Santa Visits Headstart Kids



Residents advised high level water restrictions have been implemented

Residents throughout the Southern Downs are requested to conserve water, with the current drought situation triggering the introduction of high level water restrictions for the Warwick. Yangan, Allora, Dalveen, Pratten, Leyburn and Karara areas effective immediately.

Killarney and Wallangarra residents will remain on permanent water restrictions (see below table). High level water restrictions are also in place for the Stanthorpe area and these became effective from 1 September 2014.

Southern Downs Regional Council Manager Water and Wastewater Tendekai Mapeza said high level water restrictions were triggered when Leslie Dam fell to 30 % capacity on November 25.

"High level water restrictions mean residents cannot use water sprinklers or fixed irrigation systems. The maximum consumption target for this level is 170 litres per person per day.

"These restrictions also mean that residents in odd number or no number properties can hand water outdoors on Sundays, Tuesdays and Thursdays and even number properties can hand water on Saturdays, Mondays and Wednesdays for one hour only between 6pm and 7pm.

"It's important to note that people will experience some water pressure reductions over the period that watering is allowed. The period 6pm - 7pm is a peak time for current consumption when many are preparing meals, showering or other water use activities in the home.

"Council wants to emphasise that residents should be careful with water use as we are moving into the high end of water restrictions. The next level is extreme and the maximum consumption target is 140 litres per person per

"During the last three months our rainfall has been exceptionally low with forecasters suggesting that there is little prospect of any significant rain for an extended period into summer and the new year.

"The result of this is that our dams are dropping guite guickly and have reached the levels where Council is obliged to impose more stringent water restrictions.

"Council can issue fines for breaching water restrictions and we hope that we don't need to issue these," Mr Mapeza said.

"We ask residents to be mindful of their water Breaching the declared restrictions may result in a fine being issued under the Water Supply Act use by avoiding wastage and complying with 2008. Your assistance with this matter is greatly appreciated.

Council votes to cease fluoridation

Southern Downs Regional Council has voted to cease fluoridation of water supplies throughout the region.

Councillors agreed to survey water ratepayers about their opinion on fluoridation and the survey results were considered at Council's General Meeting last Wednesday.

Councillors agreed in June that a 50% return rate on the survey would mean the process was valid however this return rate was not reached. The return rate for Warwick was 25.5% (with 64.7% of the surveys returned voting to discontinue fluoridation)

and for Stanthorpe it was 31.6% (with 70.2% of the surveys returned voting to discontinue fluoridation).

During debate Councillors agreed that despite the return rate of 50% not being reached, sufficient surveys had been received to indicate that the community sentiment was that fluoride should not be added to the water supply.

Cr Pennisi moved a motion that Council cease the addition of fluoride to the Warwick and Stanthorpe Water Treatment Plants 30 days after public notification of this decision. Cr Ross Bartley seconded the motion and the motion was carried.

ALLORA'S ANZACS REMEMBERED:

REGINALD SHOOTER

Reginald Shooter was born at Clifton Queensland on 3/08/1902. On the 5th August 1907 two days after his 5th birthday, Reg started school at the Tooth State School, Woody Camp at Back Plains. In March 1908, the family moved to Elphinstone near Clifton. On the 5th May 1908, five Shooter boys are registered on the admission roll of the Clifton Colliery School. Reg was aged 5 years and 8 months with big brothers Les, Fin, Frank and Bill looking out for him. He attended this school until April 1911. Further schooling for Reg was at Hendon and Talgai West State Schools once the family eventually called Talgai

On the 26th December 1936, Reg married Elizabeth Maud Meadows in Tamworth NSW. They started married life at Victoria Hill west of Allora where Reg had established a farm specializing in Dairy and Agriculture. The birth of two sons completed this family.



With World War 2 advancing throughout Europe and with the Pacific also at War, Australia was increasingly under attack. Reginald Shooter enlisted at Allora Queensland on the 25th June 1942, for war service in the Australian Army. His rank is recorded as Private and service number is Q226939. For three and a half years, Reg marched and trained on a regular basis with the 8th Battalion Voluntary Defence Corps. at Victoria Hill Queensland in preparation for defending Australia. Tactical training was physical using wooden rifles, live ammunition, grenades and mortar. His service of discharge was the 21st October 1945, five months after the end of World

Reg and Maud Shooter retired to Toowoomba in 1966. He died on 22nd October 1980 aged 78 years and is buried in the Toowoomba Garden of Remembrance.

South Australia, on 16/01/1894 to parents William and Elizabeth Telford (nee LEE). At the age of eight, John's father decided to move the family to Queensland and join his parents, George and Jane Telford and his brothers who had settled into the Spring Creek farming community district near Allora – Clifton, after migrating from Northumberland in the north east of England. (Jane's maiden name was Scott, hence John's middle name.) John was the eldest of eight children – four being born in South Australia and the youngest four born in Queensland.

In 1902, John was enrolled at the Spring Creek State School and in 1904 moved to the Upper Forest Springs school about 8 miles east of Spring Creek. Farm children either rode horses or walked to school back in those days. The family moved around the district working on dairy farms and at one stage lived at Talgai, west of Allora. Jack, as he was fondly known, worked long days helping out with farming life which was intensive, physical and varied. There were always pigs to feed, cows to milk, planting and harvesting of crops and horses to be worked. Always a keen sportsman he also enjoyed a game of football.

When the rumblings of War cast a dark shadow over the world, John was 21 years old. A farmer and resident of the Bellview



district Nobby, near Clifton. On the 02/05/1915 John enlisted at Enoggera, Queensland and started training. Enlistment number 2431. In July 1915, a farewell Smoke Concert was held in his honour at the Royal Hotel in Clifton.

After being passed fit and appointed for active service, John embarked on 20/08/1915 from Sydney Australia on the HMAT "Shropshire" via the Suez Canal to the port of Mudros on Lemnos Island Greece, situated in the north Aegean Sea 50 klm off Turkey, to prepare for action in Gallipoli. John was part of the reinforcements for the 9th Battalion that had been in fierce fighting on the Peninsula. He joined the unit and was taken on strength in November 1915 serving at the Sarpi Camp Mudros, as part of the Gallipoli campaign. Training in horrific blizzard conditions along with diseases, sicknesses, wounded soldiers and cramped hospitals often made life at the camps difficult. With the evacuation of all Anzac troops from Gallipoli in December 1915, Christmas Day was celebrated with a

The guest speaker was Mr. Samuel Holmes, patron of the Pittsworth society, who spoke on the "Old Days on the Downs". He said that he had lived in the Pittsworth district for 60 years having come there at the age of 17. He stated that his father had selected land at North Branch, and that he and a younger brother

had ploughed 60 acres with a single furrow plough. The wheat was hand sown and harrowed in – and that is how the first wheat was grown at Pittsworth.

(Samuel Holmes was one of eight sons of John and Mary Ann Holmes of Allora, four of whom settled at Pittsworth and four at Allora)

church service, singing, a Christmas Billy parcel, playing cards and rest.

On January 1st 1916, John sailed on the SS Grampian from Mudros to the Middle East and became part of a new battalion - the 49th Battalion. With water restrictions in force and due to a shortage of trains, troops moved by foot in unbearably hot conditions (48 degrees Celsius) for 40 miles (64klm) carrying full kit packs and ammunition to defence positions on the Suez Canal. This was a very trying time considering a few weeks earlier, the landscape and the men had endured freezing temperatures. They were to suffer these conditions for a further six months. By June 1916, the 49th Battalion set sail for the Western Front disembarking at Marseilles, France. 1,000 officers and men of the 49th moved to the front line. As Germany was gaining ground throughout Europe, numerous reinforcements were deployed including many untrained men. In July, the 49th Battalion spent its rest period en route, marching, bayonet training and gas drill in an area named Rubempre in France.

Private John Telford took part in the Battle of Mouquet Farm which was part of the Battle of the Somme starting in August 1916. September brought extremely cold and wet conditions. Life in the trenches was difficult and many men suffered from "trench feet". This battle was fierce and bloody. Total Anzac Corps casualties during this time were 6,300, leaving them so depleted they had to be withdrawn from the front for two months.

The 49th Battalion kept marching and training north eastward toward Belgium and the Ypres Salient. They were continually subject to regular artillery and mortar fire.

Christmas Day 1916 was celebrated in grand style after receiving canteen rations that had previously been withheld. At 8pm on Boxing Day 1916, John went AWOL until 7am the next morning. For his crime, he was to forfeit 2 days pay.

In early April 1917 the Australians suffered heavy losses in the attack on Noreuil, France. By May 1917, John was appointed



to Lance Corporal and Driver in the Field. A driver in WW1 rode on a team of horses which pulled wagons, guns, ambulances, equipment, food and supplies. Each driver was responsible for his horses (feeding, shoeing, vet care etc). Constantly targeted by artillery and machine guns to prevent supplies getting through, this was always a very dangerous undertaking.

For the next five months, Lance Corporal John Telford was to endure the Battle of Messines, the Battle of Polygon Wood and the Battle of Broodseinde Ridge – part of the 3rd Battle of Ypres. He was killed in action by a high explosive shell on 10/10/1917 at Broodseinde Ridge Sector, Flanders Belgium. Death was instantaneous. He was 23 years of age.

He is buried at the Belgian Battery Corner Cemetery, Ypres, Belgium. Plot 2 Row C Grave 12.




