

HALL BROS

Thomas Hall was born in Banffshire. Scotland in 1844, third child to Thomas and Ann. On arrival in Queensland. Thomas completed his education in Warwick after which he was employed by the pioneer sheep breeders and become proficient in the handling and management of all kinds of stock. He was then involved in the carrying business on a route between Ipswich and Warwick.

At the age of 26 years, Thomas in partnership with his brothers, established Hall Bros.Mill. They erected the first sawmill at Emu Creek. They later built the first steam mill at Allora, cutting timber from the head of Dalrymple Creek. An article in the 'Warwick Argus' dated April 2nd 1881 under the heading "Notes from Allora" reads "The enterprising Hall brothers (well known in your neighbourhood) are about to start a saw mill in our midst. Though they have already erected two substantial

Looking Back... **PHOTOS**

Another of the photos given to the Historical Society by Nelma Ward shows the Post Office and adjacent shops in the late 1940's. The staff of the Post Office at the time may have been: Mr. Darcy, post master; Bill Quinlan and Marian Muller. Unlike the newsagency, the bakery next door to the Post Office had four changes of ownership in the decade 1940-1950. E. E. (Evan) Dance was the owner 1938 -1940; Frank Chandler, 1940 – 1943; R. L. Hanright, 1946 - 1948; and H. W. (Bill) Turner, 1948 – 1951. The butcher's shop was owned by Howell Bros. 1940 - 1949 and E. K. (Eddie) Hoey 1949 - 1951.

cottages for dwelling purposes, have fixed their engine and saw benches, and have sunk a well which will give an ample supply of water for the engine and all other purposes. Their teams are now away for timber, and , should the weather continue favourable, they will probably break the proverbial bottle on the fly-wheel within eight to ten days. It may seem to some very questionable whether there is sufficient demand for timber in Allora to keep an engine and plant employed, but the proprietors do not regard Allora as the only outlet for their produce. They hope to be able to supply the wants of the surrounding settlements, and to establish an export trade in cedar with the principal towns above and below the range. There is an abundance of cedar in the ranges at the head of Goomburra creek, and as there is a good demand in almost all the markets for this timber, I believe the Messrs. Hall will

eventually establish a profitable business in this particular article. They have a splendid plant, and certainly deserve to be successful." The Allora correspondent for the Warwick Examiner and Times (Qld.) on Wednesday 18th May 1881 wrote an article regarding improvements being made in Allora -"business is brisker and money is looser". In the article he writes about the ceremony in which Mrs Gordon broke a bottle of champagne on the engine wheel, christening the new sawmills the "Enterprise Saw Mills" and work commenced the cheers of those present. He reports that the saw mill in the centre of town is situated on land owned by Mr Samuel Gordon host of the Princess of Wales Hotel.

Thomas Hall had selected Portion 2039 (at the head of Dalrymple Creek) on the steep slopes of the main range with plentiful supplies of cedar, pine, beech, rose, mahogany and other hard woods.

An advertisement in the 'Warwick Argus' dated April 1882 reads -

NOTICE

To the Carpenters, Builders, Cabinetmakers And General Contractors in Warwick & District Messrs, Hall Bros.

Allora Steam Saw Mills Are prepared to supply Beech and Cedar Coopers' Timber

Having a Band Sawing machine. Hall Bros. are prepared to cut timber

To any shape at short notice and at moderate prices. Hardwood and Pine of Best Quality, also Felloes Cut from Blue and Red Gum. For scale of prices apply to

In 1875, Thomas married Jane Tulloch at a double wedding ceremony at the Tulloch home "Glencairn", Swan Creek, with his brother, William who married Jane's sister Isabella. They had a family of eleven.

Thomas pioneered cedar cutting from the Tableland Mountain area. He made what is known as a 'shoot' down the side of the mountain 1,700 feet in height. The timber was carried by its own impetus from the top of the mountain to the bottom.

Hall Brother's Mill was purchased by Andrew Gordon in 1888. Thomas continued in the timber industry until 1901. He purchased a holding on the subdivision of 'Canning Downs' Station in 1902 which he named 'Strathmore'.

(Information was obtained from a Hall family book and also from Kevin Ahearn's book "From Cross Cuts to Cross Saws and newspaper articles)

Thomas Hall (1845-1928) wrote and published privately a book "Early History of Warwick and Pioneers of the Darling Downs". This book has a wealth of information on the many districts throughout the Darling Downs. The following comments are of interest - "With an annual average rainfall of 29 inches and generally an early wet season, such an area of fine soil fit for cultivation, including over six thousand square miles of alluvial plains, was bound soon to be placed on trial by the settlers who came as pioneers in 1840 and afterwards".

He also mentions the valuable timber covering the mountains bordering the Darling Downs. These include hoop pine, bunya pine, cedar, silky oak, beech, vellow wood, crow's ash, elm. mahogany, iron bark, stringy bark, box, blue gum, red gum, spotted gum, sugar gum and scores of other valuable timbers which have yet to be tested in a commercial way.

Allora Campdrafters Donate to Qld Fire & Emergency Services

The Allora & District Campdraft Association (ADCA) has recently donated \$2,395 to the Qld Fire & Emergency Services (QFES) to enable the purchase of a Lifeline View Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) to be based at the Fire Station in Allora. Mr Hemmo de Vries, Inspector Warwick Command, Qld Fire & Emergency Services, states that "This will benefit the whole community of Allora, as the closest Qld Ambulance Service is at either Warwick or Clifton".

The idea for ADCA to donate to this cause came from Club members, Clare & Errol Cooper of Cunningham and was supported by all members of the Club. Research shows that each year almost 10,000 Australians die of heart attack and 1 in 4 people who die from a heart attack die within the first hour of their first symptom. "Having this piece of equipment available in the local Allora community provides peace of mind to all residents. We're hoping that it won't have to be used, but if it is needed and saves just one life, then the donation will be invaluable" commented Clare.

In recent times AED's have become simpler to use and have gained wide acceptance in the general community as a necessary piece of first aid equipment. Training in the use of AED's and regular maintenance programs are carried out by QFES, to ensure all firefighters have skills in using the equipment. However, the selected Lifeline View AED is the only external defibrillator that integrates video, voice, pictures

and text to help save the life of a sudden cardiac arrest victim in real time. During an emergency, the VIEW guides a rescuer through each step of CPR and defibrillation, showing and telling the rescuer what to do to save a life. Therefore you simply turn the Defibrillator on and follow prompts, enabling someone without training to operate the machine.

Mr Glenn Evans, current President of ADCA, said that the Club is keen to return funds raised at the annual Campdraft back into the local community and he hoped that this year ADCA will be able to continue working with the Allora Show Society to improve the facilities at the Showground. Council has set a date for Dalveen landfill closure

Southern Downs Regional Council will close the Dalveen waste facility on Monday May 5, 2014, unless the landfill trench is filled sooner.

Environmental Services Manager Tim O'Brien said in October last year Council advised that the Dalveen facility had limited space remaining for trenches to be excavated.

"The closest facility for the Dalveen District residents to use will be Thulimbah Transfer Station and we estimate this would be only an extra 10 kilometres for residents to travel depending on their location in the Dalveen area.

"Once the current trench is full and covered, the facility will be closed on May 5. Although it could be sooner if the trench is filled quickly.

"Residents who use this facility will then need to use the Warwick Waste Facility or apply for a key to access the Summit or Thulimbah Waste Transfer Stations.

"A new key will have to be issued to access the Transfer Stations and residents can swap their current Dalveen Landfill access key for a Transfer Station key. No bulky items or commercial waste are allowed to be taken to the transfer

stations," he said.

Mr O'Brien said the closure of the Dalveen Waste Facility decision is purely because the landfill is approaching its capacity and the decision is in accordance with the Council's Waste Reduction and Recycling Plan 2013 - 2023.

"The Waste Reduction and Recycling Plan contains an action plan and Council will construct new stations that will provide upgraded waste disposal facilities and more opportunities for recycling of valuable raw materials.

"Council wants to enhance the network of transfer stations throughout the region so that community members have easy access to a local supervised facility," he said.
