



Allora's Past 150 years ago August 1864

Police Magistrate Warwick

20th August 1864 Police protection required at Allora The Honourable The Colonial Secretary Brisbane

Sir,

I have the honour to bring under your consideration the fact that Police protection is required at "Allora" on Dalrymple Creek about 14 miles from

There are two public houses in that locality and every Sunday there is a gathering of idlers from the stations in the vicinity - Clifton, Talgai, Pilton, Goomburra and Glengallan. Games are carried on as well as horse racing and the Sabbath closes frequently with scenes of riot and drunkenness.

I am informed that during the last shearing season scarcely a day passed without some lawless and disgraceful event and that life was often in danger for want of some Police control.

I am at present under the necessity of sending one of the Warwick Police force to that place every week to protect the peace and to preserve order.

As however the shearing season is approaching, I have the honour to recommend that a district constable be

stationed there as a permanency and that a lock-up be erected for the custody of prisoners as well as for the reception of parties under escort, the only place which an escort party can now be put up being a public house.

> I have the honour to be, Sir, Your most obedient servant J. C. White Police Magistrate

(The 1864 Queensland Police Gazette contained the following notice for 1/9/1864 "Appointment of Constable Robert Grayson to be acting Sergeant at Allora"; thus beginning 150 years of police presence in Allora. The same Police Gazette announced the transfer on 9/9/1864 of Constable William Swords from Brisbane to Warwick, to be additional at Allora)

Council creates new grants programs

Southern Downs Regional Council (SDRC) has reviewed its grant and funding programs over recent months and, as a result, will launch three new grant programs this Friday (August

Community Services Manager Sheila Stebbings said the three new grant programs, Community Grants Program, Community Support Program and Fast-Response Small Grants Program, would make it easier for community groups to apply for funding. "The Community Grants Program provides funding for one-off community-based activities or projects, or one-off capital works or equipment purchases. The total funding pool is \$70,000 with applications invited for 'up to \$1,000' and 'over \$1,000 and up to \$10,000'. There will be one funding round each financial year.

"The Community Support Program provides a funding contribution to enable local community organisations to continue to provide ongoing programs or services to support Southern Downs' residents. The total funding pool is \$70,000 with applications invited for up to \$10,000. This will also have one funding round for each financial year.

"The Fast-Response Small Grants Program is a rolling program which will be open for applications throughout the financial year. The total funding pool is \$10,000 and applications by an individual will be invited for up to a maximum of \$250 and for an organisation or team up to a maximum of \$500. This program will become active from September 8, 2014.

"Council believes that these three programs will have the right mix of grant funding to cater for one-off events, on-going programs and emergent funding needs for community groups. "We want community groups to be aware that demand for these grants is very high and we need applications to meet specified criteria. All grants programs operate in a competitive coach Shaun Henry.

Council completes the Warwick **CCTV** camera upgrade

Southern Downs' residents can feel safer following completion of the upgrade to the Warwick CCTV system.

Contractors Secure Solutions were engaged by Southern Downs Regional Council (SDRC) to carry out the work of replacing 26 cameras in the Warwick CBD area with 75 High Definition Cameras which provide reliable and high quality recording of the Warwick CBD area.

The total project cost of \$188,000 was partially funded by the State Government under the Local Government Grants and Subsidies Program (LGGSP) 2013/2014 Infrastructure Subsidy. SDRC's application for funding under this program secured 40% of the project costs with the balance of funding paid from Council's 2013/2014 budget.

SDRC Mayor Cr Peter Blundell said that the upgrade provided a system which could both deter crime and provide a safer main street environment for locals and visitors alike.

"Public safety is highly valued by residents across the Southern Downs. The enhanced recording capabilities of the new CCTV cameras will contribute to achieving a safe community," he

Community awareness of the CCTV system has also been raised with the installation of signs and stickers around the Warwick CBD area advising that surveillance cameras may be operating in the area.

"This is a fire hazard and with our current drought conditions it creates a major risk. Over the years Council workers have seen fires starting throughout the waste collection process, including in the collection vehicles and at the landfill.

"So we urge people to dispose of their hot ash by other means or simply wait until the ashes are cold," he said.

Mr O'Brien said the Southern Downs would experience several more weeks of cold or cooler weather so he encouraged residents still using their fireplaces to heed the safety message.

be loaded and unloaded without having transport drivers in livestock raceways, meaning they are completely separated from the livestock.

"With the volume of livestock coming through the saleyards, cattle will jostle in the yards but the new loading ramp means that the animals are contained and restricted due to the

"The crowding gate and a switching gate allow an operator to easily divert livestock from one deck to another, creating a far more efficient and safer operation. It also ensures there is little chance of backlogs of livestock awaiting loading and unloading," he said.

Cr Blundell said Council had applied for Federal Government funding under the Heavy Vehicle Safety and Productivity Program (administered through State Government Department of Transport and Main Roads) to secure 75% of the costs of this project, with Council funding the balance 25%.

Council has also allocated \$100,000 in its 2014/15 budget to further improve safety at the saleyards.

"This work will include improvements to the walkways, stairs and construction of chemical and hay storage facilities," Cr Blundell said.


