## ANTHONY RIDES FOR CANCER RESEARCH


Anthony Mole will again ride for cancer. Anthony is setting out for his third year running to raise money for cancer research. Like many of us Anthony's life has been affected by the insidious disease of cancer. His beloved grandfather, Reg suffered and died from cancer as well as other members of his extended family. Anthony was inspired by his families' grief to help others through the raising of money for research. Look around our community and see the benefits of research into the improved treatment of cancer sufferers.

This year's ride will again leave from Queensland University for their destination at Wivenhoe Dam covering over 220km in 2 days. The riders who numbered well over 1200 and raising 4.2 million dollars last year will set out on 16th August and head back to Brisbane the following day. They will be provided with tents for the overnight stay. People from all ages and all walks of life participate. Former cancer patients have joined the ride in past years as a tribute to the recovery that they have experienced through the benefits of research.

Anthony is also doing a 2nd ride this year for the "Smilling for Smiddy Foundation" which has raised over 4 millions dollars for the Mater Hospital research and support services. This ride 570km over 3 days passing Allora town on the 18th May, is a part of their journey from Brisbane to Toowoomba to Warrick and back to Brisbane

Anthony's grandmother, Heather Mole is again sponsoring Anthony in his quest. Last year Heather raised over \$900. Heather with the help of her friends is planning an Afternoon Tea in St. David's Hall on the 25th May. Entertainment during the afternoon will be provided by Maggie Stokes and her popular band the 'Hot Spurs'. Allora and district residents are invited to support Heather by donating goods for the 'Bring and Buy' stall and bringing a 'plate' for afternoon tea. There will be a multi-draw raffle. Admission to this entertaining afternoon will be \$5.00 and proceedings get underway at 1.30pm.

Dear Sir,

I write on behalf of the Mental Illness Fellowship of Australia to ask your readers to become aware it is time we all took more action to support people who have Schizophrenia.

It is Australia's last "big un-discussable illness". The simple fact is that it is very misunderstood and affects up to 1 million Australians.

We want to make readers aware that there is an important FREE service that can support people in your area. This free service is for people living with mental illness and their carers and family members, to help them find the support they need. The initiative is called "MiNetworks" and local people in your area will be referred to the information and services they need by simply calling 1800 985 944. You can also go to www. minetworks.org.au.

It is astonishing how much stigma there is around Schizophrenia in the community. Many think it is scary, hopeless, violent and untreatable. That is simply inaccurate.

Schizophrenia is a mental health condition. It can be managed. People with schizophrenia do not have a "split personality". They have one personality like everyone else.

We ask people to lobby local politicians and demand better services and more funding to support people with mental illness. It is very disturbing to know that only about half the people affected by Schizophrenia are even accessing clinical assistance. In regional areas, services to support people are - at best - sparse.

National Schizophrenia Awareness Week runs from May 11th. Schizophrenia is a common illness. It is treatable. Recovery and a good quality of life is possible for most people. Anyone wanting more information should go to www.mifa.org.au.

I want to specifically pay tribute to all the people in your local area supporting people with mental health issues. The amazing and vital work of carers must be applauded by us all.

## LANDCARE AUSTRALIA: Special 25th anniversary Landcare grants launch

#### Take the heat out of your winter energy bills

## Looking Back... **PHOTOS**

In keeping with the Sunday school theme, the photo this week comes from a long time friend of the Historical Society from Spring Creek. The interesting thing about the photo is not so much the occasion but the setting.

The occasion is the annual Sunday school picnic of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church in Allora in the early 1900's. The setting is Kennedy Bros. grain shed in what is now known as Wilson Lane. The grain shed was on the western side of the lane behind

about where Jim and Heather Whitton live today. The photo is taken looking north towards Table Top and the house to the left of the shed would be facing Jubb Street.

Kennedy Bros. flour mill would be behind the camera and was situated behind where Graeme and Marie Mc Millan live today (the cement block that carried the boiler is still in place). The assets of Kennedy Bros. were sold up in about 1910 and Barnes & Co operated the mill for a short time. Barnes' tennis courts were later built on the site.

### **Sunday School Jubilee**

Mr. George Tickle (superintendent) invited the Mayor, Ald. James Dean, to address

the people attending the jubilee celebration of the establishment of the Methodist Sunday school 50 years previously in 1864. Ald. Dean said that he could go back 40 of those years and the church had a deep obligation to Mr. Isaac Hardwick who "amidst the strenuous battle of life and wild surroundings" had founded the Sunday school. "Mr. Hardwick believed that it was good that children should study the bible and had a conviction that their lives would be incomplete unless they had the privilege of learning something of religion" he said. Allora Methodist minister, Mr. J. E. Everitt, announced that the funds needed for the purchase of a memorial organ were well

(The founding of the Methodist Sunday school preceded the building of the Wesley Chapel by two years. Local farmer, Mr. Henry Meyer, conducted a canvass of the district to raise money for the building of the church in 1866)
