The idea behind the recipe book was born from Felicity's desperate search for a healthy option to deal with the autoimmune disease Scleroderma.

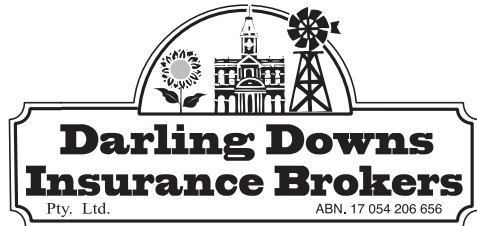

Anne's Hanging Up Her Kettle... After Today's Final Morning Tea

There's nothing like a "cuppa" between friends at any time for a chat and catch up, but when the iconic Aussie tradition also serves to raise money to benefit such a vital organisation as the Cancer Council of Australia, it takes on a whole different meaning. Well known Allora identity Anne Lawson has been hosting "cuppas" at her home as part of the Cancer Council of Australia fundraiser, "Australia's Biggest Morning Tea" for the past fifteen years. Anne has the "kettle boiling" for another successful event to be hosted at her back yard at 5 Jubb Street, Allora, from 10 am today, May 22nd.

The motivation to raise funds for the Cancer Council was born with Anne, her husband Robert and their family dealing with the pain and suffering associated with son Dennis' diagnosis with Ewings Sarcoma in 1999, and the subsequent three year battle Dennis fought before losing his life. Dennis received a bone marrow transplant from his sister Camelle, and while the procedure was deemed a success, Dennis sadly succumbed to complications associated with the treatment. Anne was motivated to do something to support cancer research. She had considered the "Shave for a Cure" fundraiser, before settling on an annual morning tea under the banner of "Australia's Biggest Morning Tea". Anne Lawson's Biggest Morning Tea has been firmly entrenched in Allora's community calendar, over the past decade and a half.

Raised in Allora and attending school here and later marrying, Dennis Lawson had much to live for. He was a talented athlete, a karate exponent who was judged third best in the world in his age group in the 1994 World Championships in Japan. His family through the Lawson's annual morning tea recognize his life cut tragically short, and the organisation that supported him through his illness.

That the Cancer Council of Australia having raised \$12.7 million last year, with the kettles boiling annually for so many cuppas since 1994, is testament to the fact that when it comes

to Australia's Biggest Morning Tea, every cup really does count in the fight against cancer.

After 15 years of valiant fundraising in support of such a vital course, Anne has decided to hang up her kettle. "We have enjoyed having the yearly event" said Anne, "but as the saying goes all good things must come to an end."

As has been the case so many times before, that the morning tea that has become an Allora tradition, will also feature a multi draw raffle open to all. Anne and her Lawson family members have been hard at work in Warwick & Allora selling tickets in the multi-draw at only \$2.00 a ticket in a mammoth 52 amazing prizes. Anne & husband Robert are familiar faces selling tickets in aid of cancer research throughout the Allora & Warwick community.

Anne is very proud of the way the community have supported her Morning Teas, which in 1999 raised \$369.00, which later averaged \$3,800.00 and more, but the year they finished with \$9,800 in the coffers for cancer was the highlight.

"Our family have made many friends as a result of our annual Morning Tea" smiled Anne, "but without the tremendous support we have had from friends, the public and business houses we would not have enjoyed the success we have had, nor been able to support the Cancer Foundation to the level we have".

For this loyal support over many years, Anne is inviting everyone to enjoy a cuppa for cancer support one last time.

Entry to Anne Lawson's annual "Australia's Biggest Morning Tea" is only a gold coin donation, and those attending are requested to supply a plate, while this year the event features musical entertainment by local singer Tara Clark.

Council special meeting decides to lobby for Warwick aerodrome growth

Southern Downs Regional Council will lobby the Minister for Energy Mark McArdle, Member for Southern Downs Lawrence Springborg and Ergon Energy to ensure the future development and expansion of the Warwick aerodrome is not limited by the construction of a new 110kw powerline to Stanthorpe.

Mayor Cr Peter Blundell said at a special council meeting last week, councillors agreed that SDRC will pursue development of Warwick aerodrome and will apply to CASA (Civil Aviation Safety Authority) for an upgraded classification of the airport. In March Cr Blundell and Chief Executive Officer Andrew Roach were consulted by Ergon as part of their process. At that time Ergon asked Council to provide the CASA rating of the airport which would then dictate to Ergon the distance and obstacle compliance regime they need to meet. This information was provided and also the future proposal for expansion of the facility.

CEO Andrew Roach, in his report to Council, emphasised that SDRC approved the installation of an aviation fuel facility at Warwick Aerodrome at its January meeting with councillors unanimously voting to approve the fuel facility to encourage the growth of business in the aerodrome precinct. Council has been advised that the local aviation community is fully supportive of the installation of the \$75,000 refuelling facility. During debate at the meeting Cr Ross Bartley said Council needed to lobby Member for Southern Downs Lawrence Springborg about the potential of the Warwick aerodrome and its future growth for the region.

Councillors agreed that the Ergon Energy powerline should not interfere with the growth and development of the airport, given the existing activities and opportunity for business growth.

The Warwick aerodrome is also the location for the local Gliding School, RAAF cadets, a total of 23 various lease holders and the site for the Royal Flying Doctor Service to land.

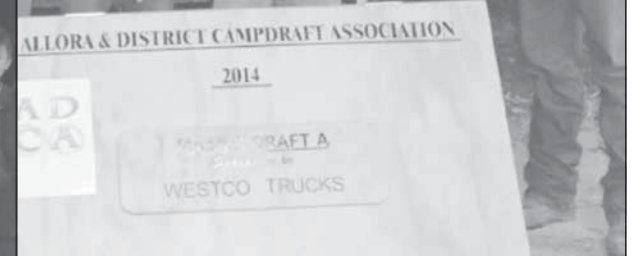

Looking Back...

L. A. May & Co.

The Historical Society has been given a pictorial history of the Allora business of L. A. May & Co. by Errol May. The L. A. May & Co. story started in 1947 when Lewis May, who was share farming at Mt. Marshall at the time, bought an ex-army 1941 Ford truck. He cut posts, cord wood and carted grain in season. Increasing work led to the purchase of a second truck and the employment of a driver. Lewis and Nancy May and family moved to Allora in 1953 and the firm of L. A. May & Co. was founded with the purchase of the Vacuum Oil depot from Harold Jensen A depot for Cobb & Co. Transport was established in Allora in 1958-59. The business increased over the years with an emphasis on general freight, fuel delivery and road construction. Three sons Ron, Errol and Lindsay and daughter, Barbara, joined the firm and drivers including Dennis Butler, Hubert Hills, Graeme McMillan, Alan Smith and Glen Hentschel were employed. When the business was sold in September 1989 due to the senior partners wishing to retire, the company operated three semi-trailers, one truck and dog and four fuel delivery vehicles, as well as much other associated equipment.

Allora's Past 75 years ago May 1939 Australian Defence League

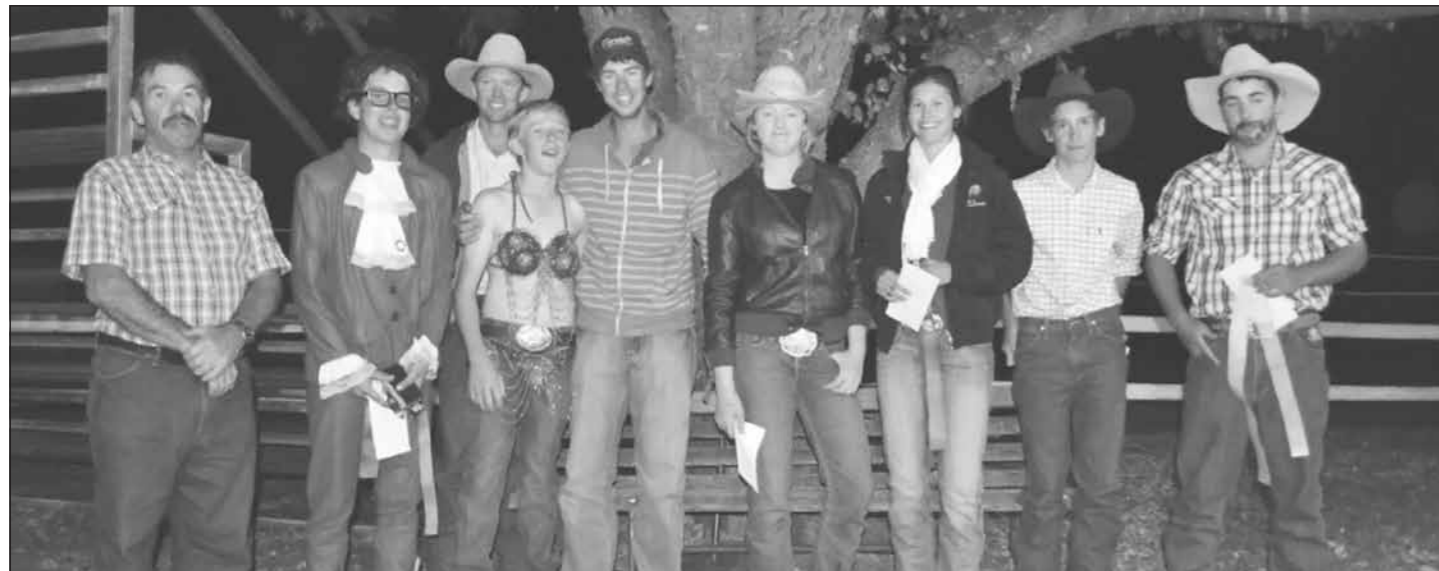

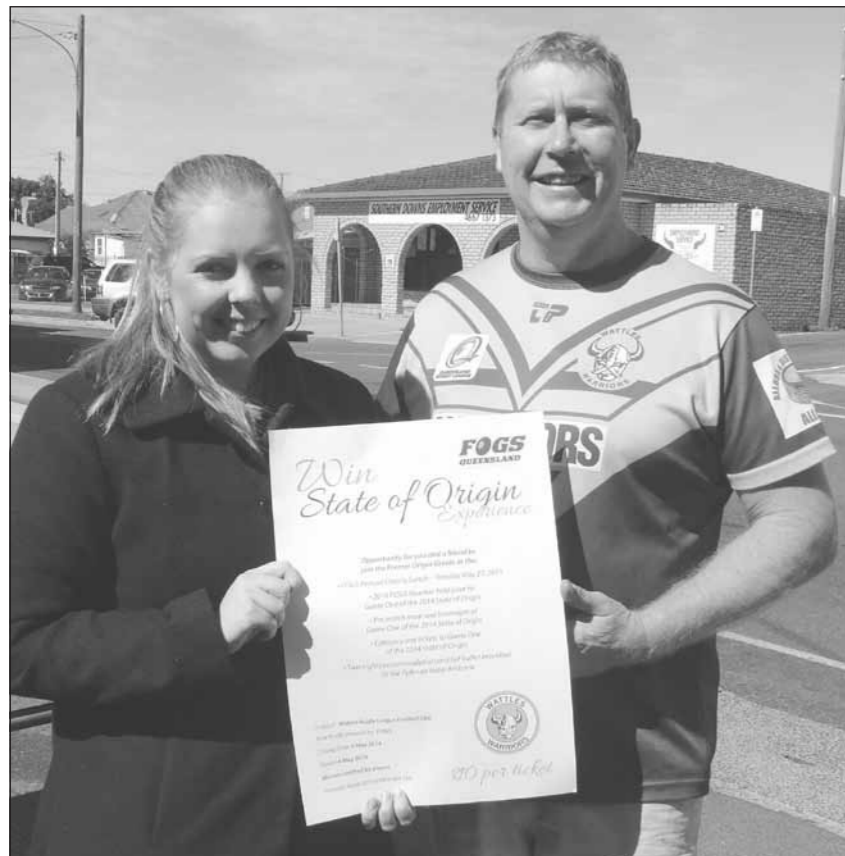
