

Council supports Sleepout event

The Southern Downs Regional Council is encouraging Southern Downs residents to support the local "Winter Sleepout" event on June 27 that is raising awareness and funds for the homeless.

Cr Neil Meiklejohn said homelessness was a hidden problem and many in the community would not realise the extent of the issue.

"Unfortunately more than 100,000 people are homeless on any given night in Australia, including thousands of families.

"Warwick residents Tracey Bower and Cathryn Fischer have organised a Mission Australia Winter Sleep Out for Friday 27th June 2014 from 5pm to 8am Saturday. The venue is Williams Hall on Guy Street Warwick.

"Tracey and Cathryn's aim for the night is to get a minimum of 50 people from the community at our venue sleeping out and of course any more would be a bonus.

"Both agree that holding the event indoors allows for families to partake in the night especially if it's too cold or raining outside for children attending.

"I'm away from the Southern Downs at the time of the event but I certainly wish them well for their inaugural sleepout," he said. Mrs Bower said she and friend Cathryn were excited about bringing the event to fruition.

"There will be karaoke, face painting, celebrity heads, raffles from donated local businesses (heater, vouchers, electric blanket) and many more organised activities to make for a fun filled family night.

"A sausage sizzle, pizza, tea, coffee, milo will be available for a small fee on the night.

"The money raised helps people address the underlying causes of their homelessness, support them as they regain their independence and help them get back on their feet.

"All people need to do is donate their \$25 via the website www. wintersleepout.gofundraise.com.au, get their sponsors (also done via the website) to sponsor them, pack their pjs, sleeping bags/bedding and come along for a great night. It's a great way to start the school holidays.

"Of course people and businesses can donate at the sleepout website and, look for my link 'Tracey's fundraising challenge' or 'Tracey and Cathryn's fundraising challenge'. Even if people aren't too keen to sleep out, please support us by either donating online or come on the night for a few hours, every little bit counts. Everything donated on the website is tax deductible above \$2." she said.

Council encourages tourism representatives to attend forum

State Government tourism incentives, music events, unlawful camping and an update from Southern Queensland Country Tourism will just be some of the myriad of topics discussed at the Southern Downs Regional Council (SDRC) Tourism Industry Forum on July 2.

Council's Planning and Development Manager Cecil Barnard said he hopes tourism operators and associated businesses will attend this free forum at the SDRC Warwick chambers from 9am to 1pm.

"This is an important day for tourism operators to hear about the latest Government initiatives, changes in legislation, progress made and government directions.

"Most importantly Council wants tourism operators to have their say about issues affecting their industry, from land-use and compliance through to marketing and promotion challenges and future plans for co-ordinated tourism strategies.

"Marie-Claire Power, the CEO of Southern Queensland Country Tourism, has kindly agreed to be the facilitator for the day.

"The program for the day will include the latest news / update on tourism and marketing of our region with a presentation from Southern Queensland Country Tourism.

"Ian Wade Parker will give a presentation on music events in Stanthorpe / Granite Belt and Peta Hawes will discuss the food industry and opportunities like The Harvest Lunch.

"The forum will also cover the State Government's next generation tourism planning guideline, an update on changes in the planning scheme on agri-tourism, short term accommodation, levels of assessment and the Queensland Camping Options Toolkit.

"A major issue for the Southern Downs is short term accommodation and seasonal workers as well as compliance issues, music events and unlawful camping on public land. As a result of these discussions we hope to establish a regional camping stakeholder group," he said.

Mr Barnard said regular communication and discussion within the tourism industry was vital.


"We see this as the first of a series of Tourism Forums, and Council plus the State Government endeavour to research issues raised, and respond back formally on these issues.

"This is an ideal time for the tourism industry to make good headway knowing that the State Government has made tourism one of its four pillars of growth. Southern Downs needs to be part of the state discussions and deliberations and to have a co-ordinated and consistent approach for our region," he said.

throughout, skilful play maker Duggan also coping plenty of attention from the hosts, while galloping bookend Pat Manley relentlessly tested the defensive line.

Wattles scored first points in just the second minute through a try by centre Dan Manley, converted by Matt Duggan to hold an early 6 - 0 lead.

The 'Warriors' early try stung the locals into action, former Australian Schoolboys star and Manly 'Sea-Eagles' lower grade player Ryan Mitchell slicing through in the seventh minute & racing thirty metres before a loose pass denied the 'Bears' a certain try. The inevitable was only delayed a short time though, 'Bears' winger Tyren Nicholls sweeping in for a try on the back of a handy penalty that provided ideal field position. With Wattles leading 6 - 4 after nine minutes, the big 'Bears' forwards were testing the green & gold defence, but the 'Warriors' star prop Pat Manley was giving as good as he got. Winger Robbie Moore breezed in to appear to score after a Wattles back line rush, but was denied with an earlier pass was ruled forward.

Oakey big man Eddie Dean was also denied soon after in a near thing after a chip into the ingoal.

Wattles were enjoying a number of opportunities to score tries but were failing to finish them off. Another scoring chance went begging when the 'Bears' were penalised for a shoulder charge by Referee Randall Taylor in the 21st minute resulting in fiveeight Brodie Ciesiolka setting up lock forward Aaron Scheid on the fly, only to be halted centimetres from the try line.

But in a flash the run of play changed allowing former Wattles speedster Aaron Hooper to touch down in the corner and give Oakey an 8 - 6 lead.

The 'Bears' had Wattles on the back foot as they threw the ball around in the final minutes of the first stanza, with centre Mitchell sailing in a try in the shadow of half time.

Leading 12 - 6 at the break, the 'Bears' relentless roll on continued after the restart resulting in representative fullback Corey Blades scoring under the uprights in the 45th minute.

Trailing 6 – 18, Wattles received a shot in the arm when centre Joel Koina hauled in a long distance looping Matt Duggan pass to score and have his side 10 - 18 behind with a half hour

Wattles needed to lift despite the very physical Oakey defence if they were to stay in the game and remain four points clear of second placed Gatton on the 'Hutchies Cup' A Grade Premiership ladder.

A try by fullback Jackson Green in the 54th minute that saw him run on to a gem of a pass by Matt Duggan and beat three defenders on the way to the try line had the 'Warriors' trailing by 16 – 18 with 25 minutes remaining.

Oakey were a force to be reckoned with, their big forwards making quality metres in midfield while they had the speed of slick backs Aaron Hooper, Tyren Nicholls and Ryan Mitchell on the edges, an ever present danger for the 'Warriors'. Their centre Mitchell snatched a try to give Oakey a six point break on Wattles, leading 22 - 16.

Wattles teak tough back-rower Conor Swinton dived over untouched for a vital Wattles try to level the scoreboard ledger 22 all. It seemed Wattles were turning the tide, but the 'Bears' were anything but done.

With the scoreboard locked at 22 all, and Wattles earning a 20 metre drop out, some quick thinking by Green saw him race to the twenty metre line and tap the ball before hoisting a high lob of a pass to centre Joel Koina who embarked on a sixty dash up field. With Oakey speedster Hooper gaining Koina found Matt Duggan in support racing to the goal posts.

The try was a turning point in the game, and when Duggan casually kicked a drop goal from fifteen metres out to add to Wattles lead, 29 – 22 with ten minutes remaining, the green & gold confidence lifted. Wattles appeared to be on the back foot for much of the game and had now turned the thrust of the match, but the 'Bears' weren't done just yet.

Their fleet of foot flankers made room up the grand stand side of the field to send guicksilver winger Nicholls away on a fifty

metre dash to the line with just five minutes left in what was a very tough 80 minute stoush.

Wattles almost posted another touchdown but were penalised for obstruction, and held on amid a fierce Oakey final minutes onslaught to claim another two premiership points.
