ALLORA'S ANZACS REMEMBERED: A project by the Allora Historical Society

HARRY GARTNER - AWARDED MILITARY MEDAL

The Gartner family came to Australia from Hamburg, Germany. John and Johanna Gartner and their son Albert who was born at sea first went to New South Wales. They were numbered among the first pioneer workers in this area being employed on Goomburra Station in 1862. A second son, John was born in 1868. In 1883 John and Johanna bought a farm at Berat. The farming land was later extended and included 40 acres on the Dalrymple creek. John Gartner Jrn. took over the farm on the death of his parents.

Harry was one of ten children of Albert and his wife Mary Ann (nee Wilson). He enlisted for active service on 7th September 1915. He was 27 years old and had served a four year

Looking Back...

Mystery Solved The name A. STAINFORTH is listed on

the Allora WW1 memorial amongst those who lost their lives. There is no one of that name who even enlisted in the Australian forces. The names STANFORTH and STANFORD were tried with no luck. The research team from the Allora and District Historical Society set out to solve the mystery. Perhaps he was a member of the British forces? Lyn Wright contacted members of the Stainforth family in England and although there were seven soldiers of that name killed while serving with the British forces, none had the initial

Doug Walker, another of our researchers took up the challenge, and came up with the name Albert STANIFORTH who enlisted in Toowoomba. He served with the 31st Battalion in France, was severely wounded, but returned to Australia in 1919. His next of kin was given as his mother, Mary Staniforth, of Ipswich. A search of the Queensland BDM Index produced the marriage certificate of Albert Staniforth, age 48, labourer, and Noreen Phyllis Rutter, age 21, laundress, at Nanango on the 17th June 1933. Death certificates also showed the burial on the same day of Mary Staniforth at Ipswich and the death of Noreen Phyllis Staniforth, 22, on the 29th August 1933 in the Gympie Hospital of 'pregnancy toxaemia'. Lyn sent a letter Julie at the Nanango Family Society who produced an amazing amount of detail on the life of Albert Staniforth including the fact that he was born in Manchester, England, in January 1885, the son of Arthur and Mary Staniforth. He arrived in Brisbane on the 5th November 1885 with his mother Mary only.

Doug took over again with a search of the Queensland electoral rolls which show Albert as a labourer living at Murarrie in Brisbane in 1913. There is a large gap due to his war service, but in 1922 he is

shown as a labourer living at Ipswich. In 1934 he is living in Gympie but shows up again in the same year as being on Peters' property at Goombungee where he must have moved after the death of his wife. Albert Staniforth is recorded on the 1939 electoral roll as a labourer living in Goombungee.

We could follow him all around Queensland but could find no connection with Allora. Along came Toni volunteer researcher from Toowoomba who combed the 'Trove' web site and came up with information on many of the men on our list including the following gem in The Brisbane Courier of 18th January 1916.

Country Volunteers
Toowoomba January 17

'During the 48 hours ending 1 p.m. today 22 men presented themselves to the Toowoomba recruiting officer for examination, and 16 were accepted. They

were' and included the name Albert STANEFORTH (Allora)

We had our link, but what became of Albert after being at Goombungee in 1939? His death did not appear on the Queensland BDM Index. A check on the N. S. W. Index came up with an Albert STANIFORD who died in the Tenterfield district in 1955. We applied for the death certificate and came up with our man, Albert STANIFORTH, age 69, born Manchester, England, the son of Arthur and Mary Staniforth. He died at Jennings on the Queensland/N. S. W. border and is buried in the Wallangarra cemetery. Doug visited the cemetery and photographed the headstone. He spoke with a local historian who remembered Albert Staniforth who, she said, was known as

'Jack'. He kept to himself but her grandfather used to visit Albert in his little hut near the meatworks. When he died there was a chance that he would be buried in a pauper's grave but his friend remembered him mention his army service and the War Graves Commission was contacted, resulting in the erection of the headstone on his grave.

The placing of Albert Staniforth's name on the Allora memorial is still a mystery. He was seriously wounded in action in France on 26th April 1917 and did not rejoin his unit until six months later. Someone from Allora who knew him, may have assumed that he had been killed, and when the names were submitted for the new memorial in 1921, put his name forward. The research team have information on nearly all those on our list. Work is still being carried out on the names W. Moss and W. Tedford.

apprenticeship with H Stay, Plumber.

Private Harry Gartner Regiment No. 4803 was assigned to the 15th Reinforcements of the 15th Battalion A.I.F. He left Australia aboard the 'Commonwealth' and landed at Alexandria, Egypt on 5th May 1916. After a brief stay at Alexandria in training the reinforcements then embarked for England to train at the 4th Australian Division Base Depot. They arrived at Etaples, France to join the 15th Battalion on the field on 4th October 1916

Harry was a stretcher bearer. He was awarded a distinguised conduct medal for meritorious service on the field while attending wounded men during an attack on the famous Hendenburg line on 11th June 1917. This news was reported in the Allora Guadian. Harry was congratulated on "What is no doubt a well merited distinction".

He was wounded in action on 26th September 1917 – gunshot wounds to both feet, fractures and multiple wounds. He died of wounds in Belgium on 26th September 1917 at the No. 10 Casualty Clearing Station.

On 24th October, Mary Ann was forwarded a copy of extract from Fourth Supplement No. 30135 to the London Gazette dated 15th June 1917 "relating to the conspicuous services rendered by your son, the late No, 4803 Private H Gartner, 15 Battalion. AWARDED THE MILITARY MEDAL 'HIS MAJESTY THE KING has been graciously pleased to award the Military Medal for bravery in the field to the under mentioned soldi No. 4803 Private Harry Gartner".

Mary Ann was one grieving mother who received her dead son's personal effects. She received a package including Harry's identity disc, watch, fountain pen, testament, razor and

photos. These items as well as the Military Medal and Ribbon arrived on the "Euripides" in May 1918.

8th November 1919 – Mary enquired regarding an offer to those family members who wished to put a verse or text on the tombstone for payment . She was advised that relatives could add a three line inscription provided they are willing to defray the cost of such addition. She applied for the scroll issued and send 6d stamp for the pamphlet "Graves of the Fallen"

Harry War Medals were forwarded to his mother after the Officer in Charge of Base Records had established that his father Albert had deserted the family 13 years previous and has not contributed towards their support since.

Allora Guardian – "A member of an old Allora family, he early saw the need for offering his services and being accepted he rendered stirling service, so much so, that he was awarded a military medal for his bravery in attending to the wounded under heavy fire".

SDRC shines a light on solar power options

Southern Downs Regional Council is looking towards a brighter future with investigation of solar power options underway.

In recognition of the continuously increasing demand for energy, the escalating costs of electricity, and the community's growing concern for the environment, Council is considering options and sites for the installation of solar power systems on Council's buildings and facilities.

Mayor Peter Blundell said solar power systems provide energy that is clean, renewable and sustainable and offers the potential to significantly off-set Council's current electricity consumption.

"Investing in solar power will generate long-term savings. The anticipated savings yielded from solar power would be a significant measure in the reduction of Council's electricity bills and its carbon footprint.

"Once installed, a solar power system requires minimal maintenance and would provide clean energy for a minimum of 20 years". he said.

The Environmentally Sustainable Southern Downs, a central vision under the Southern Downs Community Plan 2030, envisages the region actively working towards expanding and supporting environmentally sustainable practices.

"Council recognises that the encouragement of renewable energy sources such as solar power is a key direction in the plan, and we are taking the initiative to consider the best solar power options for Council, including system types, appropriate locations and financing mechanisms", the Mayor said.

announced Australia-China trade agreement," Mr Scott said. "I sit on the Foreign Affairs Defence and Trade joint standing committee and I'm also the Trade subcommittee chairman so I know what this milestone agreement means, especially for the Southern Downs.

"This region is a hub of agricultural and meat processing activity and I'm committed to the electorate getting the most out this agreement, including new business opportunities and job growth in our country towns.

"Until now, the absence of a trade agreement with China meant our producers and exporters faced significant tariffs on agricultural products and have been at a competitive disadvantage to countries that have an FTA with China including New Zealand.
