

best in bringing it together. Of course, this will require the community to enthusiastically embrace the new arrangements and support Sarah, Stacey and Greta in putting it together." The handover of this event follows a gradual devolution of the event to other community groups. The Allora State School P&C

took over the hamburger stall in 2009 when Rotary decided this major fundraiser was beyond members to maintain. Rotary will continue to auspice the event for the insurance cover and has supported the grant application to the council.

The new format event, to be held in the park adjacent to the Dalrymple Creek, a venue underexploited by our community, will feature a program of carol singing by a wide variety of artists, with participation from St. Patrick's and Allora State Schools' students, with expert accompaniment from local musicians and the Warwick Salvation Army band. It is an opportunity for Allora to revisit the flavour of Christmas.

Rotary Allora also welcomes the move from the street venue, which now has become prohibitively expensive to close and involving more red tape than Rotary would like to deal with. The park venue is not only more conducive to sitting and enjoying a concert, but also has more space and pleasant surrounds. Community groups will continue to be represented at the event, with the Community Circle organising Christmas stalls and various food options for the event. The Allora State School P&C will continue to provide a hamburger stall for the event and various community groups will be holding fund-raising activities.

On Friday 31st October 2014 the Volunteer Program for the delivery of Meals on Wheels in Allora will come to an end.

This is after thirty-four years of continued service by a lot of Volunteers from a lot of organizations in Allora.

Due to Food Safety Legislation requirements Blue Care are no longer able to provide frozen meals and the fresh meals must have the temperature checked and recorded after being delivered to the client.

This new process requires someone with a Food Safety Licence to take and record these temperatures to satisfy legislation. So this will mean that a Staff Member of Blue Care will be delivering the lunch time meals to the Allora area and the last delivery by the Volunteer Program will be at lunch time on Friday 31st October 2014. It will be by two Red Cross Volunteers Kay Graham and Dorothy Rubie who have both been associated with the Volunteer Program for many years.

I would like to strongly stress that the delivery of the Meals to the clients will NOT be affected by these changes... it is only the Volunteer Program which is being discontinued.

I would like to thank the Volunteers and the Organizations, both past and present for their continued support of this Program over the past thirty four years. Dorothy Rubie.

To my knowledge the residents were not given any information about the impact of such a facility once operational. I believe after complaints from many residents your decision was, 'That no action could be taken as the application was a legal use of land '.

However this is now an environmental problem. Your negligence in not assessing the environmental impact from noise, dust, lights, odour and glare, borders on criminal neglect. And I make no apology for such harsh words. This facility now operates 24 hrs./7 days a week. It is surrounded by houses and a Nursing Home, and is one block from the centre of the town. Not only are we affected physically from continuous noise and dust, our sleep is disturbed and our lifestyle changed. Also, our properties have dropped in value and would be almost impossible to sell. Add to this, I believe the next move by Grainx is to bring the railway back into operation which will further impact on our

An industrial estate is obviously the place for such a polluting facility to be located. I am informed that Mr David Brown has land out of town which is suitable.

We believe that the complex should be closed while investigations are made into the environmental impact on the residents of Allora... Our lives have been changed dramatically from a quiet and peaceful lifestyle to an ongoing nightmare.

We believe it is your moral responsibility as our elected council to address this matter... As up until now, you have negated your responsibility with excuses and broken promises. The council should have the rate payers of Allora's interests at heart, not Grainx

As it stands: we, the ratepayers come second best... Shame on you. I await prompt action from the council on this disgraceful situation.

I would be interested to know: 1. How the grain is treated before it leaves for China, what the composition of the dust consists of - are there chemicals in it? 2. Why were they given permission to operate 24/7 in suburbia? 3. How many residents are employed by Grainx?

Looking Back... **PHOTOS**

The Allora Historical Society has recently been given a large number of photos which belonged to the late Dorrie Byrne. These were handed over to the Society by Roy and Helen Smith on behalf of members of the Smith and Byrne families. As well as albums of photos from the time that she was awarded the O. A. M. in 1999, and from Dorrie's selection as an Olympic torch bearer in 2000, there were also photos from an earlier time in Dorrie's life. I will feature two of those photos today. The Historical Society is always keen to receive photos from any era in Allora and district's history, either to keep or scan and return. Please contact any Society member.

The first photo is of the Allora Vigoro Club in 1935. The Allora club played in a fiveteam competition along with teams from Spring Creek, Goomburra, Maryvale and Freestone for the Alke Cup. The top players were selected to represent the Wheat Belt Association in state trails, Clarice Anderson from Goomburra and Thelma Hoey from Allora being selected to represent Queensland. Rosie Telford from Spring Creek was also chosen for the trials but was unable to attend.

The Allora team is shown in their black

blazers, white shirts, black shorts and black berets with white sun visors. The team mascot is Madge Lancaster. Doris Smith (Byrne) is in the front row 2nd from the right. In the centre is the team captain Thelma Hoey (Holmes) and I believe Josie Imhoff (Norman) is 3rd from left in the front row. Other players to play for Allora in the 1934/35 season were Brenda Carney, Nin Byrne, Maude and Ruth Burge, Evelyn and May Wilson, Violet and

Ruby Cross, Alice Geitz, Queenie Lancaster, C. Munro and A., Lorraine and Joan Slatter. If anyone can put names to the other faces in the photo, the Historical Society would be keen to hear from you.

The second photo is of Doris Smith in the office of Holmes and Co in Dorrie started her working

life in the office of Barnes & Co., a large general store on the corner of Herbert and Drayton Streets in 1929. In 1938 Barnes & Co were bought out by Holmes & Co and Dorrie moved to the building on the corner of Herbert and Warwick Streets. They may not have had the space for the extra staff because the working conditions look very primitive. Dorrie left Holmes & Co in 1939 to marry Dick Byrne but returned in the war years when Dick was serving with the Air Force. Rae Masters started working in the drapery section of Holmes & Co in 1941 and was still working there when the building burned to the ground on the 13th October 1972. Rae said that the sales staff did not handle the money. The sales docket and the money tendered by the customer were placed in a ball which was propelled along a track to the office. The office staff returned the change and the receipt by the same means. Sometimes the ball would get stuck along the way and would need some help along with a long stick. The track can be seen in the photo attached to the pressed metal ceiling.



Allora Anzac Stories?

Australia did not have an Army of its own prior to WW1. Other wars in which Australians and New Zealanders had fought in the past, as again in WW1, were under the direction of the British Empire. Once the two governments on 5th August 1914 joined with Britain and declared war on Germany, they began the process of each raising a military force. The Australian force was called the Australian Imperial Force (AIF) & the New Zealand force was called the New Zealand Expeditionary Force (NZEF) which in turn were to become the Australian and New Zealand Army Corps – the ANZACs.

Albany WA became the departure point for troops. On 1st November 2014 a huge mixed fleet of 36 merchant vessels,

heading for Egypt carrying some 30,000 troops and 7843 horses, departed from King George Sound along with a further 2 vessels which departed from Fremantle with WA troops who were joining the main fleet contingent.

The merchant vessels were escorted by the Sydney, Melbourne and the Minotaur. They were joined later by New Zealand escorts HMS Psyche, Philomel and Pyramus and the Ibuki from Japan. En route the HMAS Sydney hunted and sank the German raider the Emden, ensuring safe passage through the Indian Ocean.

ALLORA'S ANZACS REMEMBERED: THE SHOOTER BROTHERS

PRIVATE HAROLD ALBERT SHOOTER

Harold Albert Shooter was born at Pratten via Clifton Queensland Australia, on 21/10/1894. Earliest documents available for Harold's schooling is his registration on the Spring Creek Primary school roll. Date of admission is 20/01/1902, aged 7 years and 2 months completing Grades two, three, four, and five at this school. Prior to that, his primary education started at Darkey's Flat School, Pratten. He is also registered as attending the Tooth State School, Woody Camp at Back Plains from 1906 until 1908.


When Harold enlisted for war service in Toowoomba on 22/10/1915, one day after his 21st birthday, his registration stated his height of 5ft 9 inches and occupation - Farmer, from Dalrymple via Clifton, enlistment number 471. He immediately joined B Coy, 8th Depot Battalion but was later transferred to the 36th Battalion. His pay was 5 shillings per day. By February 1916, Harold was appointed to B Coy, 42nd Battalion at Thompson's Paddock, Enoggera Queensland, which became part of the 11th Brigade, 3rd Division 1st AIF.

Once all the soldiers had received their innoculations and vaccinations, the 42nd Battalion embarked on HMAT A30 "Borda" ex Sydney on the 5th June 1916 for the 6 week journey to Southampton, England. Harold was to spend the next 10 months in England training, supporting the war effort and going AWOL on more than one occasion, but when put on report it was recorded that Harold was of good character. He also spent periods convalescing from the Mumps, Scabies, Rheumatism and Myalgia. By the 9th May 1917, Harold was completely cured of all ailments, declared fit and proceeded overseas to France via Folkestone, a port situated in the south east county of Kent, UK.

After arriving at Etaples in the north east of France, the unit marched for nine days from Etaples to Armentieres. The Battalion then relieved the 38th and part of the 37th Battalions at Ploegsteert. Great artillery activity and heavy enemy retaliation continued throughout May and June. On the 5th July

1917, visibility was low and seven soldiers were wounded including Harold who suffered a gunshot wound to his nose after four days in hospital and a short recovery he was back to duty with the Battalion.

On the 11th of July, the 42nd Battalion was relieved by 38th Battalion 1st AIF. The weather was hot and muggy, heavy thunderstorms made conditions in the trenches extremely difficult and unpleasant, but the war was relentless and soldiers endured amazingly. Eight men from the 42nd were granted Military Medals for operations carried out by the Battalion at the Battle of Messines. During the month of September 1917, the 42nd Battalion kept marching up to 15 miles a day to arrive at Poperinglie, Belgium in preparation for major offensive attacks. The Battle of Broodseinde was launched 04/10/1917. Harold was part of this attack. One hundred enemy prisoners and nine machine guns were captured within two hours.

The weather had turned extremely bad when the Battle of

Passchendaele at Zonnebeke was launched on 12/10/1917. Passchendaele proved a costly battle losing over a third of its strength, principally from German gas attacks and trench foot caused by the sodden condition of the battlefield. Two days into this battle, Private Harold Albert Shooter was killed in action "In the Field", West Flanders, Belgium. Personal effects at the time of death were: Disc, 2 wallets, 2 photos and a card. He has no known grave, but as he was killed in close proximity to the now Tyne Cot Cemetery at Zonnebeke, he possibly lies in a grave marked:

"AN AUSTRALIAN SOLDIER OF THE GREAT WAR" known only unto God.

Harold was awarded the 1914/15 Star, British War Medal and the Victory Medal. He is also remembered on the Menin Gate. Panel 27, in leper (Ypres) West Vlannderen, Belgium which is an imposing memorial dedicated to 56,000 Commonwealth soldiers missing in action. He is also remembered at the Australian War Memorial in Canberra on Memorial Panel 136. After Harold's death, a Dead Man's Penny accompanied by a letter from King George V stating "I join with my grateful people in sending you this memorial of a brave life given for others in the Great War". were sent to the Shooter family. Around the outer edge of the dead man's memorial plague are the words "He died for freedom and honour". Also a memorial scroll with the following inscription: He whom this scroll commemorates was numbered among those who, at the call of King and Country, left all that was dear to them, endured hardness, faced danger, and finally passed out of the sight of men by the path of duty and self-sacrifice, giving up their own lives that others might live in freedom.

Let those who come after see to it that his name be not forgotten.



Hot spell brings increased home fire risks

With temperatures soaring across the State, RACQ Insurance has called on Queenslanders to ensure their fans and air conditioners were safe to use.

RACQ Executive Manager Insurance Communications Mike Sopinski said with these unseasonably high temperatures, fans and air conditioners were being put into rapid use after many months of storage.

"Queenslanders need to be aware of the potential fire risks posed by cooling devices, particularly those that have been stored for some time and may be overdue for a safety check," Mr Sopinski said.

RACQ Insurance research showed faulty electrical appliances and fittings, including fans and air conditioners, were the cause of 14.50 percent of home fires last year.

The data showed December was the most likely month (14.29 percent) to experience a fire in the home. The other summer months of January (10.07 percent) and February (10.36 percent) showed they were also particularly high-risk periods.

The greatest danger times for home fires were between 4pm and 5pm (11.6 per cent) followed by 11am and noon (10.6 per

Research also showed that many Queenslanders admitted to leaving fans on (45.5 percent) and air conditioners running (48.2 percent) while away from the home, which is a particularly dangerous practice.

Mr Sopinski said improperly installed, damaged or misused equipment were frequent sources of preventable fires.

"Before switching on these types of appliances, Queenslanders should check for damaged cords and blocked filters, particularly in older equipment," he said.

"They should also be careful when buying second-hand electrical appliances by thoroughly checking the unit is safe to use."
