

### Looking Back...

### **Old Allora Characters**

Mention of Charlie Bishop last week led to thoughts of other old Allora characters. Mick Shannon was a harmless character who lived in the little hut that still stands on the highway. Mick was born in Allora and worked for a time at Holmes & Co. Bob and John Denny recall that when it was time for Mick to move out of the Shannon family home, their father Don Denny built the little hut in his spare time from his job on the cream run.

Billy Butler was another to start his working life at Holmes & Co. Unfortunately Billy took to the drink and apparently when he got out of hand Sergeant Pat Cronin would shut him in the lock-up for the night and have him work it out on the wood heap the next morning; That is until he took to the lock-up steps with the axe. Henry Whitton would hitch hike from one place to another and if you didn't stop to pick him up you would get a heap of abuse and a shake of the fist.

Letty Hammond lived in an old house at the western end of Darling Street and would rummage through the bins at the school.

Bob Dougall used to ride his horse to town and go on a bender. The horse

would probably have been able to find its own way home but in later years the horse must have died of old age because Bob would walk home to Hendon. I was coming back from Warwick one night when I came across what I though was a body in the middle of

the road. I stopped to check, when Alec Busteed in his taxi came along and said "She's right, I'll take care of him", as he bundled Bob into the car. I was still shaking an hour later.

Speaking of bodies, the story is told of Dan O'Keefe who was the yard man at the Railway Hotel. After a heavy session Dan was found lying on the floor. Someone assumed that he had died and called the local undertaker. Colin Pamenter and his offsider Frankie McDonnell were a little under the weather themselves and nearly died of fright when Dan groaned as they tried to put him in the coffin.

Mick Collins was another old character. He had a 'club foot' and camped on the verandah of Leggatt's empty house in Herbert Street.

Leo Clay was an ex-P.O.W. and had a family in N. S. W. somewhere. He lived in the pig vards until Marjorie Deacon took pity on him and allowed him to live in a little shed beside her house. Bob Deacon would give him a few pounds and tell him not to spend it on grog which he invariably

## Allora's Past 100 years ago April

### First Seed Grader

When W. J. T. Neale installed an American "Clipper" grain and seed grader in his grain shed in April 1914 it was the first such machine in the Allora district. Previous to that the local farmers had to send their planting seed to Warwick to be dressed. The machine had a capacity of about 30 bags a day and was able to treat a large selection of seeds including wheat, lucerne, maize, canary, linseed

It is interesting to note that the machine was driven by a 1 ½ h.p. petrol engine designed and built by Mr. John Hill, son of Mr. Joseph Hill of Allora.

(W. J. T. Neale took over the produce business of Henry Dean in Warwick Street in 1910. It was carried on by his son Roy, who sold to the Warwick Co-op in the late 1950's. The building is presently owned by Jenco Feeds & Seeds who would have machines that could probably grade and bag the 30 bags in 15 minutes)

### **LEW PLATZ**

Lew Platz was born in Clifton on Thursday, 2nd October 1952 to parents Wally and Val Platz. He is the youngest in a family of seven children with sisters Marcia, Noela, Glenda, Leona and brothers Ray & Greg, all raised on the family farm at Nobby. Lew attended the Nobby State School and later the Clifton State High School.

From school Lew entered the work force, and would travel with brother Greg daily to Toowoomba for work, Lew completing a boilermaker apprenticeship with Walsh Engineering.

A father of three sons, Matthew, Jessie & Clay, now days Lew is the Queensland State Manager – North for Ainsworth Game Technologies and resides with wife Noela on the Sunshine Coast at Pelican Waters.

A well behaved school student, as a result of a high standard upbringing so evident among hard working farming families of the time, Lew could be considered a less than devoted academic, but he was quick across the ground which had him a popular achiever in the school sporting sphere.

That speed continued to be one of Lew's great playing attributes, from the days when his first Coach Kingsley Bishop commenced the young lad's League preparation until he hung up his boots many years later, an Australian representative.

School and backyard footy was an important part of life for the Platz boys, but it was balanced with the challenges and needs of farm responsibilities. Wally & Val Platz weren't the fondest supporters of their boy's rugby league dreams in those early days, but those opinions changed over time, resulting in Wally & Val achieving Life Membership of the Wattles Rugby League Club. Lew's parents were wonderful club volunteers as well as long standing financial sponsors and received deserved recognition when the Wattles Club named their home ground at Clifton, "Platz Oval", in honour of the tremendous contributions by the Platz family.

The Platz brothers Ray, Greg & Lew all showed outstanding rugby league skills as young fellows, giving indications that they would enjoy long and distinguished rugby league careers.

A very talented second rower or lock, Lew's illustrious rugby league career commenced in earnest wearing the green & gold colours of his beloved club Wattles. His senior league career commenced in 1968 as a fresh faced Wattles Under 16 player. A career, that endured around sixteen fabulous years before stepping out of the best league competition in the world when he completed his final season with the Penrith 'Panthers', having represented his State and country on rugby league's world stage.

The Wattles legend in the making, who used to be among the group of children kicking a footy around the confines of the Nobby State School in the rural Darling Downs, would achieve admirably with his favoured Wattles Rugby League Club, becoming the famous club's fourth Australian representative and rising in his time to be a giant in his chosen sport.

The honours for Lew Platz have been many and significant, and it all started in the green and gold colours of his Wattles club, a member of the club's first ever premiership winning team, the 1968 Under 16 side that brought the fledgling Toowoomba Rugby League club their first & cherished premiership honours. Wattles had joined the Toowoomba Rugby League in 1967, but would only have to wait until 1970 to add First Grade Premiers silverware to their trophy cabinet.

The 1970 Toowoomba Rugby League season saw Lew and brother Greg Platz inspirational in Wattles' initial first grade premiership win, defeating Valleys on the Toowoomba Athletic Oval in front of adoring fans.

The youthful Wattles forward proudly wore the famous Toowoomba 'Clydesdales' jersey, and also represented Queensland Country in 1973. Thiess Toyota Country was defeated by City 23 - 16, but country boy Lew was selected for Queensland, making his debut in the State side's victory over New Zealand Colts 10 – 4 at Lang Park.

Lew made the move from Wattles to Brisbane Rugby League club the Southern Suburbs 'Magpies' for the 1974 season, at the time recognised "as one of the most promising forwards in the State". He was selected in the Brisbane representative team and took the next step into the Queensland team.

The young back-rower who was making every post a winner ran on for his first match against New South Wales in Sydney in 1974, the home side winning 22 – 13, but the return match at Brisbane's Lang Park saw Queensland draw 13 all with New South Wales under lights. Lew Platz and the other members of the Queensland pack were considered to have played a superb match. Lew was on the bench for Queensland in Game 3, but also played for his State against Great Britain later in that season.

The 1975 season was to provide Lew with some amazing rugby league experiences, a year that could possibly be considered as his 'footy purple patch'. He signed with the Wynnum-Manly 'Seagulls' in the Brisbane Rugby League in what was considered a surprise in rugby league circles at the time. It was obviously a change that agreed with Lew, he scored four tries against the Western Suburbs

'Panthers' in only his second competition game with the 'Seagulls'. The 1975 season saw him star in City Firsts 51 – 2 belting of the Thiess-Toyota Country combination, scoring three tries and named 'Player of the Match'. He was an obvious choice for Queensland, and played in all three matches

He was an obvious choice for Queensland, and played in all three matches of the interstate series. It was a great time to wear maroon, the Queenslanders winning Game 1, 14-8 on home turf at Lang Park. The winning result ended

a five year drought for Queensland, having last beaten New South Wales in 1970. New South Wales snatched Game 2 in Brisbane winning 27 - 18, but Queensland came within a hairs breadth of taking the series when they lost 9 - 8 in Game 3 in Sydney.

A crowd of 15,344 attended for the Sydney series decider, the best attendance in Sydney since the 1950's, and a lone winning try by Alan McMahon that was hotly disputed.

After the match the Australian team to contest the 1975 World Series was named, the Series featuring sides from Australia, New Zealand, France, Wales & England.

Wattles lad Lew was one of four Queenslanders named in the Australian side to play New Zealand in the first match of the Series at Lang Park, Australia's 482nd representative. Australia waltzed through the Kiwi defence in that first match of the Southern Hemisphere leg of what was the World Championships to lead 20-0 at half time and win convincingly 36-8. Lew Platz scored a try in what was his first International appearance for his country, in what was considered a fine debut.

Lew was named in the 'Kangaroos' for the second match of the Series against Wales, another win to Australia 33-8 at the Sydney Cricket Ground. Game 3 of the Series saw Australia overwhelm France 26-6 at Lang Park, with Lew in the second-row.

Lew shared the second-row with South Sydney great Gary Stevens in the final Southern Hemisphere match which was against England, the match resulted in a 10 all draw, the former Wattles back-rower one of Australia's best forwards.

Later in 1975 Lew was one of four Queenslanders named in the Australian side for the World Series Northern Hemisphere competition. Australia won the 1975 World Series, after defeating New Zealand 24-8 in Auckland, Wales at Swansea 18-6, France at Perpignon 41-2 but suffered a solitary loss to England, 13-16.

Interesting to note that while the national side didn't beat England in 1975, the Toowoomba "Clydesdales" did 25-16 with one Greg Platz in the forward pack.

The '75 season also saw Lew take the field against the Poms with a Brisbane representative side that survived what was termed a vicious match to win 21 – 10 at Lang Park. It was the night that Greg Veivers made an outstanding return to representative football, Greg Veivers & Lew Platz among a number of players that were considered magnificent in the upset.

The 1975 season was a glorious period for Lew, but up Nobby way many were scratching their heads. "Was this the Lew Platz they recalled, the former Nobby State School student that is now rated among the world's best players. This fellow weighed in at 14 stone 10 lb and stood 6 ft 3 inches running on for Australia, was he the Lew Platz that was better known to many as 'Shorty' Platz who kept missing selection in the Nobby School footy teams because he was so small? It sure was, 'Shorty' shot up in his teens to become one of the best forwards the local Wattles club had ever produced." Unfortunately 1976 saw Lew sidelined for virtually the whole season due to surgery as a result of an injury suffered in Europe during the 1975 World Series.

He was back in City Firsts colours in 1977, City too good for Country 41-12, Country unable to contain their metropolitan cousins, with Greg Veivers, Greg Oliphant & Lew Platz among those who dominated.

New South Wales won Game 1 in 1977 (19 - 3), but the match was very special for the Platz family, Lew teaming up with brother Greg in the Queensland second row. Game 2 was a different story, Captain Greg Veivers leading his team to within one point of victory, 13 - 14, Veivers named 'Man of the Match' in what was rated one of the great performances by a

Brothers Lew & Greg Platz played together wearing the maroon of Queensland on three occasions, all in 1977, twice against New South Wales and a match against the touring Great Britain team

Lew played his final game for Wynnum-Manly at the end of the 1977 season before heading south to link up with New South Wales Rugby League Club the Parramatta 'Eels' for the 1978, 1979 & 1980 seasons, where he ran on in 28 first grade matches crossing for eight tries.

He joined the Penrith 'Panthers' for the 1981, 1982 & 1983 seasons playing 58 top grade games and scored eight tries.

Lew Platz is yet another example of the ability of the Darling Downs region to produce outstanding sporting identities. The Wattles Rugby League Football Club is immensely proud of their association with Lew, and that they played a part in the life journey that became his exceptional sporting career. His name will forever be a source of great pride for the Wattles 'Warriors' Club and community, and as another tribute their First Grade "Best & Fairest Player" award bears Lew's name, "The Lew Platz Cup", an award to recognise the very best in the club's player ranks annually.

Lew's tremendous ability and achievements were recognised in 2008, the centenary year of rugby league in Australia. Teams were named at all levels of the game across the nation to commemorate the historical event, with Lew Platz receiving the honour of being listed in three such teams, the Allora-Clifton Rugby League, the Wattles Rugby League Club and the Wynnum-Manly Rugby League Club "Teams of the century".

Current Hall of Fame member, International and fellow Wattles legend Shane Webcke was just a youngster when Lew's career was on high, but he recalls that the Platz name was synonymous with the Wattles club. "I was very young, but you knew that Lew Platz had done something very special, you knew he had provided significant input to Wattles, and the calibre of a person he must be".

"Now days I can relate to Lew's remarkable achievements, a very accomplished person in terms of the game"

The Allora Regional Sports Museum is so very honoured to have a sportsman of the calibre of Lew Platz joining the other esteemed identities in the "Hall of Fame".


