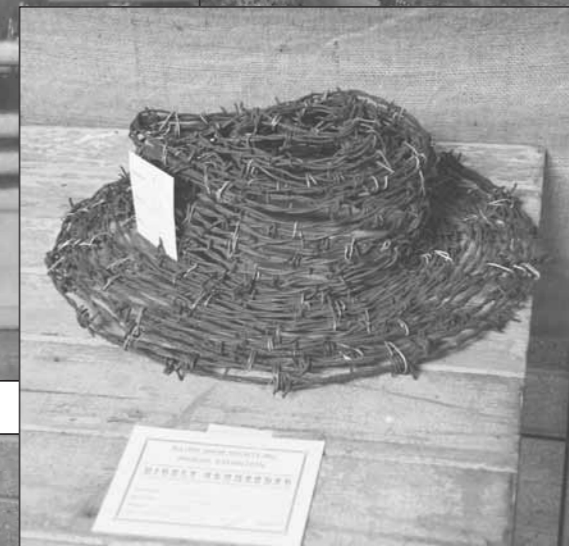
