Koala Spotted in Allora: Allora Landcare Group

We are delighted to report the recent sighting of a koala on Allora Mountain. This happy event occurred through the sharp eyes of a student from St Pats School, Allora, who was part of an organised excursion to the mountain by Grade 4 and 5 pupils. As the activity involved elements of sustainability, they planted trees at the reservoir under ALG supervision and marked the occasion with tree protectors signed with their names. This will allow them to follow the progress of their work, and is identical to a similar activity conducted by Prep and Grade 1 students from St Pats last August.

The sighting appears to mark the first time in some years that koalas have been seen on the mountain. With the discovery of an eagle nest and fledgling last year, the koala adds to the list of

iconic Australian fauna seen on the mountain and suggests the ecological health of the mountain is good. The University of Southern Queensland (USQ) had earlier expressed an interest in our work and sent a survey team to inspect the site. This occurred last Monday. Four member of the International Centre for Applied Climate Science at USQ worked with landcare members to look for more koalas, but they proved elusive this time. At least we have a photo. However, the time was not completely unproductive as animal scats were identified and some natural features on the mountain explored. Both groups shared ideas and plans later over coffee and it is intended we work together in the future.

On other matters, we hope to have the Information shelter finished in time for the holiday season, and walking tracks and related features have been improved to make access to the mountain that much easier.

Please note that once again we will be sponsoring a photographic competition at the Allora Show next February.



The subject will be Allora Mountain, obviously, and there will be three categories, Open, Secondary and Primary. More details including prize money will appear closer to the event. We feel the mountain is revealing more of its secrets and beauty as we explore further and we urge anyone with a camera to visit and consider entering the competition. (We hesitate to say too loudly, but the eagles' nest and koala were both discovered by visitors.)

Council says.....how NOT to use local waste facilities

Southern Downs Regional Council is hoping there won't be a repeat performance of a huge mess left at the Forest Springs Waste Facility that confronted Council staff last week.

Council's Environmental Health Manager Tim O'Brien said Council staff were in disbelief when they were faced with overflowing bins that were filled with bulky items and other rubbish.

"As the photos show Council staff found fencing wire, posts, scrap metal, weeds, boxes, bags of rubbish, plastic, tarpaulins and bottles in and around the bins. Staff members have advised this is not the first time it has happened.


"The bulky items disposed at the Forest Springs facility should have been taken to Warwick or other waste facilities capable of handling these materials.

"What we find is that the bulk items fill up all the bins resulting in other users depositing their household waste on the ground. This constitutes illegal dumping and can result in infringement fines.

"Council has advertised during National Recycling Week recently and throughout the year about the items that can be placed in bins at unmanned waste facilities and there is very clear signage at all these facilities about where to place recyclables and waste.

"We urge people to take heed and help everyone to keep our waste facilities clean and tidy. Council has committed a lot of time and resources into upgrading the network of these facilities and we are all contributing to re-using materials thereby saving items going into landfill

"The clean-up at the Forest Springs Waste Facility will require a bobcat to clear up all the waste dumped outside of the bins and will also involve an additional pick-up by JJ Richards. "This week Council also found that at the Greymare Waste





Facility tyres, tanks and a ute rack were thrown in the bins. Again these items need to go to manned facilities. "In the end the cost goes back to the community so we ask everyone to respect these Council facilities," he said. Mr O'Brien said Council has previously considered closing the Forest Springs Waste Facility in the past due to a series of incidents of illegal dumping and damage to the facility.

"At that time Council appealed to the community to assist in addressing these issues and received strong support. Local residents who saw illegal activity reported this to Council.


Looking Back... **Anzac Centenary** Grant

The Allora and District Historical Society has received а \$5.128 Queensland Centenary of the Anzacs grant to research and print a book about the men from the Allora district who were killed in action. or died subsequently of wounds, in World War I. The stories of the men killed in WW II and subsequent wars have been recorded but those of the men from WW I have not been told.

We have based our list on the 47 men whose names appear on the Allora monument, and have added others with a known association with the Allora district. The WW I monument was erected in 1921 by the Allora Shire Council with funds raised by public subscription. Parents and friends were invited to submit the names of loved

ones killed. There are several spelling mistakes on the memorial and several names appear to be missing. Harry Gartner spent about the first 18 years of his life in Allora and his father lived in the town until his death in 1934. The name of Norman Weynand who was born and raised in Allora and had strong connections to the town through his grandparents, Edward and Jane Anderson, is another that could have been included.

All of the names on the memorial have had their connection to Allora verified except for two. There were two men named W. Moss killed in the war but neither appears to have a connection with Allora. Another

If you care about your local natural resources and how they are managed, then come along to the Warwick information session on the draft Condamine Catchment Natural Resource Management Plan.

Condamine Alliance will host a special information session at the Redbacks Clubhouse on Thursday 27 November to provide detailed information about the draft Plan and gather feedback. The one hour session commences at 9.30am.

"The Plan describes our community's vision for our catchment's future and will guide how we look after and use our region's natural resources," said Lucy Richardson, Condamine Alliance General Manager and Project Leader.

"We are reaching out to the community because we want to know what they think about the priorities and targets in the draft Plan." Ms Richardson said.


"After all, this is the community's plan for the community's natural resources so their ideas and suggestions are vital," she said.



For 3½ years this group of truly dedicated volunteers fought for their family's health and properties and also for their neighbours. Churches, Schools, teachers, children, individuals and families, people entirely unaffected; and later the media became involved in the fight for the rights for families to protect their homes, property and health.

And very importantly, with the involvement of the then Opposition Leader the Honorable Rob Borbidge AO and local member the Honorable Lawrence Springborg, a written undertaken was given that if the opposition came into government at the next election, then the powerline would

One Senate enquiry later, and a very well organised year long targeted marginal seat campaign by Eastlinkers, contributed to the election of the Borbidge government.

The rest is history. Eastlink was abandoned and 660 property owners did not have to face unknown health risks or the devaluation of their properties by up to 80%.
