
They have won two previous first grade premierships in 1970 defeating Valleys 20-17, and a second in 1997 overwhelming Newtown 42-8.

The meeting attracted eighteen people, most of whom attended a group dinner at the Railway Hotel before. Hughie Huston was re-elected President and Pete Thomas was re-elected Secretary. We are delighted to announce the new Treasurer is Garry Burns. He replaces Jenny

Gardner who has retired after three successful years in that position. Again, the group offer her sincere thanks for her financial stewardship during the tricky process of seeking and acquiring grant monies to fund their activities.

The group had a year of high achievement on Allora Mountain. as any visitor can easily see. Plantings of native trees, bushes and grasses, particularly along the ridgeline overlooking the refuse station, have taken well. The intention is to "soften" the view over the dump to the west. Other planted sites have also struck well and credit must be given to the ALG volunteers who have willingly given their time over many days of work. The Council provided a generous supply of good mulch to assist us in the process and we again thank them for their generosity.

The road up to the reservoir level has been regraded and is trafficable to most vehicles. A big task for the group in the next twelve months will be to continue landscaping and planting the road, particular the northern slope, to mitigate future erosion and washouts. The entrance to the road has been made welcoming with a post-and rail fence, and signage identifying the area will be erected shortly.

At the reservoir, visitors will notice a solid wooden frame. This is the skeleton of an information shelter, soon to be completed. It will contain pamphlets and scientific data about the mountain,


its history, attractions, flora and fauna.

Visitors may have noticed a pair of eagles flying over the mountain. We are keeping an eye on their nest from last year, which is showing signs of use again. With luck, we may again have the extraordinary privilege of observing an eagle chick grow to maturity from close quarters.

Last Friday, the group played host to twenty-five children from the Prep and Grade 1 classes at St Pat's School in Allora. They arrived by bus and spent ninety minutes at the Reservoir where they were introduced to some elementary field craft before planting twelve trees in specially prepared sites. Each tree is identified with their names so they will be able to follow progress over time.

The group has undertaken some field trips and excursions over the past year, to historical sites in the area and places of local interest. We again thank the farmers and landholders who made us welcome onto their land. It is yet again a reminder of the rich history and diversity of culture on show here in the Southern Downs.




LOCAL SUCCESS AT INTERNATIONAL HORSE TRIALS

Over 170 horse and rider combinations travelled from as far as Sydney to compete in last weekend's Queensland International Three Day Event run at Morgan Park from 28th to 31st August. The event is one of only 6 international level events of its kind held across Australia annually and this year crowds were treated to an outstanding level of entertainment generously provided by organisers as well as a very high standard of equestrianism from the competitors. The competition showcased the multitalented nature of the sport of eventing with riders competing in the three different disciplines of Dressage, Cross Country jumping and Showjumping over three consecutive days.

Eleanor Osborne, Allora rider and manager of Highborne Farm, competed 4 horses at the event. She led the CCN EvA 105 class from start to finish, riding Cameron and Andrea Osborne's 7yo Thoroughbred 'Highborne Night Shadows'. As well as winning the class, Murray, as he is also known, was also awarded the prize for the best scoring Thoroughbred horse of the entire competition. He is an ex racehorse who has less than 12 months competition experience but according to Eleanor is already showing immense potential for elite level eventing. Eleanor herself has experience at the top level having successfully completed Adelaide 4★★★ twice on her former mount 'Mighty High', placing 8th in 2011 and qualifying for the prestigious Badminton International Horse Trials in the UK. A memorial trophy for the popular 'Mighty High' was awarded at the event in honour of his recent passing.

Spectators at Morgan Park were thrilled not only to see a local combination triumph but also to witness the 'State of Origin' trophy returned to it's rightful place after a well fought battle for state pride between the QLD and NSW teams. Electricity Supply for the Downs



Wattles Rugby League Club won their first A A Short Wattles History

The Wattles Rugby League Football Club has its beginnings back in 1966 when the Clifton and Allora Rugby League Clubs combined to form what was then known as the Allora/Clifton Rugby League Football Club, the Wattles name attached some vears later.

The club's first President was former Allora footballer and Wattles Club Patron & Life Member Mr. Brian Smith.

Brian, along with inaugural Senior Vice-President Jack Enright and James Gleeson were largely responsible for the formation of the Allora-Clifton club.

The club has always played in their traditional green & gold colours, their jerseys in their initial year, green with gold

The Allora-Clifton club's first matches were pre-season trials against Warwick club Collegians on Sunday March 6th, 1966. Collegians won all three grades played on the day, with the Warwick Daily News reporting that "for Allora-Clifton, hardest worker was Dave Achilles. Bevan Crothers penetrated well at

fixture in the Warwick District Rugby League competition on March 27th, 1966 against Millmerran at Allora, winning the match in a positive start to the season. The "Greens" as they were known met Collegians in their second match, at Warwick's Queens Park, suffering a 26 – 5 defeat, centre Barry Donegan scoring Allora-Clifton's only try. The Allora-Clifton side that played the first grade match that day were Tony Cartwright, Mal Henry, Des Cantwell, Rob Lester, Stuart. Sparksman, Bevan Crothers, Barry Donegan, Ted Cowley, Dave Achilles, Des Power, Tom Zeller, Russell Cass, Kev Smith (Captain).

Allora-Clifton only played one season, 1966, in the Warwick District competition, being admitted to the Toowoomba Rugby League in 1967 along with the Millmerran, Pittsworth & Gatton Rugby League Clubs.

In that first year in the Toowoomba Rugby League the Allora-Clifton Under 16 side made the Grand Final but were defeated. Allora-Clifton's first premiership was won by an Under 16 team though, defeating All Whites 17 - 7 in the 1968 Grand Final.

The 1968 season also saw the Allora-Clifton club gain their first State representative when Les Lane was selected for Queensland.

Allora-Clifton became Wattles in 1969 after a competition was organised by Mal Eiby to give the club a name. The club has tasted much success in its 49 year history.

Wattles won their first A Grade premiership in 1970, defeating Valleys by 20 – 17. The team was Mick Gleeson (Captain/Coach), Denis Fogarty, Bevan Crothers, John Cowley, Dan Ryan, Brian Keleher, Mal Duff, Lew Platz, Greg Platz, Brian Meara, Jim Phelan, Terry Fogarty, Laurie Lipp, Mick Bowe, Rob Rowlings, Sid Telford, Dennis Ryan, Joe Gleeson & Trevor Gleeson.

A second A Grade premiership was won in 1997, the 'Warriors' coached by John McLuskey and captained by Steve Miles. The team that defeated Newtown 42 – 8 were: Steve Miles, Alf Boney, Mark Smythe, Vince Ramsay, Keith Joppich, Roger Robinson, Alec Young, Stephen Park, Craig Scanlan, Scott Minnikin, Mick Smith, Scott Morton, Brad Eyre, Cameron Hamblin, Matthew May, Jason Denny, Clinton Banks, Will McIntosh.

Wattles also won Toowoomba Rugby League premierships in 1976 & 1992 (2nd Grade), 1992 (3rd Grade), 1998 (Under 19), 1976, 1977, 1991 (Under 18) and 1968, 1974, 1975, 1977 (Under 16). Wattles highest club award is the Clifton Courier Shield for the club's "Player of the Year". Many great players names adorn this trophy, including International forward

Greg Platz, future A.R.L./N.R.L. players Robbie Tew & Tony Duggan, three time winner Sam Achilles and Cameron Hamblin, a five time winner of the "Player of the Year" award.

The club boasts four Internationals in the Platz brothers Greg & Lew, Rohan Hancock and former champion Brisbane Broncos front-rower Shane Webcke. Wattles have also had numerous players rise from their ranks to play with A.R.L./ N.R.L. clubs in the National competition, including: Shane Webcke, Kirk Reynoldson, Phil Morwood, Tony Duggan, Travis Burns, Robbie Tew, Jordan Atkins, Grant Rix, & Mark Meskell. On Sunday the club's 'National Farmer's Warehouse' A Grade team will run on to Clive Berghofer Stadium at 3.30 pm against the Gatton 'Hawks' in the 95th Toowoomba Rugby League Grand Final in pursuit of further premiership glory.

Rabbit board tests new technology to address old challenges

Keeping a watchful eye on over 500 kilometres of fence, traversing connecting roads and properties not far from the NSW border, is a challenge the Darling Downs Moreton Rabbit Board (DDMRB) have embraced for over a century. Now they're turning to the latest technology in an attempt to improve efficiency and help QLD farmers keep rabbits out of Queensland. The DDMRB have joined the social media phenomenon in recent months, setting up Facebook and Twitter profiles, to better engage with the public, help property owners manage pests on their property, and offer an accessible online forum to report rabbit sightings and fence or property issues.

The DDMRB are also testing back to base gate sensor technology, approving a small trial to be implemented later in 2014

Cr Ross Bartley, Chairman of the DDMRB, explains;

"Our staff have been monitoring gates on the fence manually on patrols for decades. It can be several days before a specific gate is checked on rotation. This new technology notifies our head office when a gate is open for longer that it should be, allowing us to send staff immediately to the location. We hope the trial can deliver greater efficiency to our everyday operations"

The data collected will also help the DDMRB engage with local residents in problem areas where it is identified gates are left open longer than necessary to get a vehicle or livestock through.

Refactor, a Queensland based technology solutions company, has been engaged for the gate sensor trial and founder Steve Dalton was excited about the opportunity to help;

"Agriculture technology is a growing market in Australia and its great the DDMRB are experimenting with solutions like these gate sensors to help QLD farmers and manage pests. We're proud to be a part of that work."

Rabbits destroy the environment and cost the Australian economy more than \$600million each year. The DDMRB manage 555kms of rabbit-proof fence in Queensland, and monitor compliance with the Land Protection (Pest & Stock Route Management) Act 2002.

Council upgrades waste facilities at Stanthorpe

Southern Downs Regional Council Mayor Cr Peter Blundell will inspect the newly upgraded Stanthorpe Waste Facility and will be the one of the first users of new bins at the facility tomorrow (Tuesday September 2).

Mayor Blundell said the \$554,000 upgrade of the Stanthorpe Waste Facility will bring vast improvements for local users, with increased capacity and recycling opportunities.

"The upgrade project is a joint initiative of SDRC and the State Government, with the Department of Local Government, Community Recovery and Resilience providing over \$220,000. "These funds have been used to construct a new retaining wall and roof structure, to allow large 30 cubic metre bins to be used for waste disposal.

"A roof structure is also being erected over the current waste disposal area, which will become a recycling drop-off point.

"The main benefit of the bigger bins is that residents will be able to dispose of larger items, such as furniture, at the waste transfer station. This will minimise the number of users accessing the landfill directly, which will improve safety for users of the facility, but also encourage and make it easier for residents to sort their loads before disposing of the waste in the bin

"The existing waste disposal area will become the recycling drop-off point, which will allow the Endeavour Foundation to

use more of the waste facility shed for storage of recyclables and items to be sold through the re-use shop.

"The increased recycling opportunities will lead to less material making its way to landfill, improving the environmental performance of the landfill and saving money by extending the life of the existing landfill," he said.

Mayor Blundell said the upgrade was a great outcome and the efficient use of funds has brought a range of benefits.

"I will certainly be using the facility and I encourage residents to do the same as well as taking up the opportunity to recycle where possible. These efforts now pay large dividends into the future," he said.

Council's Environmental Services Manager Mr O'Brien said SDRC has also completed upgrades at the Maryvale Waste Transfer Station, including the extension of a retaining wall, which has allowed additional waste disposal bins to be placed on site.

"We have also constructed a roof over the new and existing waste disposal areas. These changes will increase the waste disposal capacity and improve the environmental performance of the facility. The addition of the roof structure will provide improved user protection in all weather conditions.

"The Maryvale project cost was \$200,000 and also a joint project with the Department of Local Government, Community Recovery and Resilience. Council allocated \$120,000 and the department contributed \$80,000 which again was put to good use," he said.
