

Council makes inroad with GrainX through MOU

Southern Downs Regional Council is well on the road to addressing environmental concerns with GrainX operations in Allora.

At today's General Meeting, Council adopted a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between Council and GrainX outlining specific actions with timeframes for completion to address and manage environmental nuisance caused by the GrainX operations.

Southern Downs Regional Council's Mayor, Cr Peter Blundell said that following a public meeting with members of the Allora community August 10 to discuss issues about the operations of local business, GrainX, Council officers have been working with GrainX representatives to address the community's concerns.

"The MOU establishes the guidelines for collaboration between Council, GrainX and the Allora Community to address the environmental nuisances of noise and dust resulting from the operations at GrainX.

"As part of the MOU, a consultative committee will be formed, and Council has today appointed Councillor Neil Meiklejohn and I, along with Council's Senior Environmental Officer, to the committee. In addition, GrainX and the Allora Community will each have two representatives on the committee. An expression of interest will be called for the community representative

positions.

"The consultative committee will meet every two months to review progress and to monitor the key issues outlined in the MOU, which will remain in force for a period of 12 months," Cr Blundell said.

A number of residents suggested at the August community meeting that it would be preferable for GrainX to move locations, rather than achieve compliance with regard to the noise and dust issues currently associated with the operation of the business.

The Mayor outlined that Grainx representatives had advised that they will need to increase on- site operations during the busy harvest period from early October to the end of December and have proposed to undertake a temporary expansion of the container operations to land owned by Council on the Allora Industrial Estate (Allora Council Depot), for a period of four months from 1 October 2015 to 31 January 2016.

"This proposal is supported by Council, as it will ensure container operations will not extend beyond daytime operations at the GrainX site on Herbert Street during the harvest period. "In order for this to occur, a permit to occupy from the Department of Natural Resources is required, along with development approval from Council and these processes are underway.

"Council also agreed to a Water Access Agreement with GrainX to allow GrainX access to water sourced from the disused Allora Water Bore which they will use for dust suppression and misting on the Grainx site located in the Allora township.

"I am pleased that Council has made significant inroads with GrainX to address the concerns of the community, and the MOU certainly ensures that the Allora community will be involved in the process of addressing and managing the environmental issues associated with the GrainX operations," Cr Blundell said.

ALLORA'S ANZACS REMEMBERED: A project by the Allora Historical Society

FRANCIS VINCENT BEAKEY

The name V. BEAKLEY is wrongly inscribed on the Allora WWI Memorial. It refers to Francis Vincent BEAKEY, one of seven children of Patrick and Mary Ann Beakey (nee Long) who lived at Hendon. When Mary died relatively young at forty-seven years old, Cecilia the only daughter and eldest of the family, most probably cared for her brothers. Francis named her his next of kin when he enlisted in the A.I.F. He was known as Vince and was just twenty-one years old when he enlisted at Esk on 2nd May 1916. He was working as a butcher. Vince stated on his Attestment Form that he had spent three years with the senior cadets in Allora. He was approved and appointed to the 5th Reinforcements of the 52nd Battalion by the Commanding Officer at the Rifle Range Camp, Enoggera, with the regimental number 2379. The reinforcements spent a couple of months at the 11th Depot Battalion before leaving Australia on the "Seang Choon" on 19th September for overseas duty. After arriving in England, they spent a few

Obituary

Mr. Garrett Byrne, an old and highly respected resident of the Allora district, died at noon on Saturday last, after a somewhat lengthy and severe illness, at the advanced age of 78 years. The late Mr. Byrne who was born at Borris-nafainey, Tipperary, Ireland, landed in Brisbane about 50 years ago. He spent the first years of his life in the new country

farming and carrying in the Warwick district and around the Stanthorpe tin mines. Later on he took up land at Forest Plain, being one of the first settlers in that locality, where he has resided ever since. His wife predeceased him by 10 years and the family numbered 16 – 9 sons and 7 daughters - 13 of whom are still living. The internment took place in the Allora cemetery on Sunday, a very large and representative gathering joining the funeral procession.

fighting strength. The routine then became front line position, then training and labouring behinds the line. In early 1917, the 52nd Battalion participated in the advance that followed the German retreat to the Hindenburg Line.

Private Francis Vincent Beakey was taken on strength with the 52nd Battalion on the 25th April 1917. The battalion moved to the Ypres sector in Belgium. Over the next few months during their second bleak winter in the trenches, the men fought in the Battle of Messines in June, and the battle of Polygon Wood in September. The condition in the trenches had an effect on Vince's health. He spent a couple of weeks in hospital with scabies in September.

Francis Vincent Beakey was killed in action on 21st October 1917. He was buried in the Belgium Military Battery Corner Cemetery, one mile W.S.W. of Ypres.

Base Record Office did not follow Cecilia's direction that her youngest brother Martin should be issued Vince's medals. She said that Vince and Martin were "playmates and school mates and Martin would keep them as a memory of his dear departed brother". The medals and memorial plaque were sent to the eldest brother Thomas, who acknowledged that he would share the medals with his brothers. At the time their father Patrick was alive but his whereabouts was unknown to the family.

Cecilia was deemed to be entitled to Vince's pension of fifteen shillings per fortnight. His personal effects of his disc, a wallet and three coins were forwarded to her.

A Roll of Honour in the newspaper acknowledges that Francis Vincent Beakey had been killed in action and that his family was well known and respected in Hendon. Francis Vincent Beakey is remembered on the WWI Memorial in Allora and on the Hendon roll of honour.

Martin Kevin Beakey was a member of 1st Australian Garrison Battalion during WW2. He served from 28th February 1942 to 20th December 1945, Regimental No. Q140136, with the rank of private. His sister Cecilia was named as his next of kin. Lyn Wright

Council gets green light for cultural infrastructure improvement projects

Two of Council's community and cultural facilities are set to gain much needed improvements with a Queensland Government announcement over the weekend about Council's funding success under the 2015-16 Local Government Grants and Subsides program (LGGSP).

Southern Downs Regional Council's Mayor, Cr Peter Blundell welcomed the announcement by The Deputy Premier and Minister for Infrastructure, Local Government and Planning, Jackie Trad, that Council's two infrastructure projects to upgrade the Allora Community Hall and Stanthorpe Civic Centre had been given the green light to proceed, with funding secured under the LGGSP.

"The Local Government Grants and Subsidies Program funding of \$92,000 is very much welcomed, and it is particularly pleasing that Council has been successful in two applications, given the competitive funding environment we now see ourselves in. I'd like congratulate all staff involved in these





grant applications for an excellent result," Cr Blundell said. The Allora Community Hall project will see replacement of the roof and gables, along with the exterior painting of the facility, and the Stanthorpe Civic Centre upgrade project will include replacement of the timber flooring in the Main Auditorium and Supper Room.

The Mayor went on to say "The need for these improvements was identified through Council's Asset Management Plan for Buildings along with independent building reports prepared for Council in 2014, and were subsequently identified as a priority for the 2015-16 financial year."

"These projects should provide in the order of four jobs for the duration of works, and it is anticipated that the upgrades will also provide further economic benefit to the Stanthorpe and Allora communities by attracting new users of these facilities.

"Furthermore, these infrastructure projects will contribute to building and maintaining safe, caring and connected communities through the enhancement of Allora's and Stanthorpe's largest social and cultural buildings for local events and activities, with the works also helping to make these facilities safer and more accessible to the many local community groups and organisations using them," said Cr Blundell.



Fullback Corey Blades try with seven minutes to go was a gem breezing onto a Matt Duggan pass and pressing the ball for the Warriors final and match winning try.


