



The ANZAC legend came alive in the Southern Downs with the Allora RSL Sub-Branch securing Federal Government funding to hire First World War defence force and nurse uniforms for its concert on Saturday and Sunday.

Federal LNP Member for Maranoa Bruce Scott applauded the sub-branch's community spirit for sourcing the uniforms to enrich what turned out to be an engaging musical to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the Gallipoli landings.

ALLORA'S ANZACS REMEMBERED: A project by the Allora Historical Society

PETER JENSEN REGIMENT NO. 1415


Peter Jensen is not honoured on the Allora World War One Memorial monument. He came home. Peter's story and the story of his wife Gertrude, show the spirit of the Anzac and the spirit of Australian women.

Peter enlisted for active service on 30th July 1915. He was assigned to the 5th Light Horse Regiment and saw active service in Egypt and Palestine. During 1918, Peter was seriously wounded by a gun-shot to the head. He spent several months in hospital in Palestine before being RTA (returned to Australia) as a result of his head injuries and impaired sight.

Peter was given a welcome home, hosted by the Hughes family of Berat in honour of the deeds rendered to their son and brother James, by Peter. Peter's character can be understood when reading his speech during a welcome home tendered by the Hendon Soldiers Honour Committee. He speaks not of his own experience but praises the work of the Red Cross at the front. On his return, Peter was known for his help to fellow servicemen. He was a member of the Allora Sub-branch of the R.S.S.I.L.A.

Peter married Gertrude Munro in 1923. Three years later Peter suffered a 'break down in health' caused by his war injuries. After being admitted to the Migunyah Private Hospital, Allora he was transferred to Warwick where 'the popular Digger passed peacefully away'. He left his wife Gertrude and two infant children.

Many Allora residents remember Mrs Jensen's business selling ladies wear in Palmerin Street Warwick. She

started out in business because she realized that she could not educate her children on the widow's pension. In 1930 Gertrude acquired a hawker's licence, a pony and sulky and commenced her business career. From her home in Allora, she travelled to Clifton, Warwick, Killarney and Stanthorpe and the surrounding districts selling her stock of ladies wear. In 1931 she replaced the sulky with a Model A Ford Coupe which offered a little more protections from the elements. She moved to Warwick with her children in 1932 opening a shop, occupying the same premises for the next fifty odd years. Gertrude was a member of several service and charity groups as well as the War Widows Guild all her life.

Gertrude Jensen only missed one Anzac Day service at the Allora cemetery over all the years from 1926 to her death in Allora Homestead in 1986.

Warriors Continue on Winning Way

A brilliant four try effort by fullback Corey Blades saw that the Wattles 'Warriors' A Grade juggernaut took another step up the 'Hutchinson Builders' Toowoomba Rugby League

Premiership ladder when they overwhelmed the Dalby 'Diehards' 48 – 22 at Millmerran on Saturday evening.

The quicksilver Blades was in sensational form, scoring in the 5th, 35th, 46th & 74th minutes reaping the benefits of quality support play. After a recent relocation to fullback, the Toowoomba 'Clydesdales' back is revelling in the opportunities running off the likes of centre Joel Koina and play making halfback Matt Duggan. Dalby tested him regularly under the high ball, Blades finishing with an unblemished copy book.

Blades was judged Wattles player of the match, with team mates Joel Koina and Harry Fulwood also impressive.

Wattles have climbed to clear third rung on the ladder after running in eight tries against their opponents in the ANZAC Day clash, but not before enduring a twenty minute horror patch where the 'Diehards' ran in three tries midway through the second half.

Coach Luke Duggan was happy with the result, "it was a good win, we are heading in the right direction." He spoke highly of his team's goal line defence, and felt that if the 'Warriors' continue to limit errors with the ball, there should be a green & gold presence at the top end of the ladder across the season. Wattles were on the scoreboard inside the third minute when back rower Brod Koina capped off a workman like raid upfield to score near the uprights, followed by a Corey Blades touchdown minutes later.

Dalby posted points in the 12th minute to trail 6 - 12, but that man Blades crossed for his second four pointer for Wattles to lead 18 - 6 at half time.

Wattles continued the onslaught with Brenden Wilson adding a try within the first minute of the second stanza, with Blades over touching down again minutes later.

Three Dalby tries saw them trail Wattles 22 – 36 with fourteen minutes remaining, but the ever present Blades and five-eighth Brodie Ciesiolka scored in the dying minutes for the 'Warriors' to reach their winning total.

While Dalby hit back soon after, Wattles stayed in touch with rampaging lock forward Matt McCarthy bursting through the opposition defence midway through the first half. Both sides battled it out until half time with Dalby ahead 12 – 10 when the siren sounded.

Three tries in the opening minutes of the second half saw the 'Diehards' surge ahead 24 - 10, a game within Wattles reach slipped from their grasp.

Guest speaker David Giles of SCE Energy Solutions will be explaining how communities in NSW are working together to achieve community solar and some of the different options available.

"Energy is falling from the sky in vast quantities every day – and now we have the technology to capture that and put it to really good use", says Giles.


